NOTE.

That the late Mr. H. T. Butler succeeded as a collector in forming an interesting Library of English Literature, ranging from the xvith to the xixth Centuries, is amply evident from this catalogue. But the outstanding feature of the Library at large is undoubtedly the fine condition of the majority of the books. The late owner appreciated from the early days of his career as a collector, and at a time when 'state' and 'condition' were not as generally valued as is the case to-day, the importance of those two factors. Notable examples of fine original condition among the older books may be seen in the copies he acquired of Davies' "Nosce Teipsum," 1622, Fletcher's "Purple Island," 1632, and Milton's "Paradise Lost," 1668. Even more notable as examples of the original state of xviiith and xixth century books are the copies of Pope's "Temple of Fame," 1715, the immaculate, uncut copy of Smart's "Song to David," 1763, the equally fine copy of Coleridge's "Christabel," 1816, and the 1795 volume of Landor's "Poems." Coming down to Victorian times, the First Editions of Browning, Meredith, R. L. Stevenson, Swinburne, the Rossettis, and William Morris, are all exceptionally clean copies in the original cloth.

It may be added that nearly all the bindings in crushed morocco or polished calf are the work of the best London binders, mostly by Rivière.
