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CONDITIONS OF SALE.

I.—The highest bidder to be the purchaser. and if any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the lot in dispute shall immediately be put up again and re-sold as the auctioneer may decide.

II.—No person to advance less than 2s. 6d., above Five Pounds 5s., and so on in proportion.

III.—In the case of lots upon which there is a reserve the auctioneer shall have the right to bid on behalf of the vendor.

IV.—The purchaser to give in name and address, and if required, to pay down 5s. in the £, or more, in part payment of the purchase-money, in default of which the lot or lots so purchased to be immediately put up again and re-sold.

V.—The lots to be taken away at the purchasers expense and risk the day after the sale, in default of which Messrs. Knight, Frank & Rutley will not hold themselves responsible if the lots be lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed; but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser. Messrs. Knight, Frank & Rutley require immediate removal of goods after the sale, and in default, they reserve the right to store them at a public depository to await clearance or re-sale, and, subject to the usual conditions of the depository proprietors, at the entire cost of the purchaser.

VI.—The lots are sold with all faults, imperfections, and errors of description, the Auctioneers not being responsible for the correct description, genuineness, or authenticity of, or any fault or defect in any lot, and making no warranty whatever. The auctioneers reserve the right of refusing any bidding or of withdrawing any lot or lots from the sale.

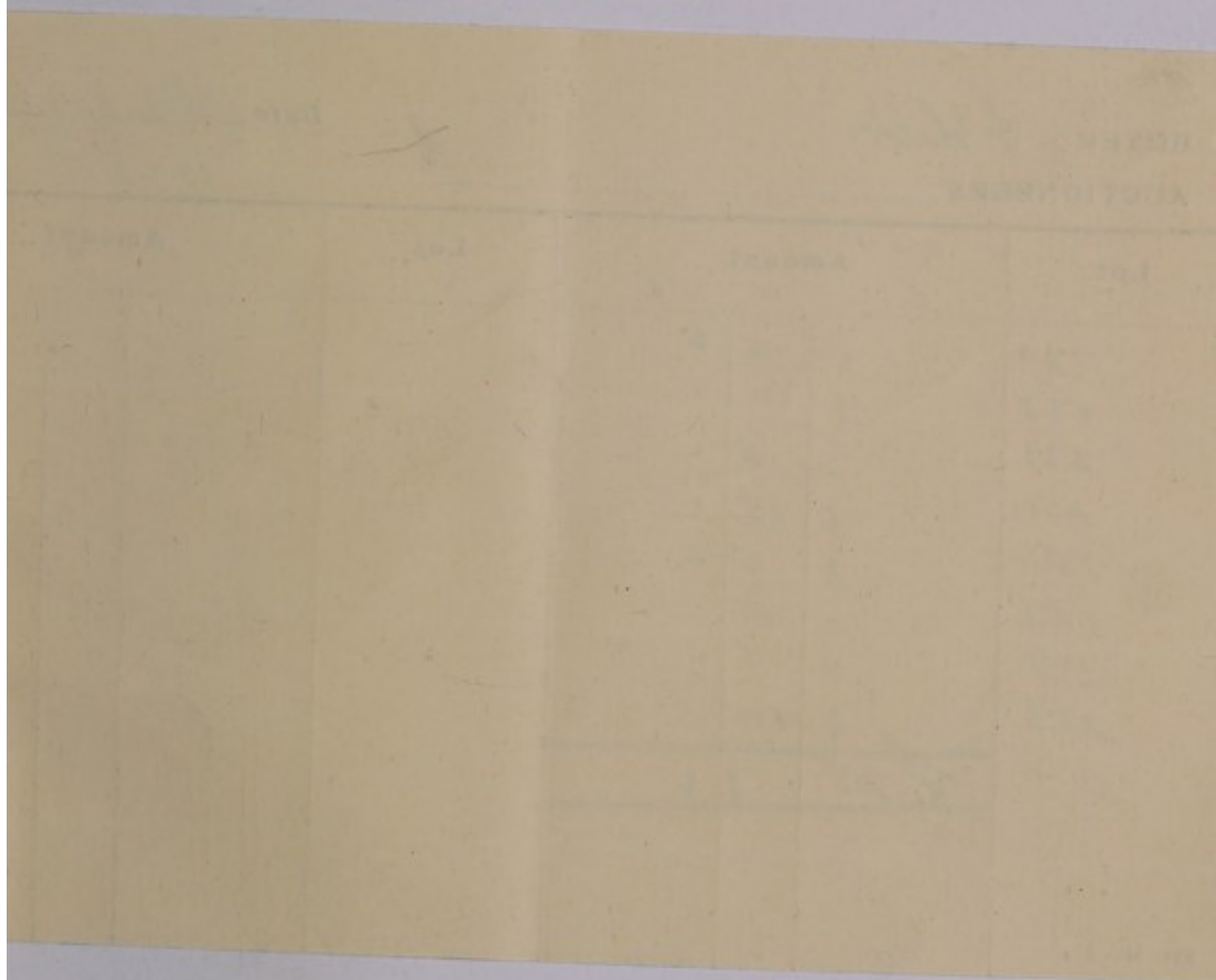
