NOTE

The following 220 lots of Books and Tracts from the Shipdham Church Library, comprise all the more rare and valuable items contained in the catalogue as originally prepared for the sale in April last, which was duly authorized but subsequently postponed. It comprises also a quantity of books of lesser but still of appreciable value.

Besides these a quantity of XVIIth century Theology of quite small commercial value has been put aside, the ultimate destination of which will be decided after the result of the present sale is known.

It may be added that the sum realized will be used, (1) to meet the heavy expense of repairs to the roof and the additional cost of £175 for new heating apparatus—both of which are of great urgency at the present time, (2) to form a library of modern books for the use and edification of the parishioners, and (3) to be used towards the reduction of the dilapidations assessment on the Rectory and premises.
