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

#### OLD CHINESE PORCELAIN.

- 1 Ten old Chinese famille-rose plates, enamelled with peonies and a vase, in pink and blue scroll borders
- 2 A Nankin cylindrical vase, painted with a kylin and eagle— 10 in. high
- 3 A pair of Chinese oviform jars, enamelled with boys in panels on pale green ground—7½ in. high—wood covers and stands
- 4 A Chinese pear-shaped bottle, enamelled with birds and flowers on white ground—9½ in. high
- 5 A pair of old Nankin oviform vases and covers, painted with flowering plants in compartments, and with blue lambrequin-shaped panels round the shoulders—8 in. high

- 6 A Pair of Old Nankin Cylindrical Vases, painted with a river scene, aquatic plants, vases, and utensils in compartments on powdered-blue ground, mounted with ormolu rims and plinths chased with foliage, and terminal figure handles—21 in. high
- 7 A pair of Nankin oviform jars and covers, painted with Lange-Lysen and palm-leaves—5<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. high
- 8 Two Nankin oviform vases and covers, painted with Lange-Lysen and a fence—8\frac{1}{4} in. and 8\frac{3}{4} in. high
- 9 A Nankin cylindrical bottle, painted with utensils and palmleaves— $6\frac{3}{4}$  in. high; and a vase, painted with utensils— $9\frac{1}{2}$  in. high
- 10 A pair of Nankin oviform vases, painted with formal scrolls and rosettes, and a band of lambrequin-shaped panels of scrolls round the shoulders—8 in. high—wood covers
- A Nankin bottle, with long neck, painted with kylins and flowers, and a band of palm-leaves round the lip—9<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. high
- 12 A Nankin vase, painted with fir-trees, rocks, and figures— 18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. high
- 13 A famille-rose tea-pot and cover, cream-jug and cover, canister, bowl, and saucer-dish, enamelled with flowers and encrusted with vines and squirrels, with pink petal panels round the lower part
- 14 A pair of deep famille-rose cups and saucers, enamelled with panels of flowers on gilt diaper ground, and with green trellis edges
- 15 A tea-pot and cover, enamelled with panels of utensils on coral-coloured ground; and a large famille-rose cup and saucer, with flowers on pink ground
- 16 A famille-rose tea-pot and cover, enamelled with peonies and a kakémono; and twelve cups and saucers, variously enamelled with figures, on diaper ground

- 17 Seven small Chinese porcelain bowls, variously enamelled with figures and flowers
- 18 Six famille-verte saucers, enamelled with ladies and boys
- 19 A famille-verte saucer-dish, enamelled with equestrian warriors, in diaper border—14<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. diam.—Kang-He
- 20 A famille-verte saucer-dish, enamelled with panels of kylins, vases, &c., on stippled-green ground—10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. diam.; and one with panels of flowers on white ground—10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. diam.—Kang-He
- 21 A pair of powdered-blue shallow bowls and covers, enamelled with flowers in famille-verte in circular and fan-shaped panels
- 22 Three small saucer-dishes, and a basin, enamelled with ladies, waves, and vases, and with powdered-blue and rouge-defer panels round the borders
- 23 A pair of small basins, delicately enamelled with sprays of flowers, and with marbled-green edge—6 in. diam.
- 24 A famille-verte oviform vase, enamelled with flowers, vases, and utensils, and with green lambrequin-shaped panels round the shoulders—7 in. high—silver cover
- 25 A famille-verte gourd-shaped bottle, with green lambrequinshaped panels round the lower part, and a rouge-de-fer band on the neck, mounted with metal-gilt—7½ in. high
- 26 A famille-verte bottle, enamelled with a band of formal flowers, and palm-leaves round the neck, mounted with metal-gilt —8½ in. high
- 27 A pair of famille-verte bottles, with slender necks, enamelled with flower sprays and panels of vases of flowers—6<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. high
- 28 A famille-verte bottle, enamelled with a band of formal flowers and with bulbous neck—8 in. high; and a small familleverte canister, enamelled with lotos

- 29 A set of three small famille-rose vases and covers and a pair of beakers, enamelled with cocks, peonies and other flowers —6<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. high and 5<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> in. high
- 30 A pair of famille-rose deep plates, enamelled with peonies in scroll borders; and a famille-verte plate enamelled with a vase and utensils
- 31 A pair of plates, enamelled with chrysanthemums and other flowers in famille-verte, and with blue borders; an Imari plate with gilt border; and a small Imari tea-pot and cover
- 32 A famille-verte dish, enamelled with roses, utensils and medallions of flowers—15½ in. diam.
- 33 A large famille-rose dish, enamelled with ladies and children in a garden—21½ in. diam.
- 34 A Pair of Tea-Pots and Covers, formed as hens and chickens, enamelled green, yellow and mauve—early Kang-He
- 35 An Octagonal Famille-Verte Incense Burner, with pierced top and sides, enamelled with Hō-Hō birds on a floral groundwork, in green, yellow and mauve—7½ in. diam.—Ming
- 36 An Octagonal Tea-Pot, Cover and Stand, enamelled with formal flowers in black petal-shaped panels—Kien-Lung
- 37 A Pair of Famille-Verte Dishes, enamelled with horses in a landscape, Hō-Hō birds and clouds round the border on pink diaper ground—14½ in. diam.—Kang-He
- 38 A Pair of Famille-Verte Dishes, enamelled with groups of flowers, and with stippled-green border—13\frac{3}{4} in. diam.

- 39 A Famille-Verte Dish, enamelled with a basket of flowers, and flowers in petal-shaped panels round the border on stippled-green ground—14¼ in. diam.—Kang-He

- 41 A FAMILLE-VERTE BOWL, entirely enamelled with flowering plants—11 in. diam.—Kang-He
- 42 A SQUARE INCENSE-BURNER AND COVER, enamelled in colours, the cover pierced with honeycomb-pattern—Kang-He
- 43 A Pair of Famille-Verte Vases and Covers, enamelled with ladies and boys in a garden—17 in. and 17½ in. diam.

- 89 A cushion, covered with a panel of old English embroidery worked with a female figure, flowers and birds, in coloured silks and silver thread on white satin—temp. Charles II.

- 97 A cabinet, made by Morris and Co., of Oxford Street, to hold drawings, of holly- and other woods, inlaid with geometrical designs, arabesque foliage and chequer borders, and containing holly-wood frames—50 in. high, 82 in. wide

- 98 A secretary, made by Morris and Co., of Oxford Street, with fall-down front enclosing writing-slide, and doors at the sides enclosing drawers, inlaid with oak foliage, acorns and thistles in satin- and other woods and ivory, on mahogany ground—51 in. high, 56 in. wide
- 99 An Italian marqueterie table, elaborately inlaid with allegorical and other figures, birds, flowers and arabesques in engraved ivory and mother-o'-pearl, on column supports—51 in. wide

- 110 A gold lac inrō, with a musumé with flowers in mother-o'pearl; a gold lac inrō with a Hō-Hō bird; another, with eagles; and two others, with landscapes and birds
- A red Soochow lacquer vase, carved with formal flowers and foliage—on stand—13 in. high; an oblong Japanese lacquer tray, carved with birds, &c.; a necklace of ivory and other beads; a wood inro; and a lacquer leaf-shaped tray
- A Japanese lacquer picnic-set, with maple-leaves and wisteria in gold; and a miniature cabinet, enclosing five drawers, with leaves in gold on black ground
- 113 A Japanese lac box, in three divisions, with prunus-branches in red and gold, on black ground; another box, similar, in two divisions; and a miniature cabinet, with gold lac panels and ivory supports

- 120 Three Chinese figures of kylins, enamelled green, buff, and mauve—7½ in. and 8½ in. high; and a group of two figures—5½ in. high
- 121 A pair of Imari vases and covers, painted with flowers and kylins on blue ground—33 in. high

- 122 An old Worcester basket, cover and stand, painted with panels of flowers on dark blue scale-pattern ground, and with flower-branch handles
- 123 A Chelsea group of two rabbits, in a bosquet—7 in. high; and two bowls and one cover, formed as artichokes
- 124 A pair of Coalport vases, with beaker necks, painted with panels of flowers on yellow ground—11½ in. high; and a Crown-Derby oviform vase, painted with a group of flowers and gilt with foliage—12½ in. high
- 125 A pair of Wedgwood Solon ware vases, with medallions and festoons in relief in white on blue ground—11½ in. high

- 126 A Furstenburg vase and cover, painted with medallion heads, and with gilt rams' heads and vine festoons in relief—

  15½ in. high; and a pair of seaux, painted with bouquets of flowers on white ground
- 127 A PAIR OF NYMPHENBURG BUSTS OF CHILDREN, white and gold—9½ in. high
- 128 A Ludwigsburg Group, of Chinese figures round an arbour encrusted with flowers—13½ in. high
- 129 A Nymphenburg figure of a cockatoo—7½ in. high; and a small porcelain figure of a child
- 130 A Dresden group, of Neptune in a chariot drawn by seahorses
- 131 A Dresden mug, painted with insects and bouquets of flowers in relief; and an oval Furstenburg basket, painted with a landscape, and with pierced trellis sides
- 132 A pair of French porcelain vases, painted with a wreath of flowers on white ground, and with gilt necks, handles and plinths—14½ in. high; and a vase, painted with flowers, and with crimson and yellow bands—13 in. high
- 133 A pair of French porcelain vases, of Empire design, painted with panels of landscapes and pastoral scenes on gold ground, and with caryatid winged figure handles—17½ in. high
- 134 A pair of Berlin vases, covers and pedestals, with fluted white and gold necks, and gilt mask handles—11½ in.

  high
- 135 A glass vase, of Moorish design, with gilt decoration—24 in.

  high
- 136 A small gold powder box, set with pearls and other stones; a mother-o'-pearl box, with silver-gilt mounts; a tortoisesbell snuff-box; and one other

- 137 Four circular silver boxes, embossed with portraits, figures, &c.; and an oblong silver box, with a quay scene on the lid
- 138 Two silver trays, repoussé with fruit; a circular silver box; and ten Indian silver figures of animals and birds

- 139 A Louis XV. inkstand, formed of a Japanese lacquer tray, mounted with or-molu borders, and fitted with an old Dresden figure of a reaper, flower branches, and two small ink-pots
- 140 A small inkstand, formed of a Japanese black and gold lacquer tray, mounted with or-molu, and fitted with an old Dresden small figure of a Chinaman
- 141 A pair of gros-bleu vases and covers, mounted with or-molu rims, bands, and plinths, chased with foliage—19 in. high
- 142 A Boulle bracket clock, by Mynuel, à Paris, mounted with masks and foliage chasings of or-molu, and bracket en suite—55 in. high
- 143 A pair of or-molu candelabra, of Louis XV. design, chased with foliage and fitted with Dresden porcelain flowers, with branches for five lights each—25 in. high
- 144 A clock, by Raingo Frères, à Paris, in rectangular case of or-molu, with chased foliage borders, and a frieze of Cupids below—20 in. high
- 145 Alclock, with chased metal-gilt dial, supported by or-molu figures of Tritons, on Boulle plinth, mounted with or-molu —33 in. high
- 146 An octagonal metal-gilt jardinière, painted with flowers in colours, and with gilt foliage feet; and a pair of old English vase-shaped metal tea-caddies, with gilt decoration

- 147 A small mahogany show-table, of Chippendale design, with carved lattice-work borders and glass top—24 in. wide
- 148 A Sheraton Satin-Wood Commode, with door in the centre inlaid with panels of Chinese black and gold lacquer, with birds, flowers, &c., and with inlaid chequer borders of satin- and hare-wood, surmounted by a dove-grey marble slab—57 in. wide
- 149 An Empire circular table, of inlaid woods, on bronze tripod mounted with or-molu—20 in. diam.
- 150 An Empire circular mahogany table, with veined black marble top, the stand mounted with or-molu—32 in. diam.
- 151 A Sheraton oval table, of satin- and other woods, inlaid with a shell and chequer lines—38 in wide
- 152 An Empire Satin-Wood Commode, with one drawer and folding doors below, mounted with an oak wreath and female busts of chased or-molu, surmounted by a veined red marble slab—50 in. wide
- 153 A Louis XVI. Mahogany Writing-Table, with leathercovered top, three drawers in the frieze, and cabinet of small drawers at the back above—62 in. wide
- 154 A Louis XV. Marqueterie Secrétaire, with revolving cylinder front and three drawers below, inlaid with land-scapes and buildings in coloured woods on a tulip-wood ground, and mounted with or-molu borders, corner-mounts, handles and escutcheons of or-molu, chased with Satyrs' masks, foliage, and beading—40 in. wide
- 155 A settee, of Louis XVI. design, with cane seat, back and ends, the framework carved with laurel and acanthus foliage and ribands, and loose cushion covered with green silk brocade
- 156 A Louis XVI. gilt-wood console table, with laurel wreath border, on fluted legs with lyre-shaped stretcher, surmounted by a veined grey marble slab—49 in. wide

- 157 A smaller console table, on gilt-wood stand, boldly carved with winged gryphons, flowers and foliage, and surmounted by a veined Brescia marble slab—48 in. wide
- 158 A pair of gilt-wood show-cabinets, carved with flowers, and with bombé glass front and ends—7 ft. high, 4 ft. wide
- 159 A mirror, of Louis XIV. design, in frame mounted with ormolu, chased with a female mask, foliage and strapwork —5 ft. 8 in. wide, 8 ft. high
