

812 A pewter flagon and cover, engraved with the initials w.g.c.c.

816 An ivory and silver tipstaff—English, late 18th Century; two bronze knife-handles—17th Century; and a steel key, chiselled with leafage—English, 17th Century

pressed horn snuff-box, with the arms of Sir Francis Drake; a russeted iron perfume-burner, with incrustations of silver

A Beazor stone, in a case of gold, delicately pierced with bands of scrollwork, introducing figures of animals—on tripod stand

An antique male head, in Egyptian porphyry; a silver statuette—4 in. high; a small bronze figure; an unguent-spoon; and three antique glass bottles

820 A powder-primer, formed of a natural gourd, delicately engraved with a battle scene, and mounted with chased silver—Italian, early 17th Century

A spoon, of ivy-root, mounted with silver, terminating in a shield-shaped end—Tyrolese, early 16th Century; an agate spoon, mounted with silver-gilt; and a silver tobacco stopper, shaped as a dagger

A flask, of black basalt, with portraits of Louis XVI., Marie

Antoinette, and the Dauphin, with silver mount; and a

small bronze octagonal lantern—late 17th Century

A brass tobacco-box, opening in two compartments, engraved with religious subjects; another, somewhat similar; an oblong ditto, dated 1751; and a mathematical instrument, of bronze-gilt—early 18th Century

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- A Great Seal, overlaid with plaques of gold, of Frederick V.
  of Sweden, in silver-gilt case; a similar silver seal, with
  parchment attached; a circular brass box, pierced with
  floral ornaments; a Buddist praying-wheel, from Tibet;
  and two small engraved silver cups
- A Russo-Greek bronze and enamel crucifix; a silver triptych case, with the sacred initials in enamel; a small Russian ikon; a bronze crucifix; and a silver filigree incense-burner

- 855 A carved ivory fan, the sticks most minutely pierced, and painted in the centre with a composition of figures, the outer sticks further enriched with cut-steel beads—

  English, early 19th Century; and a fan, with mother-o'pearl sticks and lace mount, sewn with spangles

- 856 A small chest, overlaid with various polished woods, and enriched with mother-o'-pearl, in geometrical designs, mounted with hinges, lock, escutcheons, &c., in gilt iron —Spanish, 17th Century; and a small cabinet, containing trays, the exterior overlaid with tortoiseshell, and with mouldings of ivory—Turkish, 18th Century
- 857 A letter-box, on a bracket of Louis XVI. design, overlaid with red tortoiseshell, and mounted with or-molu
- 858 Carved wood figure of a Bishop—20 in. high—Italian, 17th

- 859 A portfolio, containing twenty-four Indian drawings of celebrated personalities, within landscapes, and flowered borders

- 871 A painted satin-wood tea-caddy case, containing two teacaddies and an engraved glass bowl, the exterior painted with festoons of flowers and drapery; silver handle
- 872 An ivory fitted work-box, most elaborately carved, and pierced with panels of diaper ornament, and various friezes, showing a tinsel ground beneath—Indian, early 19th Century; and one, nearly similar
- 873 An Italian walnut-wood casket, with slightly domed cover, inlaid with geometrical ornaments in ebony and bone; a Brittany walnut-wood box, carved with geometrical ornaments; and a Bagard-de-Nancy box, carved with a crowned monogram and fleur-de-lis ornaments
- 874 A small ebonised cabinet, of architectural design, inlaid with plaques of lapis-lazuli, and with columns of jasper, mounted with metal-gilt; inset in the centre door is a panel of Limoges enamel, painted with the Crucifixion in polychromatic metallic colours—231 in. high

- 877 A life-size male bust, in white statuary marble, in almost full relief, set within a Greek moulded frame
