SCAFFOLD. A long-sleeved knitted vest of pale blue
silk, worked with diaper patterns and fastened with
buttons down the front; and an album, containing
newspaper cuttings, letters and documents relating to the
vest and its history

*After the King's execution the vest came into the hands
of Dr. Hobbs, his physician, who attended him on the
scaffold, and from him it passed to his daughter, Susannah
Hobbs, who married Temple Stanger, of Rawlings, Oxford-
shire. It descended to Temple Hardy, Esq., by whom it
was left to Admiral D'Aeth, of Knowlton Court, Kent, who
died in 1783*

*"The Secret History of Whitehall," p. 302, contains
the following statement: "The bishop (Juxon) put on his
(the King's) nightcap and unclothed him to his sky-blue
vest"*

- 62 A GOLD MEDAL, with profile portrait of Charles I., turned to his left, wearing robes and large ruff, inscribed "CAROLUS. I. D. G. MAG. BRITANLÆ. FRAN. ET. HIB. REX.;" the reverse, a man-o'-war in full sail, "NEC. META. MIHI. QVÆ. TERMINVS. ORBL.," by N. Briot— $2\frac{1}{4}$ in. diam.
- 63 ANOTHER, similar, but the King represented wearing a plain lawn collar
- 64 A silver-gilt oval box, the lid pierced with a profile portrait of Charles I., in border of emblems, and engraved with the arms of Trelawny, of Trelawne
- 65 A circular silver box, the lid chased with a profile portrait of Charles I., turned to his left, wearing armour and lawn collar
- 66 A smaller ditto, the lid chased with a profile portrait of Charles I., turned to his right, the inside set with a silver counter by Simon de Passe, engraved with the Royal Arms, the base set with a small marriage medal of Charles I. and Henrietta Maria, dated 1625
- 67 An oval snuff-box, of wood, said to have been made from the scaffold on which Charles I. was beheaded, the lid mounted with a silver medallion portrait of Charles I.
- 68 An oval silver snuff-box, with tortoiseshell base and lid, the latter mounted with a silver medallion portrait of Charles I.; and an octagonal tortoiseshell box, mounted with a similar portrait
- 69 An oval silver snuff-box, the lid chased with a medallion portrait of Charles I.
- 70 A circular ivory snuff-box, the lid set with a silver medal with portrait of Archbishop Laud, dated 1644, by Jan. Roettier, the reverse, Cherubs supporting a crown and mitre

- 81 A memorial locket, containing hair of Mary II., and monogram in gold wire; a pair of sleeve-links, with the monogram of Charles II. beneath glass; a badge, with the gilt monogram of Charles II. on blue ground; a metal stud, with portrait of Queen Anne; and a small ivory seal, engraved with a portrait of Queen Anne
- 82 Two silver heart-shaped lockets, engraved with mottoes, and containing small medallion portraits of Charles I.; a pear-shaped silver pendant, engraved to commemorate the marriage of the Young Pretender and Princess Clementina Sobiesky, 1719; and a silver locket, formed as a padlock, engraved with the date 1676
- 83 A silver oval box, with double lining, the base containing a miniature of the Young Pretender, wearing wig, and armour with gilt bands and rivets
- 84 A lock of hair of the Young Pretender, when aged 16—in turned wood frame

- 142 A larger ewer—15 $\frac{1}{2}$ *in. high*
- 143 A pair of candlesticks, formed as cylindrical columns, on
square bases—20 $\frac{3}{4}$ *in. high*

- 145 A circular bowl, the lower part fluted, with square plinth—

stand with turned supports—42 *in. wide*
