THE END.

The first part of the report is devoted to a description of the work done during the year. It is divided into two main sections, the first of which deals with the general results of the work and the second with the details of the experiments. The first section is headed "General Results" and the second "Details of Experiments".

The general results of the work are as follows: (1) The rate of reaction between the two substances is found to be proportional to the concentration of the reactants.
