4. The Purchaser to give his name and address, and to pay a deposit of five shillings in the pound, or more, or the whole of the purchase-money, if required.
5. The lots to be taken away and paid for, with all faults, imperfections and errors of description, at the Purchaser's risk and expense the day after the sale, W. E. HURCOMB not being responsible for the correct description, genuineness, or authenticity of, or any fault or defect in, any lot, and making no warranty whatever; and in default W. E. HURCOMB is not to be held responsible if the lots, or any of them, are lost, damaged or destroyed, and whether the purchase-money, or any part thereof, has been paid or not. In cases where a buyer purchases more than one lot the whole must be paid for before any one lot is delivered.
6. Any Purchaser neglecting to pay for and take away any lot or lots purchased within one day after the sale (not having been re-sold in accordance with the seventh condition) shall pay, in addition to the purchase-money, the sum of one shilling per week for warehouse-room, and also at the rate of five per cent. per annum interest on the purchase-money, to be reckoned from this day.
