CONDITIONS OF SALE.

The auctioneers reserve the right of refusing any bidding or of withdrawing any lot or lots from the sale.

VII.—To prevent inaccuracy in delivery, and inconvenience in the settlement of the purchases, no lot can on any account be removed during the time of sale, and the remainder of the purchase-money must absolutely be paid on the delivery.
