First, I commit my Soul to Almighty God, in hopes, through his Mercy, and the Merits of my Saviour

viour Jefus Christ, to enjoy eternal Reft; and my Body I commit to the Earth, to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors, herein after named : and, as for such Temporal Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose thereof as followeth.

Imprimis, I Will that all my Debts and Funeral Charges be first paid and discharged.

Item, I give and devife unto my Coufin George Orton, Son of my Coufin Mary Orton deceafed, his Heirs and Affigns for ever, to his and their Ufe, all those my Meffuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments in Tamworth and Wiggington, in the County of Stafford, or elfewhere, which I purchased of Archdale Palmer, and Anne his Wife.

Item, I give, devife, and bequeath unto my Coufin John Voughton, Grandfon of my Uncle John Voughton, all that Meffuage, Burgage, or Tenement, Lands and Hereditaments in Tamworth and Wiggington, in the CounCounty of Stafford, or elfewhere, which I purchased of his Father John Voughton, to hold unto my faid Coufin John Voughton, his Heirs and Affigns for ever, to his and their Use.

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Item, All the reft and refidue of my Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and real Effate whatfoever in the Counties of Stafford, Warwick, and Derby, or any of them, other than, and except the Alms-Houfes and Library, with their Appurtenances herein after mentioned and devifed; I give and devife unto, and between Elizabeth Hurt, and John Hurt, the Grandchildren of my late Sifter Anne Varnam, their Heirs and Affigns for ever, to hold as Tenants in common, and not as Joint-Tenants.

Item, I give and bequeath to Thomas Hurt, one of the Grandchildren of my late Sifter Anne Varnam, during his natural Life, one Annuity or yearly Sum of One Hundred and Sixty Pounds, which, with forty Pounds per Annum, I am already bound to pay, makes up two Hundred dred Pounds per Annum, to be paid by equal Quarterly Payments, and to commence from my Decease.

And my Mind and Will is, That the faid feveral Sums or Parcels of Stock, herein before bequeathed to my feveral Legatees above named, who at my Deceafe fhall be under Age, and unmarried, fhall not be paid, or payble, or transferred, or to be transferred by my faid Executors, or the faid intended Corporation, until they fhall arrive refpectively, the Men to the Age of twenty one Years, and the Women to fuch Age of

of twenty one Years or their Day of Marriage, and which of them shall first happen; and that during fuch the Infancy or fingle State of my faid Legatees refpectively, my Will is, That my Executors herein after named, or the faid herein after mentioned and intended Corporation, or their Treasurer for the Time being, allow for the Maintenance and Education of my faid feveral Legatees, the Interest, Dividends, and Produce of the Stock to them respectively given, and alfo fhall allow out of the refpective Legacies or Stock of fuch as shall want to be put forth Apprentices, fuch Sums of Money as my faid Executors, or the faid intended Corporation, or their Treasurer, shall think fit: which faid feveral Allowances and Sums of Money, shall be paid to the Fathers, Mothers, Guardians or Mafters of fuch Legatees refpectively, and their Receipts refpectively shall be fufficient Discharges for the fame.

Item, I give and bequeath unto Charles Joye, John Kenrick, and John Lade, Esquires; Mr. Thomas Dance, Mr. John Sprint, and Mr. John Osborn, the Sum of one Thousand Pounds Sterling, upon this special Trust and Confidence, That they or the Survivors or Survivor of them shall within Twelve Months after my Decease, or sooner, if it may be, dispose and disburse the same, for the releasing and difcharging

faid Executors, or the faid intende

charging of poor Prifoners for Debt, out of any Prifons within the City of London, or Counties of Middlefex and Surry, not exceeding the Sum of five Pounds for the Difcharge of any one Perfon.

Item, I give to the Prefident and Governors of Christ's-Hospital, in London, and their Succeffors for ever, one Annuity, or yearly Sum of four hundred Pounds, to be paid by my faid Executors, till fuch intended Corporation shall be obtain'd and take effect; and then by fuch intended Corporation, or their Treasurer for the time being : provided neverthelefs, and upon this Condition, That my faid Executors, and fuch intended Corporation and their Succeffors, fhall have liberty, from time to time, to nominate and put into Christ's-Hospital aforefaid, yearly, and every Year for ever, at Easter, or within fix Months after, fuch four poor Children, Boys or Girls, whether Orphans or otherwife, or the Children of Freemen of the City of London, or Unfreemen, not less than feven, or more than ten Years of D Age,

Age, as my faid Executors, or the faid intended Corporation, and their Succeffors, shall think fit, with preference to my Relations, as often as any fuch shall offer themselves; who shall be received into the faid Hofpital, and have the Maintenance and Education thereof, and be continu'd therein in like manner as other Children are maintain'd and educated in the faid Hospital. And my Will is, that in cafe, and as often as the faid Prefident and Governors of Christ-Church-Hofpital, shall neglect or refuse to take in and maintain the faid Number of Boys and Girls to them nominated and qualified as aforefaid, it shall be lawful to my faid Executors, and the faid intended Corporation, and they are hereby directed and defired to apply the faid annual Sum of Four Hundred Pounds to the Education and Maintenance of fuch four poor Children as aforefaid, in fuch other School or Place, and in fuch other manner as they shall think fit.

And whereas the Mafters, Keepers, Wardens, and Commonalty, of the Art or Mystery of Stationers of

of the City of London, are, in and by one Bond or Obligation, under their Common Seal, bearing date on or about the third Day of February, Anno Dom. 1717, become bound unto the Governors of the Hospital of St. Thomas the Apostle in Southwark, in the County of Surry, in the penal Sum of five Thousand five Hundred Pounds, condition'd for the Payment of One Hundred and Twenty five Pounds, by them and their Succeffors for ever, by half-yearly Payments, free from all manner of Deductions whatfoever, in manner following, viz.

To me the faid Thomas Guy, during my natural Life, and from and after my Decease, to such Person and Perfons, Ufes, Intents, and Purpofes, as I, by my last Will and Testament in Writing, or any other Writings under my Hand and Seal, fubfcribed in the Prefence of three or more credible Witneffes, should declare, limit, and appoint, as in and by the faid Obligation and Condition, relation being thereunto had, may more fully and at large appear : Now
Now I give and devife unto John Cheatly, and John Blood Yeomen; Joseph Blood, and Arthur Alcock Clothiers; Thomas Orton Yeoman; John Radford, Robert Blood, and the faid John Osborn, Citizen and Stationer of London, all that my Alms-Houfe or Building, containing fixteen Rooms, fourteen of which faid Rooms are now used and employ'd for the Habitation of fourteen poor Men and Women, and the other two Rooms being laid together, are ufed for a Library, with the Houfeof-Office, Gardens, and Appurtenances thereto belonging, fituate, lying, and being partly in Gumgate-street, and partly in School-house-lane in Tamworth, in the County of Warwick, to hold to them the faid John Cheat-ly, John Blood, Joseph Blood, Arthur Alcock, Thomas Orton, John Radford, Robert Blood, and John Osborn, their Heirs and Affigns for ever, in Trust, nevertheless, and to and for the Ufes, Intents, and Purpofes herein after mentioned; that is to fay, That my faid Truftees, and the Survivors of them, and fuch others

others as fhall fucceed and be chofen in their room, or place, by virtue of the Claufes herein after in that behalf mentioned, or the major part of them, shall and do, from time to time, admit and place in the faid Rooms, Fourteen poor Perfons, Men or Women, Inhabitants of the Towns, Villages, or Parifhes of Wincoate, Glascoate, Bole-hall-Street, Ammington, Wiggington, and Hoppus, or any of them; my poor Relations being first to be admitted, in cafe any fuch shall offer themselves, whom they shall think proper Objects of fuch Charity : and as often as any of them shall die, to place others in their stead. And, in cafe any fuch of the faid poor Perfons shall mifbehave themfelves, my faid Truftees for the Time being, or the major part of them, shall, from time to time, displace fuch, and put others in their stead, as they shall think fit. And that the two Rooms, above mentioned, to be used for a Library, shall continue to be fo used; or for fuch other Uses, for the better Accommodation of the Perfons that shall dwell in the faid fourteen Rooms, as , TELOG

as the faid Trustees for the Time being, or the major part of them shall think fit.

And my Mind and Will is, That when, and fo often as any of the faid Truftees fhall happen to die, the Survivors of them fhall choofe in another Perfon to fucceed and be a Truftee; who fhall act with them, in all refpects, as if he had been particularly named with the other Truftees in this my Will.

And to prevent the legal Intereft of the faid last mention'd Premises, from going to the Heir of a furviving Trustee, it is my Mind and Will, That as often as my prefent, or future Truftees, in whom the legal Eftates of the fame Premifes shall reft, shall be by Death reduced to Two; that fuch Two, or the Survivor of them, shall forthwith convey the fame Premifes to fuch other Trustees and their Heirs, upon the Trust aforefaid, as my then acting Trustees, or the major part of them shall think fit or direct. And I do hereby order, limit, declare, and appoint,

point, that the faid yearly Sum of One Hundred Twenty five Pounds, be paid by the Mafters, and Keepers, or Wardens, and Commonalty of Stationers above mentioned, and their Succeffors, by half-yearly Payments, at the Feaft-day of Saint John the Baptist, and the Birth of our Lord God, in every year for ever, to my faid Executors, until fuch intended Corporation, as aforefaid, shall be obtained and take effect; and then to fuch intended Corporation, and their Succeffors: to the Intent that my faid Executors, or the faid intended Corporation, and their Succeffors, do, and may thereout pay the Sum of One Hundred and Fifteen Pounds per Annum, part thereof, by like half-yearly Payments, unto the faid John Cheatly, John Blood. Joseph Blood, Arthur Alcock, Thomas Orton, John Radford, Robert Blood, and John Osborn, and the Survivors of them, and fuch as shall fucceed them, as aforefaid for ever, in Truft, and to and for the Uses, Intents, and Purposes, herein after mentioned; that is to fay, in respect of Eighty Pounds per Annum, part of the faid. yearly

yearly Sum of One Hundred and Fifteen Pounds, upon Truft, and to the Intent that they do, and shall pay thereout, unto each of the faid Fourteen poor People, and fuch others as shall from time to time be chosen in their stead, the Sum of Two Shillings per Week, for their Maintenance : And what shall be remaining of the faid Eighty Pounds per Annum, over and above fuch weekly Payments, shall be expended and applied by my faid Truftees, for Reparation of the faid Alms-houfes and Premises; and for fuch other Uses relating thereto as my faid Truffees. or the major part of them, shall from time to time think fit and appoint.

And for and in refpect of the Sum of Thirty five Pounds, Remainder of the faid yearly Sum of one Hundred and Fifteen Pounds, upon Truft, and to the Intent that my faid laft mentioned Truftees, and fuch as fhall fucceed them, as aforefaid, for ever, fhall and do apply the fame to the putting out Children Apprentice, Nurfing, or fuch like charitable Deed, of Four, Six, or Eight fuch poor Perfons Perfons of the Family of the Voughtons, or Woods, or proceeding therefrom, as they shall think fit. And if none, or not sufficient of such can be found, then of such other Person or Persons, as they shall find to be proper Objects of Charity.

And for and in respect of Ten Pounds per Annum, the Remainder of the faid Sum of One Hundred and Twenty five Pounds per Annum, afore mentioned, my Will is, That my faid Executors, and fuch intended Corporation, and their Succeffors, shall, and do pay the same, from time to time, by like half-yearly Payments, for ever, unto Joseph Hughes of Oakingham, in the County of Berks Gentleman, Abraham Chitty Citizen and Cooper of London, Josias Chitty Citizen and Grocer of London, Joseph Chitty of London, Merchant, and the faid John Osborn, and fuch others as shall from time to time, be elected and chosen in their room and stead, as any of them die, in like manner as is above mentioned, concerning the Trust of the aforefaid Alms-houfe, for ever, in Truft, E

Trust that they apply the fame to the putting out of Children Apprentice, Nursing, or such like charitable Deeds, of two or more such poor Persons, of the Family of the Guys, or proceeding therefrom, as they shall think fit : and if no such can be found, then of such other Person or Persons as they shall find to be proper Objects of Charity.

Item, I give and bequeath unto Charles Joye, John Lade, John Kenrick, Esquires; Mr. John Darby, Mr. Thomas Dance, Mr. John Sprint, and Mr. John Osborn, the Sum of one Thousand Pounds Sterling; Two Hundred Pounds, part of which, fhall be paid unto them, or to fuch Perfon or Perfons, as they, or the major part of them shall appoint, by Writing under their Hands, at the End of three Months next after my Decease, and so from time to time, at the End of every three Months, until the faid Sum of One Thoufand Pounds be fully paid, in Truft, that they, the Survivors, or Survivor of them, shall, and do, from time to time, distribute the fame for the Reis noule, for ever, in lief fun I

lief and Maintenance of fuch poor People, being Houfekeepers, as in their Judgments fhall be thought convenient : and my Mind and Will is, That my faid laft mentioned Truftees fhall not be accountable to my Executors for the fame, and fhall be allowed their Charges in the Execution of the fame Truft, out of the Moneys to be paid to them, from time to time as aforefaid.

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Item, I give to the faid John Ofborn Stationer, the Sum of One Hundred Pounds, defiring him to affift my Executors in the Execution of this my Will.

Item, I give to *Anne Gorton*, Servant of Mr. *Osborn*, the Sum of Fifty Pounds, if the be living in the Houfe with me at the Time of my Decease.

Item, To my faid herein after named Executors for Mourning, I give and bequeath the Sum of Twenty Guineas a-piece. All the Reft and Refidue of my Eftate, whatfoever, and wherefoever, both real and perfo- E_2 nal,

nal, after the Payment of my Debts, Legacies, and Funeral Charges, as aforefaid, and fubject to the Payment of the faid feveral Annuities and yearly Sums, herein before bequeathed; I give, bequeath, and devile unto Sir Gregory Page Baronet, Charles Joye Esquire, Treasurer of the present Hofpital of Saint Thomas, William Clayton of Marden in the County of Surrey Esquire, Mr. Thomas Hollis Senior, John Kenrick, and John Lade Efquires, and Governors of the prefent Hospital of Saint Thomas; Doctor Richard Mead, Moses Raper Esquire, and Mr. John Sprint, Governors likewife of the fame prefent Hospital, their Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, respectively, upon the Truft, and for fuch Ufes, Intents, and Purpofes, as are herein after, by this my Will, directed and appointed : And I do hereby likewife ordain, constitute, and appoint the faid Sir Gregory Page Baronet, Charles Joye, and William Clayton Esquires, Mr. Thomas Hollis Senior, John Kenrick, and John Lade Esquires, Doctor Richard Mead, Mafes Raper Esquire, and Mr. John Sprint,

Sprint, Executors of this my faid Last Will, on Trust, as aforefaid.

And my Mind and Will is, That until fuch Incorporation, by Letters Patent, or Act of Parliament, as herein after directed, can be obtained and take effect, they my faid Executors and last mentioned Truftees, their Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Affigns; and afterwards fuch Corporation shall, and do, out of the Residuum of my Estate, or the Rents, Interest, or other Profits thereof, carry on, erect, finish, and fit up the two new Squares of Building in Southwark, by me fome time fince began and intended for an Hofpital, for reception of fuch fick Perfons as are herein after mentioned : and fuch other Erections, Offices, and Buildings, as shall in the Opinion of my faid Executors and Truftees, be for that Purpose further necessary; and also provide and furnish the fame with Beds and all other Conveniencies for the Reception of, and receive and entertain therein, Four Hundred poor Perfons or upwards, labouring under any Diftempers Infirmities

firmities or Diforders, thought capable of Relief by Phyfick or Surgery; but who, by reason of the finall Hopes there may be of their Cure, or the length of Time which for that Purpofe may be required or thought necessary, are, or may be adjudged or called Incurable, and as fuch, not proper Objects to be re-ceived into, or continued in the prefent Hospital of St. Thomas, or other Hospitals, in and by which, no Provision has been made for Diftempers deemed or called Incurable : of whom my Mind is, That they. receive and entertain Lunaticks, adjudged or called, as aforefaid, incurable, not exceeding Twenty in Number at one time; fuch poor Perfons to be chosen and appointed by my faid Executors and Truftees, out of fuch Patients and Perfons who shall be discharged out of the Hospital of Saint Thomas, or Bethlehem. or other Hospitals, on account of the fmall Hopes of their Cure, or the great length of Time for that purpose required or thought necessary, and on fuch or any other account, adjudged and called Incurable, and not

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not fit to be continued in the faid Hospital of St. Thomas, or Bethlehem, or other Hospitals : Or such other poor fick Perfons, or Lunaticks, as, under fuch or the like Circumstances, shall apply to my faid Executors and Truffees for Relief, at the Difcretion and Pleafure of my faid Executors and Truftees, to whom I fubmit the feveral Species or Kinds of fick Perfons deemed or called Incurables, who shall be admitted into the faid intended Hofpital; and that my faid Executors and Truftees shall, and do provide fuitable and proper Diet, Phyfick, and all other Neceffaries for the Maintenance, Relief, or Cure of fuch fick Perfons. during their Lives, or for fo long time as my faid Executors and Truftees shall think fit to continue them under their Care in the faid intended Hofpital.

Last Will and Testament ; in Witnefs whereof, I have to the fame, contain'd in feventeen Sheets of Paper, and to one other part thereof, contained in eleven Sheets of Paper, fet my Hand and Seal, viz. my Hand at the Bottom of the faid feveral Sheets of Paper, and to the last of the faid feventeen and eleven Sheets refpectively my Hand and Seal, and my Seal to the Place where the faid feventeen and eleven Sheets are feverally connected together, on this fourth Day of September, Anno Domini 1724; and in the eleventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George, over Great Britain, Sc.
