THE

PREFACE.

HE most useful and curious Records, relating to our Law and History, are dispersed in so many different Places, that whoever has had Occafion to fearch for those valuable Treasures, must be fensible of the great Trouble and Difficulty of finding them. Many Records of the fame Nature, which ought to be collected into one Place, are scattered in several Offices, as diftant from one another, as the Tower from Westminster-Hall. For Instance, the Patent Rolls, are some at the Tower, fome at the Rolls Chapel, fome at the Petty Bag Office, and fome at the Exchequer. But when this is known, still we are at a Loss for want of more particular Directions, to which of these Places we should apply for

the Thing wanted; and therefore are frequently obliged to fearch for it through all the Offices, at a great Trouble and Expence. And even the Clerks themfelves, in fome Offices (for Want of proper Calendars,) are ignorant of the Particulars under their Care.

These Difficulties have occasioned many Lawyers and Historians to commit great Mistakes, by taking Things on the Credit of those who wrote before them, instead of having Recourse to the Originals themfelves.

It is hoped the following Sheets may in fome Meafure remedy these Inconveniencies, and by making the Access to the Records much easier, render them more beneficial to the Publick.

The best Work of this Kind, which hath hitherto been published, is a short 2 State

State of the Records, drawn up by Mr. Lawton, Inspector of the Records in the Court of Receipt of the Exchequer, printed in the Report of the Committee of the House of Commons, appointed to infpect the State of the Cottonian Library, Anno 1732, and executed with great Care and Exactness: But that being only a short general State, printed in Folio among feveral other Matters, and fold at a high Price, it was thought the following Work, which is much more copious and methodical, would be of more general Use; and confidering the Size, and Price of it, more acceptable to the Publick.

Befides the great Affistance I had from Mr. Lawton's State, I have confulted Powell, Prynne, Bishop Nicolfon, and other Authors; fome Manuscripts of Mr. Lambert's, Mr. Agard's, and Mr. Le Neve's (who were very conversant in these Matters) and the several Offices where the Records are depofited. The



To make the Book more useful, the Tables annexed were thought necessfary; fince without such Assistance it will be very difficult to discover the Dates of many of our ancient Records, or understand the Names of Persons, or Places, mentioned in them.

All poffible Care has been taken to avoid Errors, and should any be found, as poffibly there may, in transcribing such a Number of Dates and Figures, if they are communicated to the Bookseller, they shall be corrected the first Opportunity.

HE following Table being intended as a fhort and ready Method of computing the Dates, &c. of Records, and other Writings, as well ancient as Modern, and to fhew what Parliaments have been held: it may be proper to obferve, (without entering into the Difpute concerning their Antiquity) that it feems eftablifhed, they have been held under one Name or other, even before the Conqueft, tho' it does not appear the Word PARLIAMENT was generally ufed by our Hiftorians till the firft Year of RICHARD I.

FROM that Period, to the prefent Time, I have collected the feveral Meetings, Prorogations, and Diffolutions of our Parliaments from the Records, and where they are deficient, from Hiftorians of the best Authority; but the Loss of many ancient Records, and

the

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the Neglect of Historians, in not only omitting the Prorogations, &c. but even differing about the Time when feveral Parliaments met, make it now impossible to be absolutely certain in every Particular; yet notwithftanding those Difadvantages, I am perfuaded, by Experience, the following Account will be found extremely useful, and as correct as the Nature of the Thing will permit.

FROM the Conquest to the Reign of RICHARD I, there is frequent Mention made of GREAT COURTS held, and as some learned Men have been of Opinion, these were of the Nature of Parliaments. I did not think it would be right to omit them, tho' not being warranted by the Records, we must entirely rely on the Credit of the Historians who observe them.

WITH Respect to the other Part of the Table, the Reader will observe, that the Year

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Year of our Lord is computed from the 25th of *March*, and placed against the End, (not the Beginning) of the respective Year of each King's Reign; and under the Name of every King is mention'd the Day, Month, and Year, when his Reign began:

Тне following Examples will fufficiently explain the Use of the Table.

To find the King's Reign, and the particular Year of it, answering to the 20th of August, 1077.

LOOK for 1077 in the fecond Column, opposite to which is the 11th Year of WIL-LIAM I, and observing at the Head of the Table, that he began to Reign the 14th of October, shews that the 20th of August, 1077, must be in the 11th Year of his Reign. But if (instead of the 20th of August) you look for the 20th of November, 1077, that must be in the 12th Year of WILLIAM I, because

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because he began his Reign the 14th of October, and confequently his 11th Year ended on that Day, 1077.

To find the Year of our Lord answering to the 20th of September, in the 4th Year of WILLIAM II.

LOOK for 4 WILLIAM II. in the first Column, and against it in the fecond (by obferving as above) is the 4th WILLIAM II, which ending the 9th of September, 1091, the 20th of September, in the 4th Year of his Reign, must be Anno Domini 1090.

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


