

In printing them, he has followed the example of Mr. *Ray*, who published a Catalogue of Plants growing about CAMBRIDGE; Mr. *Blackstone*, of those round HAREFIELD; Mr. *Dering*, of those round NORTHAMPTON; and many others. And, though he does not know that many scarce or very uncommon Plants are to be found in this Circuit, yet, as it has been often hinted by Botanical Writers, that if an account was taken of the Plants growing about particular places, it might be a means of promoting Botanical Knowledge, and assisting young Students in

in that Science, the following mite is offered for that purpose.

He has given two *Latin* Names to each Plant; the first, taken from RAY's *Synopsis Stirpium Britannicarum*, the third edition, 1724; the other from LINNÆUS, as quoted in HUDSON's *Flora Anglicana*, edition 1762. He has added the Clasfs assigned by LINNÆUS; given the *English* name or names, usually from RAY; mentioned the Soil wherein each Plant is found; very often the particular place of Growth, and the time of Flowering.

In order to render it of more general use to the *English* Reader, he has endeavoured to make it, as much as possible, an *English* Catalogue; by specifying the soil, the place of Growth, and the time of Flowering, in the *English* language.

If what is here offered should be of any use, for the very laudable purpose above-mentioned, his end in making it public, is abundantly answered.

The common Maple.

*In hedges almost every where; and in the woody parts of the Forest: not uncommon.*

It flowers in May or June.




