1. That the Members of the Buchan Medical Society, having a deep interest in the prosperity of the Aberdeen Infirmary, and the Medical School connected therewith, feel it a duty that this Society express its opinion on the question now at issue, with regard to the practice of Homeopathy in the Royal Infirmary.

2. That this Society is of opinion that the Medical Officers of the Infirmary undertook their duties in accordance with the system of medicine generally practised; and that the only safeguard the public have is that the practice in the Infirmary be

regulated accordingly.

3. That the practice of the Medical Staff of the Infirmary ought to be in general accordance with the principles taught in

the University and other recognised Medical Schools.

4. That, though this Society does not feel called upon to discuss the truth or error of any system of medicine, it has no hesitation in expressing its unanimous opinion—which is that of the profession—that Homeopathy is at variance with ordinary therapeutics; that no man can honestly practice both systems; and that no neutral ground is open to both parties.

5. That Dr. Ogilvie, as President of the Aberdeen Medico-Chirurgical Society, and, ex officio, a Manager of the Infirmary, be requested to bring the foregoing resolutions before the other Managers, at the meeting to be held on the 14th instant, or otherwise, to make what use of them he thinks proper. That copies be forwarded also to the Secretary of the Garioch Medical Society.
