





A Short Account of the Liverpool Royal Infirmary

1745 to 1922

In 1745 a "Public Infirmary" was established in Liverpool (Illustrations No. 1 and 2) for the treatment "of all poor, diseased or hurt persons," "not with any partial view of serving the town only, but to make provision for the many objects that appeared in distress from all parts of the Nation and Ireland." A lease was granted by the Corporation for 999 years of a large field on "Shaw's Brow," now the Site of St. George's Hall.

The Building was opened in 1749, and cost £2,618. In 1820 the Hospital having become inadequate, and the site being desired for improvements in contemplation by the Corporation, a new site in Brownlow Street with an Annuity of £210 was granted. The Foundation Stone was laid in 1821 by Lord Stanley, and the building was opened in 1824 at a cost of £20,426.

In 1830 and 1834 a Lunatic Asylum and Lock Hospital were built. In 1863 the Nurses' Home in Ashton Street was built, the pioneer institution in this movement which was to exercise so great and beneficial an influence on Hospital management and among the community. In 1881 the portion of the Hospital land on which stood the Lunatic Asylum was acquired by the London and North Western Railway. This was the nucleus of a fund for re-building the Hospital, to which the Corporation contributed £15,000, and at a meeting in the Town Hall in December, 1882, £55,000 was promised.

On the old, but largely extended, site, the Foundation Stone of the present building (Illustration No. 3) was laid by the Earl of Derby in October, 1887, and exactly three years afterwards the building was opened by H.R.H. the late Duke of Clarence, the total cost having been £181,000.

Then the Out-patient Department became inadequate, mainly owing to the change of opinion in the value of Out-patient Treatment. In 1887, when the Infirmary was built, the treatment





of Out-patients as such was not contemplated ; all were prescribed for as only waiting for admission to the wards when beds became available, and the Out-patient accommodation therefore was but meagre. Later it became recognised what tremendous relief could be given through the Out-patient Department where comparatively minor ailments could be attended to by skilled Medical Officers and Nurses, and patients restored to health and occupation without wearisome delay. Therefore, the necessity for a new and up-to-date Out-patient Department, with ample accommodation, asserted itself, and in 1911 the present Out-patient Building was opened by the Earl of Sefton, having cost roughly £45,000.

It is a great tribute to the skill and longsightedness of the Committee and Architect of 1887 that after over 30 years, notwithstanding the great changes that have taken place in Hospital construction and management, the Infirmary maintains its high position as a convenient well-arranged Hospital.

As may be expected however, the Nurses' Home, now nearly 60 years old, is inadequate and out of date, and the erection of a new Home is at the present time exercising the serious consideration of the Committee. A total sum of about £110,000 is required for a suitable new Home, but it is proposed to build it in instalments as money becomes available. Unfortunately, the great depression of trade renders the task of getting money extremely difficult, but acting in the belief that something tangible rather than in contemplation, will appeal more to a generous public, the Committee has decided to start immediately with the erection of that portion of the building which will accommodate those of the Nursing Staff who, owing to the inadequacy of the existing Home, are at present unsuitably and badly housed in old dwellings in Ashton Street.

From the accompanying photograph (Illustration No. 4) it will be seen that the new Home will be a worthy addition to the Infirmary, but the completion of it depends entirely upon the necessary capital being forthcoming.

Having thus briefly dealt with the "capital" or "fabric" aspect of the Infirmary, it may here be of interest to revert to 1770, and study the following extract from "The State of the Liverpool Infirmary" for that year (a framed copy of this Report is in the possession of the Institution).

and as it is found neceffary alfo, that fome additional Offices will be required, for the better Accommodating the Secretary, Apothecary's Apprentices in the Houfe, the Matron and Nurfes, it is moft earneftly recommended to the Inhabitants in this Town and Neighbourhood, to contribute generously to the Support of fo noble an Undertaking, efpecially fuch, as are not already Annual Subfcribers ; and indeed, we regret, that many opulent Families and People in affluent Circumftances, in the Town and Neighbourhood, have not yet paid that Attention to this Charity.

Benefactors, and Subfcribers, in their recommendations of patients, are defired to attend to the following Rules relating to their admifſion.

That Patients be admitted and difcharged every Thurſday, by the Weekly-Board, between the Hours of Ten and Eleven.

That no Perfons be admitted who are able to affift themselves, and pay for Medicines.

That no Subfcriber's Recommendation be accepted while his Subscription is in Arrear.

That no Perfon be admitted a Patient without the Recommen-dation of a Truftee, except in Cafes of Cafualties, or of the most urgent Neceffity.

That the cafes of Patients, to be recommended from Places at a remote Diftance, may be fent, drawn up by fome Phyfician, Surgeon, or Apothecary, to the Infirmary Poſt paid, to which an Anfwer fhall be returned, whether, and when, they fhall be admitted. But that the Board fhall enjoy the Liberty of rejecting fuch Patients if their Cafes appear to have been mifreprefented.

That no woman big with Child, no Child under Seven Years of Age, except in Extraordinary Cafes, as Fractures, or where cutting for the Stone, or any other Operation is required ; no Perfons difordered in their Senfes, fuſpected to have the Small-Pox, Itch, or other Infectious Diftemper, that are apprehended to be in a dying Condition, or Incurable, be admitted as In-patients, or if inadvertently admitted, beuffered to continue.

All Perfons who are difpoſed to contribute, by WILL, to this Charity, are defired to do it in the following Manner,

I Give and bequeath unto A. B. and C. D. the Sum of upon Truft, that they do pay the fame to the Treafurer for the Time being, of a Society who call themſelves the TRUSTEES of the PUBLIC INFIRMARY at Liverpool, which Sum of I defire may be applied towards carrying on the charitable Defigns of the faid Society.




A MALE MEDICAL WARD AT CHRISTMAS.
