Subject.—Annual Report on Mental Hospitals for the year 1957.

I submit the Annual Report on the Mental Hospitals in the State of Bombay for the year 1957.

GENERAL.

2. During the year 1957 all the Mental Hospitals were over crowded. The actual population in all the Mental Hospitals in the first week of January, 1957 was 5,210 against the sanctioned accommodation of 3,095, during the year, 823 patients were discharged as "cured" and 739 as improved. There were 1,542 cases under observation in the various Mental Hospitals. The total number of Criminal insanes confined in Mental Hospitals was 474. The total receipts amounted to Rs. 6,03,413. The gross expenditure on maintaining the Mental Hospitals was Rs. 43,09,953. The facilities for in-door and out-door games were provided to the patients. The facilities for treatment on modern lines such as Insulin, shock Therapy, Electric convulsive Therapy and Hydrotherapy are given at the majority of the Mental Hospitals.

BUILDINGS.

3. *Major Works.*—The following Major works have been administratively approved by Government during the year 1957 :—

- (1) Expansion of Mental Hospital at Poona.
- (2) Additional Accommodation for patients at the N. M. Mental Hospital, Thana.
- (3) Improvements and water supply system at Mental Hospital, Nagpur.
- (4) Improvements and extension to existing Mental Hospital, Nagpur.

The first two works at Mental Hospital, Poona and Thana are to be started immediately. The water supply work and extension to existing Mental Hospital, Nagpur are nearing completion.

4. *Minor Works.*—The minor works costing Rs. 3,322 were sanctioned at the Mental Hospitals, Ahmedabad and Yeravda, during the year 1957. The Buildings of the Mental Hospitals are in fairly good state of repairs.

5. *Water Supply.*—The water supply at the Mental Hospital, Baroda was adequate during the year due to the working of the Electric Motor pump. At the Mental Hospital, Ahmedabad, water is obtained from Municipal pipe line. It is not however sufficient for the Hospital use. The water supply for the garden and agricultural purposes at this hospital is obtained from the well of the Hospital. An Electric Pump has been installed on the well but is not working satisfactorily. The matter of providing another connection is under consideration. At the Mental Hospital, Thana, the work of carrying out the improvements to the existing water supply arrangements has been started. The scarcity of water was felt at the Mental Hospital, Ratnagiri, during the summer viz. from March to May due to the limited supply of water from the Municipal water works and drying up of the Hospital wells. At Mental Hospital, Nagpur, the present water supply of the hospital is very deficient. The work of effecting improvement in the water supply system of this hospital has commenced in this year and is in progress. The water supply at the Mental Hospital, Bhuj is not adequate. The water is fetched from the City well. Due to inadequacy of water, there is no garden or lawn at this hospital.

6. *Accommodation.*—Overcrowding at all the Mental Hospital, except the Mental Hospitals, Baroda, Nagpur, Bhavnagar and Bhuj continued throughout the year as can be seen from the following table showing the approved scale of accommodation and the actual population in the first week of January, 1957—

Thus there were 2,135 patients (1,159 males and 976 females) in excess of the sanctioned accommodation. In order to relieve the congestion and overcrowding to some extent at the Mental Hospitals, Government in September 1955 had directed that the accommodation at all Mental Hospitals in the former Bombay State should be extended by the construction of dormitories to accommodate at least 50 patients at each of the Mental Hospitals. The work of constructing these dormitories is still in progress. The construction of additional dormitories in the male section at C. M. Hospital, Yeravada is under rapid progress.

7. *Employment on occupation.*—The employment of suitable patients on various occupations such as gardening, weaving, tailoring, carpentry, broom and bidi making, ground levelling, sewing, knitting, compound cleaning, basket-making and poultry farm work, etc., continued as usual at all the Mental Hospitals of the former Bombay State and also at the Mental Hospital, Nagpur. There are no such facilities at the Mental Hospital, Akwada (Bhavnagar). The suitable patients were also employed at the Mental Hospital, Bhuj for ground levelling, compound cleaning and bringing the food for the patients, etc. No other facilities are available for employment of patients at this Hospital also. The daily average of patients employed under occupational therapy in the various Mental Hospitals during the year 1957 was 1,991 and the percentage of the same to the daily average works out to be about 36.9.

8. *Amusement.*—In-door and out-door games as carom, ping-pong, cards, Volley-ball, badminton, ring-tennis, etc. were provided for the patients. Some of the patients took part in sports and some of them enjoyed with interest. Cinema shows, Radio programmes and Gramophone records were also arranged for the entertainment of the patients and they were greatly appreciated by them. Books, Newspapers, Magazines, Periodicals were supplied to the literate patients. On important festival days sweets and special dishes were provided to the patients. No such facilities for amusement are available at the Mental Hospital, Akwada (Bhavnagar). At the Mental Hospital, Kutch, Bhuj also in-door and out-door games are provided to the patients. No other facilities are available at this Hospital for the amusement of the patients. A sum of Rs. 6,291 was spent on amusement and recreation of patients during the year 1957.

9. *Visitors.*—The official visitors at all the Mental Hospitals were regular in their attendance and nothing special was reported by any of them except at Mental Hospital, Ahmedabad where the visitors have often remarked the necessity for the new building for hospital. The Governor of Bombay Shri Prakasa gave an official visit to Central Mental Hospital, Yeravda on 3rd August 1957.

10. *Parole.*—The system of sending patients on parole has to some extent relieved the congestion at the Mental Hospitals. There is no system of sending the patients on parole at the Mental Hospitals at Akwada (Bhavnagar) and Kutch. During the year under report 798 patients (499 males and 299 females) took advantage of it as compared with 720 patients in previous year.

11. *Special Accommodation.*—The scheme for the provision of special accommodation and facilities to patients who were prepared to pay for such additional amenities introduced at the Central Mental Hospital, Yeravda, continued to be appreciated by the public. The special accommodation is also available only in the paying wards at the Mental Hospital, Nagpur for which the patient has to pay the scheduled charges of Rs. 60/- per month inclusive of diet.

12. *White House.*—White House, a bungalow about two miles away from the main Mental Hospital, Yeravda, is continued to be rented and has been utilised for ordinary patients.

13. *Appointment of a Psychiatric Social worker.*—During the year under report, Government sanctioned the creation of the post of Psychiatric Social worker at the Mental Hospital, Ratnagiri. Such posts already exist at the Central Mental Hospital, Yeravda, the Mental Hospitals, Thana, Ahmedabad and Baroda. There are no posts of Psychiatric Social Workers at the Mental Hospital, Nagpur, the Mental Hospital, Akwada (Bhavnagar) and the Mental Hospital, Kutch.

13A. *Nursing Service.*—Nursing service continued to be provided for the Infirmary section of the Hospitals.

Posts of Matron, Sister and 4 staff-nurses were sanctioned at the Thana Mental Hospital and an additional staff-nurse for Mental Hospital, Nagpur.

Two staff nurses who were deputed to the All India Institute of Mental Health, Bangalore have obtained the Diploma in Psychiatric Nursing are posted at Mental Hospital, Thana and Baroda.

14. *Acknowledgments.*—The Department expresses its thanks to all bodies and individuals who have extended their generosity towards providing additional comforts for patients in the various Mental Hospitals.

18. There were no cases of severe type of epidemic diseases in the Mental Hospitals during the year 1957. However, in the months of June and July 1957, the influenza was prevalent in epidemic type.

19. During the year 1957 the total number of deaths at the Mental Hospital at Thana and Ratnagiri was 157 as against 106 in 1956, at Yeravda 94 as against 71 in 1956, at Ahmedabad and Baroda, 51 as against 37 in 1956, at Nagpur, 29 as against nil for the period from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956 and at Bhavnagar and Kutch, 1 as against nil for the period from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956. The total percentage of deaths to the total daily average strength during the year 1957 was 6.1 as

against 2.2 in 1956. The following table shows the percentage of deaths to the daily average strength at each of the Mental Hospitals during the year 1957 and the previous year i.e. for the period from 1st January 1956 to 31st October 1956 and from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956 :—

The chief causes of deaths among the inmates of Mental Hospitals were Schizophrenia including Dementia Præcox 132, Mania Depressive Insanity 57, Mental Deficiency 30, Mania 28, Arterio-pathic and Senile psychosis 16, Malancholia 16 and Epilepsy 15.

The total number of criminal insanes confined in the Mental Hospitals at Thana and Ratnagiri during the year 1957 was 216 (114 males and 102 females) as against 140 (72 males and 68 females) in the previous year, at Yeravda 53 (42 males and 11 females) as against 56 (43 males and 13 females) in the previous year, at Ahmedabad and Baroda 71 (61 males and 10 females) as against 57 (48 males and 9 females) in the previous year and at Nagpur 134 (119 males and 15 females) as against 123 (109 males and 14 females) in the previous year (i.e. for the period from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956). The daily average strength at the Mental Hospitals at Thana and Ratnagiri during the year under report was 177 as against 161.5 in the previous year, at Yeravda 39.9 as against 84.8 in the previous year at Ahmedabad and Baroda, 43.7 as against 85.1 in the previous year and at Nagpur, 125 as against 121.8 in the previous year (i.e. from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956) of these all 33 were admitted under section 466 of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1 under section 471 and 12 under section 30(I) of the Prisoners Act, 1900.

REPORT ON CENTRAL MENTAL HOSPITAL, YERAVDA.

I have the honour to submit herewith the Annual Report of the Central Mental Hospital Yeravda, Poona 6, for the period from 1st January 1957 to 31st December 1957.

Shri I. K. Mujawar, M.B.B.S., B.M.S. Cl. I., continued to hold the post of Superintendent at the Central Mental Hospital, Yeravda, throughout the period, under report.

Accommodation.—On the 1st of November 1956 (i.e. from the date bilingual States came into being), here were 2,139 patients on the role against 2,156 patients on 1st January 1957.

The daily average number in residence during the period under report was 2252.10 against 2156.39 for the period from November 1956 to December 1956. The number in residence on the 31st December 1957 was 2,329.

The authorised total accommodation at the Central Mental Hospital Yeravda, is 1,297 patients only.

Due to abnormal increase in the hospital population, it was not possible to accommodate some of the patients comfortably. On an average there were 955.10 patients more than the sanctioned strength. However the construction of additional dormitories in the male section is under rapid progress and it is hoped that they may be handed over to us by the P.W.D. Department within a couple of month or so.

Admissions.—The total number of admissions during the period under report was 1,378, out of which 926 were males and 452 were females, as against the total of 1,010 (683 were males and 327 were females) for the period from 11th January 1956 to 31st October 1956 and 135 were males and 63 were females for the period from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956.

The total number of patients treated during the year under report was 3,534 as against the total of 2,337 for the period from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956.

Discharges.—The total number of discharges during the period under report was 1,111 out of which 742 were males and 369 were females. Out of the total number of 1,111 patients 233, were discharged as recovered and 888 patients as improved or otherwise under section 33-A of Indian Lunacy Act, 1912.

Deaths.—There were 94 deaths (61 males and 33 females), during the period under report. The rate of death worked out for the period from 1st December 1957 to 21st December 1957 on the basis of the average number of daily residence was 4.17 as against 3.4 for the year 1956 (2.38 for 10 months from 1st January 1956 to 31st October 1956 1.02/(3.40) for 2 months from 1st November 1956 to 31st December 1956.

Health of Patients.—The general health of patients was satisfactory. There was no severe type of epidemic during the period under report. However in the month of July 1957, the influenza was prevalent in epidemic type. About 500 patients suffered from this. Patients used to get fever head-ache and body-ache, but with medicines patients get relief within a period of 4 or 5 days.

The special therapies like Insulin Coma and Electric Convulsions, Leucotomies and Psychological treatments were given to the suitable patients and the number of patients treated with different therapies is as under:—

5. Recent drugs like Largactil and Serpasil were used in suitable cases.

6. Psychological treatment was given to suitable cases which included Narco anlysis and narco therapies and general psychotherapy.

A statement showing the number of recovery otherwise in the different therapies is enclosed.

Amusements.—There are recreational clubs in the Male and Female Sections for patients. patients gather to-gether in these Halls and read news papers, periodicals and Magazines. They listen to Radio programmes. There are facilities for playing Billiards, Table Tennis and other indoor games. Twice a week on Tuesday and Thursday, clubs are held in the evenings, patients have social gatherings where more than 100 patients at a time take part in the clubs. Besides indoor games, patients play outdoor games like Cricket, Volley-balls, etc. Some co-operative patients are sent for walks daily outside the Hospital.

On the important festivals of various communities sweets and special dishes were served to the patients.

The number of patients that took part in games is as under :—

1. Cinema shows were arranged in the Hospital itself and the total number of patients that attended the shows during the period under report is 16,065 Males and 2,310 Females.

2. About 4 percent of the patients took part in the games and listening to Radio programme.

3. Patients were sent out for drives in the Hospital Bus. The total number of patients that went out in the Bus drives during the period under report is 587 Males and 177 Females.

A total expenditure of Rs. 1,513.45 nP. was incurred on account of amusements from the discretionary grants placed at the disposal of this Hospital.

Visitors.—The attendances of visitors was satisfactory. The social workers and sick visiting committee also visited the Hospital.

Acknowledgement.—The Hospital is indebted to the management of the Bombay Chronicle, Daily and Sunday edition for the supply of copies of their issues to the reading room of the Hospital free of charge.

Acknowledgement is also due to Shri A. C. Patel and Shri P. S. Gazdar, well known Parsee gentlemen of Poona and Bombay respectively for organising Annual sports and arranging social gathering for the year under report. This gathering was arranged on Saturday the 19th January 1957, when Shri Naik, Sessions Judge, Poona, presided on that occasion.

The Governor of Bombay Shri Sri Prakasa, gave an Official Visit to this Hospital on 3rd August 1957.

White House.—White House a bungalow about 2 miles from the main hospital is continued to be rented and has been utilised for keeping suitable class and ordinary patients.

The Republic Day and World Health Organisation Day, etc. were observed by holding meetings of the staff and patients of this Hospital.

REPORT OF THE MENTAL HOSPITAL, NAGPUR FOR THE YEAR 1957.

1. *General*.—The year opened with 442 male patients and 150 female patients (total 592 patients) on the 1st January 1957. During the year, 197 new male patients and 59 new female patients. (Total new admissions 256) were admitted making the total of 639 male patients and 209 female patients (total 848). Out of these 213 patients were discharged and 29 died leaving a balance of 447 male patients and 159 female patients (total 606) on the 31st December 1957.

2. *Buildings*.—The work of the construction of the building of the Out-patient Department and Administrative Block has begun during this year and is nearing completion.

The work of installation of the Cooking ranges in the building of the new kitchen has also been undertaken and is nearing completion.

3. *Water supply*.—The present water supply of the hospital is very deficient. The work of effecting improvement in the water supply system of this hospital has commenced in this year is in progress.

4. *Accommodation*.—In this hospital accommodation is available for 458 male and 152 female patients (total 610 beds). This includes an accommodation for 24 male and 8 female patients in the paying wards but in practice extra accommodation is being made available in the paying wards for 12 male and 8 female patients. Thus in all 630 patients are accommodated. There have been a great demand for more accommodation for patients of both sexes, but overcrowding above the number of 630 patients was kept in check by detaining such patients temporarily in the special ward at the Central Jail, Nagpur.

The Deputy Superintendent, Mental Hospital, Nagpur visits this Jail once a week to examine and advise treatment for these patients.

Total number of patients admitted under observation during the year was 206 and that of criminal patients (new) was 11.

5. *Employment on Occupations*.—Suitable and patients who were physically fit, were employed in various occupations, viz. Agriculture and vegetable, Gardening, Dairy, Flower Gardening, Tailoring, Weaving and Niwar making, filling and repairing coir and cotton-mattresses, sewing, needle work, cleaning the grain, cutting vegetables and in other miscellaneous jobs viz., helping in the kitchen, carrying water and cleaning the yard etc. Full demand of Milk and most of that vegetables was met with from the produce of the hospital dairy and vegetable gardens.

6. *Amusements*.—There is a reading room for the use of patients and daily newspapers are provided therein. Besides, there is a small collection of books and magazines for the patients to read. A Radio set with an amplifier, Table and Harmonium are also available for the amusement of the patients. Indoor and out-door games such as carrum, volly ball and badminton were also played by the patients.

7. *Visitors*.—The Official and non-official visitors attended the monthly meeting during the year.

8. *Parole*.—The system of releasing patients on parole continued and was made use of by the relatives of the patients; 46 male and 15 female patients (total 61) were released on parole during the year under report.

9. *Special Accommodation*.—This was provided in the paying ward of this hospital for which the charges are Rs. 60 per month, inclusive of diet.

10. *Discharges*.—The total number of patients discharged during the year under report was 168 males and 45 females (total 213). They were as below:—

11. *Sickness and Mortality*.—The General health of the patients during the year was good. Usual preventive measures for the communicable diseases were taken. Preventive inoculations for cholera and typhoid were given to most of the patients. Three patients suffered from milk type of Influenza in the months of June and July with the incidence of the same in epidemic form in the Town; but there have not been any fatalities. There were 29 deaths during this year. The main causes of death were as below:—

1. Eighteen patients die of general debility and anaemia.
2. Epilepsy, Pulmonary Tuberculosis, Diarrhoea, etc., were the causes of death in other patients.

Whenever necessary, patients were referred to the T. B. Clinic, Nagpur and X-Ray Department of the Mayo Hospital, Nagpur for diagnosis and advice regarding treatment. The laboratory with a Pathologist attached to it has been great help in the treatment of the patients, as routine pathological investigations could be done in every case admitted. There has been no trained Pathologist available since 16th November 1957 F.N., Kahn tests done during the year number 316.

The Daily average of sick treated at this hospital during the year under report was 69.79.

13. *Dental Treatment.*—The part time Hon. Dental Surgeon Shri K. Y. Mangrulkar was appointed and resumed his duties on 13th August 1957. He attended the Dental Clinic regularly twice a week and treated 246 patients (153 Male and 93 Female).

14. *Finance.*—The total amount spent for the upkeep of the hospital was Rs. 42,856. The average cost per patient was Rs. 60.40 nP. per month inclusive of diet, clothing and bedding, care and control and treatment.

15. *Second Five Year Plan.*—As already mentioned above the building of out-patient Department and Administrative Block under the plan is nearing completion.

The Electro Encephalograph Equipment has been received and installed on 25th November 1957. It has been purchased at the cost of Rs. 30,750.

16. *Administration.*—Dr. G. D. Pimpalkar, M.B.B.S. (Bombay) was incharge of the hospital during the year and Dr. Ramsingh was Deputy Superintendent.
