

SURREY COUNTY MENTAL HOSPITALS.

Annual Report of the Visiting Committee

(Pursuant to the Lunacy Act, 1890, Sec. 190).

Presented to the County Council at their meeting held on the 8th day of November, 1927.

To the County Council of Surrey.

The Visiting Committee submit their Report for the year ended 31st December, 1926, together with the audited accounts to the 31st March, 1927.

At the meeting on the 16th March, Col. the Hon. A. G. Brodrick, A.D.C., was re-elected Chairman of the Committee, and Mr. E. A. Medus was re-elected Vice-Chairman.

Seven meetings of the Committee and 57 meetings of the Standing Sub-Committees were held during the year. In addition meetings of special Sub-Committees were held, and frequent inspections of the buildings and grounds of the two Mental Hospitals were carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Statute.

The normal accommodation in the two Hospitals is as follows:—

Brookwood. Netherne. Total.

1,393 Beds. 1,000 Beds. 2,393 Beds.

On the 1st January, 1927, there were 24 patients adjudged chargeable to out-County Unions, 98 Private Patients, 92 Service Patients, and 66 Patients received from other Mental Hospitals under contract. The total number of patients in the two Mental Hospitals was 2,330, leaving a margin of 63 vacant beds.

The Farm and Garden Accounts show a profit, excluding value of patient labour, of £2,262 19s. 9½d. at Brookwood and £308 12s. 7d. at Netherne.

Commissioners of the Board of Control have visited both Mental Hospitals during the year, and their reports will be found on pages 19 and 28 respectively.

Members from the various Boards of Guardians have also paid visits, and have recorded in the visiting book their appreciation of the treatment of the patients.

A new house for the Clerk and Steward at Brookwood has been built during the year, and twelve additional cottages for occupation by married members of the staff are now in course of erection at that Hospital. Twelve additional cottages have also been provided at Netherne.

With a view to increasing the milk supply at Brookwood the cow-house accommodation has been enlarged so as to permit of an increase in the dairy herd.

Great success has attended the establishment during the year at both Mental Hospitals of canteens where working patients can obtain extras in exchange for tokens issued to them according to the value of the work they carry out. These canteens are stocked with a much greater variety of articles than were formerly issued, and the patients are able to exercise their choice in the matter.

Dr. E. Doherty resigned the post of 2nd Assistant Medical Officer at Brookwood in order to take up the post of Deputy Medical Superintendent at York City Mental Hospital. The Brookwood Standing Sub-Committee promoted Dr. W. A. Russell to the vacant post, and Dr. Russell's former position as 3rd Assistant Medical Officer was filled by the appointment of Dr. Leonard Barber from the Sunderland Asylum.

New scales of salary have been adopted for the 2nd and 3rd Assistant Medical Officers, so far as future appointments are concerned, and all Assistant Medical Officers who hold the Diploma of Psychological Medicine will be paid £50 per annum in addition to their salary. Regulations have also been made governing the terms upon which the engagements of members of the medical staffs at the two Mental Hospitals may be determined by notice.

It is with regret that your Committee report the death of Miss M. A. Tomkins which occurred as the result of a motor accident while on holiday in June, 1926. Miss Tomkins had held the post of Matron at Brookwood since the 1st April, 1923, and had proved herself to be a loyal and capable officer. The vacancy was filled by the promotion of Miss D. L. Finnemore from the post of Assistant Matron.

All members of the staff residing outside the Hospital Buildings at Brookwood and Netherne are now given the option of being admitted to the Institution for treatment by the medical staff free of cost in cases of sickness. This concession is not granted to wives or families of members of the staff.

The Minister of Health has granted to your Committee a Certificate excepting from insurance for old age pensions, under the provisions of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act, 1925, those employees at the two Mental Hospitals who are at present excepted from the payment of National Health Insurance contributions.

The rate charged to the various Boards of Guardians for the maintenance of ordinary patients was 22s. 9d. per head per week for the whole of the year under review. At the date of this report the figure stands at 21s. 7d., two reductions of 7d-each having since been made.

I have to report that the audit of your accounts for the year ended at the 31st March, 1927, has been completed.

It is suggested that a balance of £10,000 would usually be adequate.

NETHERNE.

Your Chairman and a member of the Committee attended the audit and discussed the possibility of keeping on a more accurate trading basis the accounts relating to the Farm and Garden. There are difficulties, of which the chief is the impossibility of making an accurate valuation of patients' labour. I have, however, left with the Clerk and Steward a simple exemplification which, if followed, will meet the principal points raised.

The practice with regard to the Bakehouse account has been to invoice the bread produced at the actual cost of production. To bring this account into parallelism with the Farm and Garden account the bread should be invoiced at market price, and the resultant profit shown.

Two officers (Mr. Marshall and Mr. Harrow) concerned in paying wages are not covered by any guarantee.

The stocktaking appears to have been somewhat defective. Thirty-six yards of ladder tapes, valued at 13s. 6d., were omitted from the balance-sheet, and nine gross of buttons, valued at £1 2s. 6d., were entered as 295 buttons, valued at 5s. 1d. Some minor defects in the ledger were pointed out to the Clerk and Steward.

APPENDIX II.

To the Visiting Committee of the Surrey County Mental Hospital, Brookwood.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have the honour to submit the 60th Annual Report of the Medical Superintendent, together with the Statistical Tables for the year 1926.

The numerical changes amongst the patients were as follows:-

These numbers show a decrease of 4 men and 8 women, the latter being accounted for by the termination of our contract with Middlesex and the transfer of these cases (24 females) to Napsbury.

There were actually 21 more admissions than in 1925, the total number of cases treated being 1,624 and the average number resident 1,336.

The recovery rate was 25.28 per cent. calculated on the Direct Admissions, while 51 patients were sufficiently well to allow of their being discharged to the care of their friends.

The general health of the patients was good, there being no serious epidemics of any kind; the death rate was 7.56 per cent.; details of the deaths are shown in Table 5.

Inquests were held in six cases, a verdict of death from natural causes being returned in five instances, while in the sixth a verdict of death by misadventure from shock following an operation for Cholecystotomy was returned.

Four serious accidents involving fractures of bones were recorded, three being due to accidental falls, but in the fourth a male patient climbed to the top of a fire escape staircase and jumped to the ground, a distance of 24 feet, sustaining a severe fracture of the leg and injuries to the face and head. Attendant C. Matthews, at great personal risk, attempted to catch the patient as he fell, and succeeded in partially breaking the force of the impact, otherwise a more serious result might have ensued.

Two patients suffering from G.P.I. were treated by Induced Malaria at Hellingly in 1925; one has been discharged as recovered and is carrying on his usual occupation, the other is making slow but steady improvement and it is hoped he may ultimately be also fit for discharge.

Mr. Higgins, our Consulting Surgeon, performed seven major operations and also paid us many visits during the year.

Three patients made their escape, but were brought back to the Hospital after short periods of absence.

A Commissioner of the Board of Control visited the Hospital on November 4th and 5th. His report is appended.

The Headquarters Inspector of the Ministry of Pensions visited the Service patients on February 7th.

Deputations from the following Boards of Guardians also visited the Hospital: Chertsey, Epsom, Fulham, Hambledon, Kingston.

The Hospital buildings have been maintained in good repair and many improvements have been effected.

Lavatory basins with hot and cold water have been provided in two more dormitories.

Hot Plates have been installed in the large Dining Room.

The Hair-carding machine has been improved, preventing the circulation of dust in the Upholsterer's Shop.

An Incinerator has been erected.

The Cowshed has been completely remodelled and additional accommodation provided.

Important work in hand includes the building of a new house for the Clerk and Steward.

Several staff changes took place, Dr. Doherty left, Dr. Russell was promoted, and Dr. Barber appointed to fill the vacancy.

I deeply regret to record the death of our Matron, Miss M. A. Tomkins, as the result of a motor accident. I cannot express the sense of loss which we all experienced when we heard of the tragedy. She had been with us for over five years and had endeared herself to everyone by her kindliness and consideration; she was unceasing

in her efforts to increase the efficiency of the Hospital, and we all feel that we have sustained a loss which cannot be repaired.

I also deeply regret to report the death of Richard Daborn, Foreman Carpenter. He had been in your service for 24 years and was a most faithful and conscientious servant. With the consent of the Minister of Health you made a grant of £50 to his mother.

Miss D. L. Finnemore, the Assistant Matron, was promoted; and Miss Webb, of Bexley Mental Hospital, was appointed Assistant Matron.

The conduct of the Staff has been satisfactory, and I am glad to acknowledge their very willing assistance.

Lectures have been given by the Medical Staff and by the Sister-Tutor, eighteen nurses and attendants passing the Preliminary Examination and fourteen the Final Examination for the Nursing Certificate of the Royal Medico-Psychological Association.

Fireman Attendant Charles Watson was pensioned after 36 years' service.

All the officers and heads of Departments have given of their best in the administration of the Hospital: in particular, I should mention Dr. McCord and Mr. Ekins, who have been of great assistance to me.

In conclusion, I beg to thank the Visiting Committee for their advice, help and consideration.

CHAPLAIN'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1926.

During the past year I have had the assistance of my Colleagues, the Rev. P. C. Beeston, L.Th., and the Rev. O. A. Betts, in carrying out the duties of the Chaplaincy, as well as the occasional help of the Rev. W. F. T. Hamilton, M.A., at Festival Seasons such as Christmas, Easter, Whitsuntide. The regular Services in the Hospital Church have been maintained: i.e., on every Sunday morning at 9.30 a.m. Morning Prayer and short Sermon, except on the first Sunday in the month, when there has been a full choral Ante-Communion and Communion Service instead, at which an average of some 60 patients and attendants have remained after the termination of the first part of the Service. Every alternate Sunday afternoon there has been a Service of Evensong with short Sermon at 3.15 p.m., which has been well attended by the patients able to do so, whilst on the 1st and 3rd Sundays in the month, in lieu of such Service in the Church, there have been Ward Services of about 20 minutes' duration held in M.11, F.9 and F.10 E. These have been fairly well attended and appreciated by the patients. On Festivals there has been, in addition to the usual Services, an early Service of the Holy Communion at 8 a.m. for members of the Staff.

My Colleagues have taken turns with me in the conduct of short Prayers in the Recreation Hall each morning of the week at 8.15, Monday only excepted.

The Wards, Infirmaries, Recreation Rooms and Galleries have been visited regularly week by week, usually on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons, as have also the Workshops and Workrooms.

I would like to place on record once again my appreciation of the very valuable co-operation in the Services of the Church of Mr. Jones as the Organist and Choirmaster, of which I cannot speak too highly, and also of the services of those Attendants (averaging 3 male and 5 female) who have sung in the Choir. May I say, in this connection, how helpful it would be if this number could be increased, and particularly if it could be conveniently arranged for the members of the Choir to attend the half-hour choir practice which Mr. Jones conducts in the Church on Fridays at 4 p.m.

It has been possible, through the kindness of friends in my Parish, to distribute many Illustrated Magazines in the different Recreation Rooms of the Wards week by week, which the patients appear to have appreciated. In conclusion, I would like to express the appreciation of myself and my Colleagues of the unfailing courtesy we have invariably met with from all the members of the Hospital Staff, which is a great encouragement to us in the endeavour to carry out our ministrations to the afflicted inmates. I am also grateful to the Visiting Committee for so readily acceding to my requests from time to time for new hymn-books or prayer-books, and for the encouragement they are good enough to give to the Church Choir of the Hospital in the form of the Annual Summer Outing.

During the year I conducted the usual Services for the R.C. patients. The attendances were not as great as I could have wished. The reason, in part, is that some come for a time in the hope that a word from me to the Medical Superintendent will secure their release, but finding that such is not the case they refuse to come any more to the Services.

During the year 7 men were admitted and 5 discharged, 10 women were admitted, 6 left and 1 died.

I paid three special calls to the hospital to see patients reported dangerously ill. I am grateful to the Medical Superintendent for sending me notice of sickness at the same time that the relatives are notified.

APPENDIX III.

SURREY COUNTY MENTAL HOSPITAL, BROOKWOOD,

November 5th, 1926.

I have this morning completed my visit to this Institution which I commenced yesterday, and am glad to report that it continues to be very well maintained and conducted under Dr. Lowry's administration.

Since my late colleague's visit 11 months ago the following numerical changes among the patients have taken place:—

There are now on the statutory books the names of 1,341 patients, in the proportion of 526 men to 815 women. Two of the former sex and three of the latter are out on trial, and the remainder of the patients, who are in residence, have to the best of my belief been seen by me during the course of my visit to the wards, gardens, shops and domestic departments.

The only private patients are 38 men of the "Service" and "Ex-Service" classes, who are distributed throughout the wards on the male side according to their mental state and conduct.

Out-County patients number 2 males and 28 females, 24 of the latter being received under a contract from West Ham Borough. Notice has been given to terminate this contract at the end of the year. That with the Napsbury Mental Hospital Committee has already been determined.

The total accommodation in the Hospital is for 560 male and 833 female patients, so on this calculation there are vacancies for 34 males and only 18 females at present.

The question of the erection of an admission hospital is, I understand, being considered by a special Sub-Committee. As pointed out by my colleague last year the question of future needs is urgent.

The weekly maintenance charge per head for the Home patients is 22s. 9d., whilst the average maintenance cost as last ascertained was 20s. 9.74d.

I found the patients of both sexes quiet and well behaved, and free from any complaints except on the score of detention; the appeals for discharge were not unduly numerous, and in no case did the patient appear to be yet fitted for it.

Their personal appearance and dress were satisfactory, and I was glad to see several of the women wearing their own articles of dress. The state of the men's clothing would, I think, be improved if a steam press were installed to deal with their outer garments, especially those that have to be washed.

The general health of the patients is good, and of the 38 men and 79 women whom I found confined to bed, there were few cases of acute illness, and among them were several cases of very old people.

The only case of epidemic or zymotic disease was one of dysentery in December last year, and it is satisfactory to find that there has been no other case. Eight men and 6 women are now suffering from tuberculosis, and they are undergoing treatment in the open air as much as possible and are segregated from the other patients.

The mortality rate for last year was low, namely, 5.52 per cent. (7.45 for males and 4.31 for females), that for all mental hospitals being 7.5 per cent. (8.3 for males and 6.9 for females).

With one exception all the 88 deaths in the period under review were from natural causes. In this case death was due to cardiac failure following shock resulting from a necessary operation. An inquest was held in this case, and in three other instances, where death was found to be due to natural causes.

The chief causes of death were senile decay in 27 cases, pneumonia in 11, heart disease in 8, general paralysis and cerebral hæmorrhage in 7 each.

Nine serious but non-fatal casualties have been recorded, all involving fractures of bones, but none calls for special mention.

I saw the dinners being partaken of in Female Block 10. It was a substantial meal and appeared to be appreciated by the patients.

The kitchen in the main building is now staffed by men, under the supervision of the Head Baker, with a trained ex-Army cook as assistant; that in F Block is staffed by women. A canteen has already been started on the female side, where the working patients, who receive vouchers from 1s. 6d. to 6d. weekly as a reward for their work, can exchange them for goods.

The fabric of the institution is generally very well maintained, some redecoration of the wards having been carried out and some being now in progress in F Block 10, as well as outside painting there.

Since the last visit the Nurses' Home Extension has been completed, as well as eight additional cottages for the staff.

The central heating of the wards was brought into use in January last, but owing to the coal strike it has not been found possible to start it again this autumn; I found, however, open fires and some Esse stoves alight in many wards, and all the places where the patients were sitting comfortable and at a proper temperature. There was a very fine display of chrysanthemums throughout the wards.

For those in bed in single rooms, whilst the central heating is not on, I think there should be a larger supply of hot water bottles.

The new sanitary spur has been brought into use in F Block 10, as well as the additional lavatory basins, fitted with hot and cold water supplies, in the dormitories there.

I noticed that there were no letter boxes in the day-rooms of the wards where the patients can post their own letters. This is now general in most institutions of this kind.

The suggestion by my Board to have the areas of the day-rooms and dormitories indicated by a label, which may be of quite an inexpensive kind, attached to the walls, has not been adopted, although I was informed that the information is recorded in a book.

I understand that extracts from my Board's Annual Reports for the past two years dealing with the provision of laboratories, X-ray installations, treatment by ultra-violet radiation, and provision of clinical rooms have been circulated among the members of the Visiting Committee, and I hope they will see their way to adopt the Board's suggestions.

No women nurses are employed on the male side.

Twenty-five of the male and 19 of the women nurses are certificated or registered as mental nurses, whilst 17 other men and 25 other women have passed the preliminary examination.

There appears to be an adequate number of nurses on the male side, but the number of female nurses is low.

Dr. Lowry has the assistance of Dr. McCord, Dr. Wilfred Russell (on a temporary footing) and of Dr. L. Barber as Medical Officers. This proportion of Assistant Medical Officers, namely one to 445, loes not appear to be sufficient, and I hope the Committee will consider the appointment of an additional Medical Officer.

The Admissions.—There were 326 admissions during the year, and of these 232 (131 men and 101 women) were direct admissions. The chief ascertained ætiological factors were: Prolonged stress 24:13 per cent., Senility 17:24 per cent., Climacteric 10:77 per cent., and Insane Heredity 6:03 per cent. Included in the male admissions were 57 ex-soldiers from the Ministry of Pensions Hospital, Ewell.

The Discharges.—During the year 229 patients were discharged, of whom 45 were discharged "Recovered," 76 "Relieved," 107 "Not

Improved," and 1 "Not Insane." The recovery rate on the direct admissions was 19.8 per cent. The low recovery rate may be attributed partly to the unfavourable type of patient admitted and partly to the increasing number of applications for discharge.

The Deaths.—There were 66 deaths during the year. The chief causes of death were Senility 18·18 per cent., Cerebral Hæmorrhage 9·09 per cent., and Pulmonary Tuberculosis 7·57 per cent. There was no death from Dysentery. The death rate on the average number resident was 6·68 per cent. Autopsies were carried out in 54·5 per cent. of the deaths. One inquest was held during the year, in the case of a female patient who died from Broncho-Pneumonia following a fracture of the left femur.

Escapes and Accidents. — Eight male and two female patients escaped during the year. One man remained at large after the statutory period and was automatically discharged. The others, except one man who returned voluntarily, were captured after varying lengths of time.

One male and six female patients sustained fractures of bones due to accidental falls. One female patient dislocated her left wrist. The circumstances attending these casualties were fully reported to you at the time of their occurrence.

Visits.—Col. B. T. Hodgson and Dr. C. H. Bond, Commissioners of the Board of Control, visited the Hospital on November 9th and 10th. Their report is appended. Dr. E. L. Forward, Headquarters Inspector, Ministry of Pensions, visited the ex-Service men on September 28th. Deputations from the Brighton, Croydon, Dartford, Dorking, Epsom, Islington, Kingston and Reigate Guardians visited their respective patients during the year.

Staff.—I regret to record the death of Attendant George Holohan from Bronchitis during the year. He had been a valued member of the Staff for over nine years. Twelve nurses and four attendants obtained the Nursing Certificate of the Royal Medico-Psychological Association. Nurse Alice Kelley was seconded for three years in order that she might undergo General Training at the Royal Hospital, Sheffield.

Works Department.—List of works during year ended 31st December, 1926:—

Verandahs filled in with matchboard to rail height. Power machinery installed at Woodplace Farm. Cow shed roof tiled with Asbestos tiles. Pig Shelter erected in field by Farmhouse.

Partition erected in Dairy at Woodplace Farm.

Alterations to house to be occupied by Assistant Medical Officer.

Erection of new cottages for staff.

Erection of Stores and Garage commenced.

Horse-drawn mower converted to motor-driven machine.

Poles fixed and overhead cables fitted to supply electric light to Woodplace Farm buildings.

Internal and external painting of Hospital buildings and cottages has received attention.

The plant is in good order and has received careful attention.

General.—The Annual Fête was held on June 25th and was a complete success. Two outings to Worthing and one to Brighton were thoroughly enjoyed. W.A.W., a male patient suffering from General Paralysis, was sent under Contract to Cane Hill Mental Hospital for treatment by induced Malaria. Our Consulting Physician and Consulting Surgeon attended when required, and the latter performed several major operations on the patients and Staff. The conduct of the Staff was good, and I am indebted to them for their loyal and willing help.

In conclusion, I desire to thank my medical colleagues, Mr. Baker and the other Officers, for their constant and ungrudging co-operation, and to express to the Visiting Committee my sincere appreciation of their unvarying kindness, confidence and support.

CHAPLAIN'S REPORT FOR 1926.

NETHERNE MENTAL HOSPITAL, Coulsdon, Surrey.

GENTLEMEN,

In submitting to you my Annual Report I desire to state that the daily Services at 8.30 a.m. have been regularly maintained, as also the two full Services on each Sunday at 10.30 and 4, while an afternoon Sunday School is held during winter months for the children of Netherne Village. The attendances at the Services are fair. One would welcome a larger proportion if it were possible: those who do come seem to very heartily enjoy the Services.

The Celebrations of the Holy Communion for Patients and Staff take place on alternate Sundays of each month, and further opportunities are afforded during the great Festivals.

The work of visiting the patients in the wards and airing courts is undertaken systematically, every effort being made to restore, renew and strengthen confidence. I am much encouraged by the evident appreciation.

Short Services are frequently held in the Hospital, and celebrations of the Holy Communion for the sick and the aged who are unable to attend the Chapel.

There have been 14 patients (8 males and 6 females) laid to rest in the Cemetery: all of these were members of the Church of England.

The Choir continues to be a very real help to our Sunday Services, and the patients often express the help and pleasure they derive from the singing; the boys are very grateful for the kind interest the Committee take in them. Again they much enjoyed the excursion to the Zoological Gardens.

We have forwarded the sum of £7 8s. 11d. from the Chapel Offertories to the Mental After-Care Association, who are most thankful for the donation.

The Library during the year has received a gift of some 300 novels, etc., from the British Red Cross Society, which is a most useful and acceptable gift.

My thanks are again due to all the members of the Staff for their kind assistance during the past year.

APPENDIX V.

SURREY MENTAL HOSPITAL, NETHERNE,

10th November, 1926.

We have to-day finished our visit to this Institution which we commenced yesterday, and generally are well satisfied with the state in which we have found it and the care and attention which are being bestowed on the patients.

Since our colleagues' visit nearly 12 months ago, the following numerical changes have taken place among the patients:—

Of the above number of males admitted and discharged are included 62 patients who were transferred to the "Service class" from the rate-aided class. There are now on the statutory books the names of 998 patients in the proportion of 394 males to 604 females; of these 113 men and 59 women are classified as private patients, 76 of the former being of the "Service" and "ex-Service" classes. Out-County patients number 15 males and 46 females, 32 of the latter being received under a contract with the Napsbury Committee, notice to determine which has been given, and 9 are children received under contract from the Borough of Brighton. The remaining out-county patients are chargeable to some 16 various Unions.

The total accommodation in the Hospital is 382 males and 570 females. As 19 boys are warded on the female side, there is an excess of 51 patients in this division, whilst there are 7 vacancies on the male side.

Two female patients are away on trial and one woman on special leave, leaving 394 males and 601 females in residence. During the

year 1925 the average number of patients resident was 388 males and 577 females.

The weekly maintenance rate for the Home patients is at present 22s. 9d., the actual maintenance cost being practically the same, namely, 22s. 9.072d. The charge for private patients is from 35s. to 47s. 3d.

To the best of our belief we have seen all the patients in residence, and given them an opportunity of speaking with us and airing any of their grievances, but, apart from the question of their detention, we received no complaints, and we found the patients of both sexes quiet and orderly in their behaviour and contented with their surroundings.

Their dress and personal appearance was satisfactory, and we were glad to see a good variety of style and colour amongst the women's dresses and that several were allowed to wear their own garments. We think that the appearance of the men's outer clothing, especially that which has to be washed, would be improved if a steam clothes press were installed.

Parole is given within the estate to 33 of the men and 7 of the women, whilst 50 other men and 10 other women have partial parole. Both the male and female villas are administered upon the open door principle, as well as the infirm wards in each division.

The dietary appears to be good and sufficient and free from monotony. We yesterday saw a good dinner, consisting of meat pie, potatoes and cabbage, followed by boiled rice and jam, being partaken of in some of the wards. It was well served, and appreciated by the patients. The kitchen is now well equipped and the only item which appeared to be lacking is a fish-fryer.

In the Bakehouse we noticed that the dough mixer can be worked whilst the lid is open, an operation which may be dangerous.

The fabric of the Institution is well maintained and some repainting has taken place, and same is now, both inside and out, in progress.

We found the dayrooms and galleries comfortable and at a good temperature, the central heating being on. The dormitories and single-rooms were clean and well kept, the bedding being very neatly arranged on the beds and in a good state of cleanliness and repair. Generally the day-rooms were very well supplied with plants and flowers, especially on the female side, but there was almost an entire absence of any in Male Ward 7 and in a dayroom in the Male Admission Hospital.

We agree with our colleagues' remarks in the last entry as to the scarcity of books, papers and bound periodicals in the wards. For example, in Male Wards 2 and 4, where there were 19 and 36 patients respectively, there were only 12 books in each. In the Male Villa, where there were 27 patients, there were only 8 books, and in Female Ward 3 6 books to 29 patients, and in Female Ward 12 4 books for 35 patients.

There appeared to be also some shortage of pianos on the male side; for instance, in Male Ward 8, where some 60 working patients live, there was no piano.

Wireless receiving sets have been installed in one ward on each side, the Male Villa and Female Ward 4.

The patients are generally well classified in the wards, but this classification somewhat breaks down in the ward-gardens, where the patients from several wards are mixed.

It seemed to us that these ward-gardens should have planted in them some flowering shrubs, as they appeared bare as compared with the beauty of the grounds outside, and it seems a pity not to plant up by the dividing railings between the gardens so that the patients in one garden cannot see those in the next.

Alterations and improvements which have been completed during this year include the erection of two verandahs at the Admission Hospital, the extension of the Nurses' Block, the erection of a Cricket Pavilion on the recreation ground, and of 12 cottages for the Staff. In hand is the erection of 12 additional cottages for the Staff.

Among the deaths was the case of a woman who had sustained a fractured leg by a push from a fellow patient; it was the subject of an inquest. Other casualties at all serious in nature have been six cases of fracture and three of dislocation; two of these were caused by being pushed down by another patient, the rest being the result of simple accidental falls.

With the exception of the above-mentioned death, all the 39 male and 33 female deaths were from natural causes. In only 44 per cent.

were these verified by post-mortem examination; we hope that serious and persistent effort will be made to increase this proportion. We noticed with regret that the notes made at autopsies seldom record the condition of the intestinal tract, an important matter in connection with dysentery.

Exclusive of some seven more or less crippled cases in cots at North Villa (for idiot children) we found 25 male and 71 female patients in bed, or just under 10 per cent. of the total in residence. Sixteen of these patients were in beds on verandahs which can accommodate about 42 beds. They all appeared to be being nursed with skill and care. We were glad to be informed that a further provision of bed tables, of which there is clearly a shortage, is about to be made. Both a good dental room and operating room exist here, and with the aid of a visiting surgeon attached to the resident medical staff it was satisfactory to find that the surgical needs of the patients receive thorough attention. In the absence of arrangements for the treatment of general paralysis by induced malaria, the Committee are wisely willing to arrange to send such cases to a neighbouring mental hospital where this method is in use; we saw a man (W. G.) who seemed to us an eminently favourable case for this treatment.

Tuberculosis, a close watch upon which our Board regard as very important, seems to show a satisfactorily small incidence. So far as known there are five cases, all but one of which are on the female side; and in support of the accuracy of this estimate is the comparatively small number of deaths (one male and five females) from this disease and the fact that two of the five women were recent admissions already suffering from it.

Apart from this incidence, there has been a complete freedom from infective disorders with the exception of two cases which, out of seven cases of diarrhea, were regarded as dysentery.

The death rate during 1925 was 7.7 per cent., 10.8 and 5.7 being the percentages respectively on the male and female sides.

There is still no laboratory here, but there is a room admirably suited for the purpose and, indeed, already partly fitted up, and we are particularly glad to know that this important provision is under sympathetic consideration. We noticed, too, with satisfaction that clinical rooms have been arranged at the Admission Hospital and the Infirmaries; we hope that this provision will be extended ultimately

to all the wards. The standard of note-taking reflects credit on the Medical Staff, but we are sure that this duty would be rendered much more interesting were the clinical records, one for each patient, kept in the wards.

Of the male nurses just under 50 per cent., and 27 per cent. of the women, are certificated in mental nursing; one member of the female staff is away completing her training at a General Hospital.

Dr. Coombes is manifestly actuated by a desire to maintain a spirit of progress here. As medical colleagues he has to assist him Dr. L. M. Webber, Dr. J. H. Ewen and Dr. T. Paton. Though we understand that the matter is not one of present urgency, we notice that, while a good provision of detached houses for the male staff is made here, there is none for the Deputy Superintendent.


