cement or otherwise fixed.

Improvements in the Treatment of Corns, Bunions, Blisters, and
the like.

JULIUS GOODMAN 39 Ravenhurst Road Harborne Staffordshire Commercial Traveller do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement :—

I make an India-Rubber Air-Proof cushion filled with air. This cushion A is of such a shape that it will fit or be round the hard or soft place and keep the boot or clothing off such place. This Cushion will be fixed to the skin by a medicated cement or otherwise fixed, as by a band or tape B waterproofed or covered on both sides with unvulcanized India-Rubber. **5**

Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of my said Invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, I declare that what I claim is **10**

1st. The Hollow India-Rubber Air-Cushion A which relieves the pressure of the boot & yet is soft to the foot and a perfect spring.

2nd. The fixing by India Rubber Solution by itself or spread on a tape or band B **15**

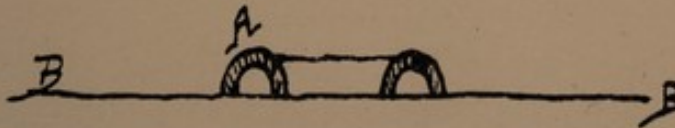
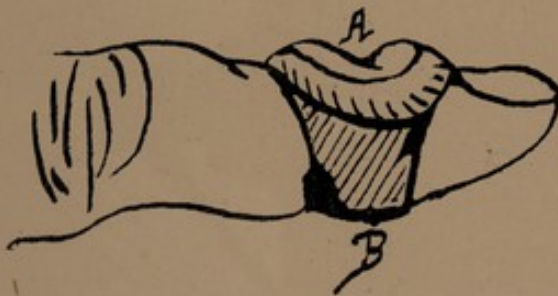
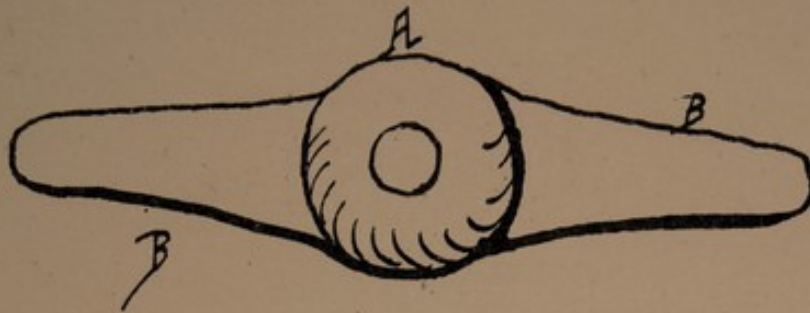
