I JOHN WALLACE of 34 Highfield Road, Rathgar, in the County of Dublin Ireland, Barrister at Law do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement:—

Dose for influenza, x, xv, or xx drops three times a day in a dessertspoonful of water, before a meal.

15 The same treatment should be followed for bronchitis, and for coughs.

A single dose (which need not be repeated) will be found an invaluable remedy for an attack of indigestion, or for ailments of the liver or kidneys, or low fever.

20 Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of my said invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed, I declare that what I claim is:—

- (1) The combination of ingredients, &
- (2) The proportions of same, are novel and remarkable in their curative effect.
