STAFFORD'S SPECIFICATION.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, greeting.

WHEREAS His most Excellent Majesty King William the Fourth, by His Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing date at Westminster, the Second day of November, in the fourth year of His reign, 5 did give and grant unto me, DOMINICK STAFFORD, of Duke Street, Adelphi, in the County of Middlesex, and late of Paris, and unto my eñors, adñors, and assigns, and such others as I, the said Dominick Stafford, my eñors, adñors, and assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times during the term of years therein expressed, 10 should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, within England, Wales, and the Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, my Invention for "**AN IMPROVED METHOD OF MAKING FUEL**;" in which said Letters Patent is contained a proviso obliging me, the said Dominick Stafford, by an instrument in writing under my hand and seal, particularly to describe and ascertain the 15 nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed, and to cause the same to be enrolled in His said Majesty's High Court of Chancery within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said in part recited Letters Patent, reference being thereunto had, may more fully and at large appear.

20 **NOW KNOW YE**, that in compliance with the said proviso, I, the said Dominick Stafford, do hereby declare that the nature of my said Invention, and the manner in which the same is to be performed, and particularly described and ascertained in and by the following description hereof (that is to say):—

Stafford's Improved Method of Making Fuel.

My Invention consists in mixing sea coal with brick earth, blue clay, river sand, or deposits of running or stagnant waters, the proportion of coal to be equal to that of either of the other materials, or to be greater or lesser in proportion as the fuel may be required to burn with the greater or lesser rapidity. The foregoing materials to be mixed together like mortar, with an admixture of tar or tar diluted with water, in sufficient quantities to give the materials in question that degree of consistency that will admit of its formation into cakes or balls, of such size and shape as may be considered most convenient for use, such cakes or balls to be afterwards dried, either by exposure to the open air or by artificial heat. 10

In witness whereof, I, the said Dominick Stafford, have hereunto set my hand and seal, this Twenty-eighth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.
