JOHNSON'S SPECIFICATION.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, JOHN JOHNSON, of Tildsley Banks, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, Clerk, send greeting.

WHEREAS His present most Excellent Majesty King George the Third, 5 by His Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing date at Westminster, the Third day of May, in the thirty-sixth year of His reign, did give and grant unto me, the said John Johnson, my executors, administrators, and assigns, His especial licence, full power, sole privilege and authority, that I, the said John Johnson, my executors, administrators, and assigns, by 10 myself and themselves, or by my or their deputy or deputies, servants, or agents, or such others as I, the said John Johnson, my executors, administrators, or assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times thereafter during the term of years therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, my new invented 15 "METHOD OR PLAN FOR PREVENTING AND CURING SMOKING CHIMNIES," within that part of His Majesty's Kingdom of Great Britain called England, His Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, in such manner as to me, the said John Johnson, my executors, administrators, and assigns, or any of us, should in our discretion seem meet; in which said Letters Patent is contained 20 a proviso, that if I, the said John Johnson, should not particularly describe and ascertain the nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed, by an instrument in writing under my hand and seal, and cause the same to be inrolled in His Majesty's High Court of Chancery within one calendar month next and immediately after the date of the said 25 Letters Patent, that then the said Letters Patent, and all liberties and advan-

tages whatsoever thereby granted should utterly cease, determine, and become void, anything therein-before contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding, as in and by the said Letters Patent, relation being thereunto had, may more fully and at large appear.

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said John Johnson, in pursuance of and compliance with the said proviso, do hereby declare that my said Invention is fully described and ascertained in the plan thereof drawn in the body of these presents. 5

In witness whereof, I, the said John Johnson, have hereunto set my hand and seal, the Tenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety-six.

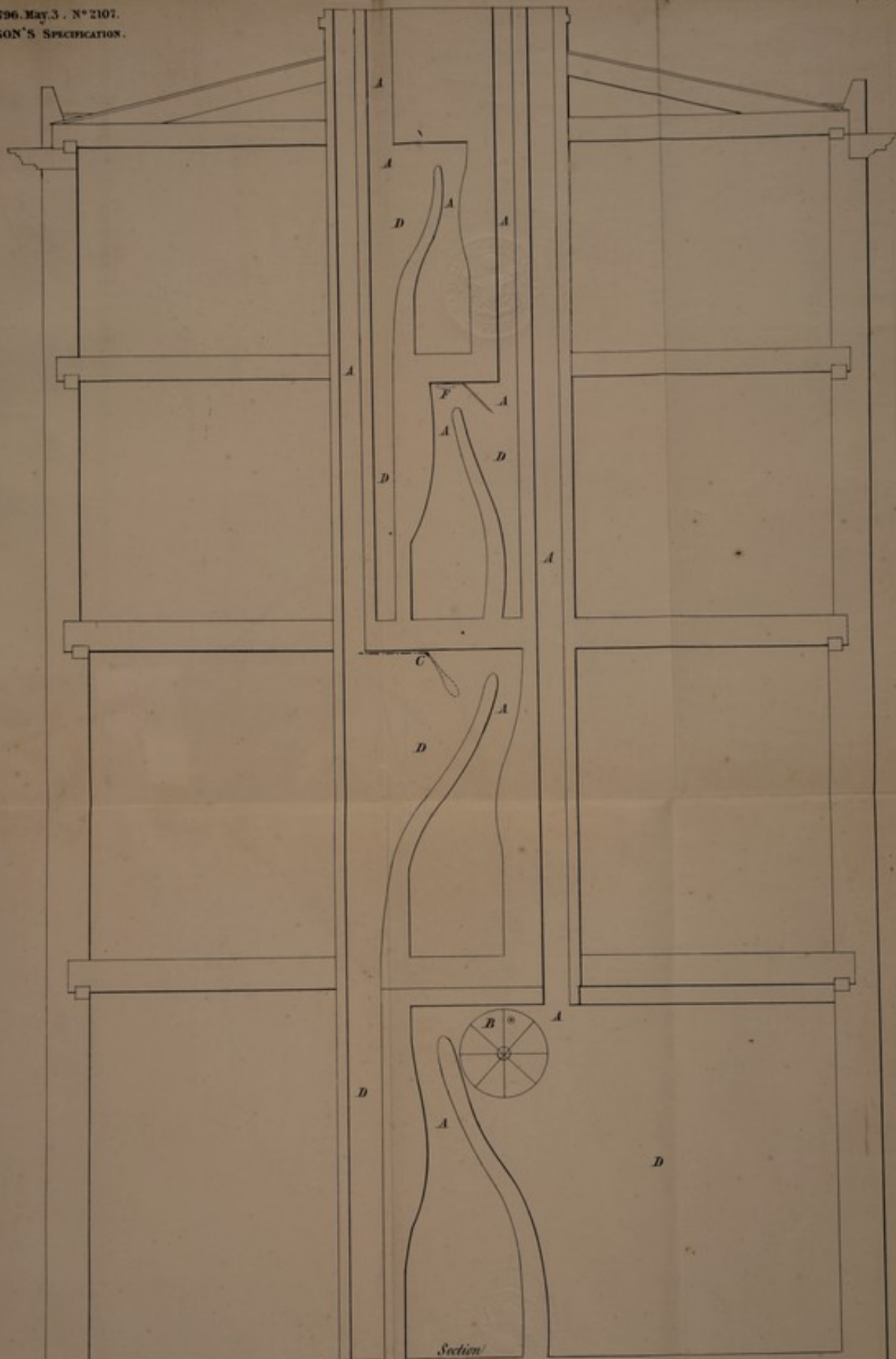

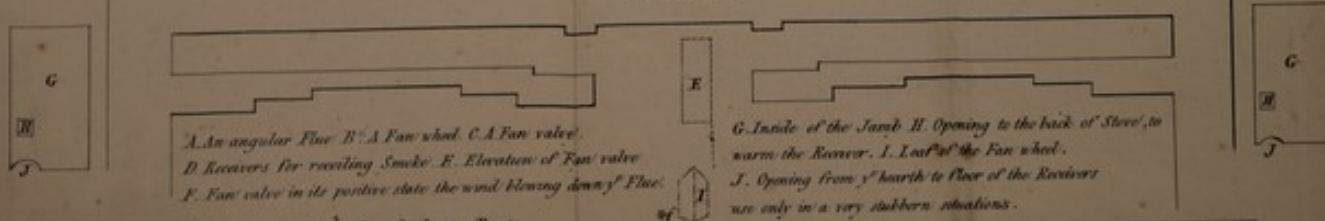
