

BYFIELD'S PATENT.

ANNE, by the grace of God, &c., to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting.

WHEREAS our trusty and welbeloved Timothy Byfield, Doctor in Physick, hath, by his peticon, humbly represented vnto us that he hath, by his long study and great expence, found out and brought to perfection "A New and most vsefull Chimicall Preparacon and Medicine publickly known by the Name of his Sal Oleosum Volatile, which by abundant Experience hath been found very helpfull and beneficiall, as well in Vses Medicinall as others, and will very much tend to the Public Vse and Benefit of all our Subjects,"

10 and haveing therefore humbly prayed vs to grant him our Royall Letters Patents for the sole vse and benefit of his said Invention, for the term of fourteen yeares:

KNOW YEE, that wee, being willing to give encouragement to all arts and inventions which may be of publick vse and benefit, of our especial grace, 15 certain knowledge, and mere mocon, have given and granted, and by these presents for vs, our heires and successors, do give and grant vnto the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, especial licence, full power, sole privilege and authority, that he, the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, and every of them, by himselfe and themselves, or by his or their deputy and deputys, servants or agents, or such others as he, the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, or assignes, shall at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times during the term of yeares herein expressed, shall and lawfully may exercise, work, vse, and enioy, within that part of our kingdom of Great Britain called England, our dominion of Wales, and town of Berwick-vpon-

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Tweed, and within our kingdom of Ireland, his said new-invented chimicall preparacon and medicine publickly known by the name of his Sal Oleosum Volatile as aforesaid, in such manner as to him, the said Thomas Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, or any of them, shall in their discre-And that he, the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, 5 tions seem meet. administrators, and assignes, shall and may have and enioy the whole profit, benefit, comodity, and advantage from time to time coming, growing, accruing, and ariseing by reason of the said Invention, for and during the full term of yeares herein menconed, to have, hold, exercise, and enioy the said licence, powers, priviledges, and advantages herein-before granted or menconed to be 10 granted vnto the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, for and dureing and vnto the full end and term of fourteen yeares from the date of these presents next and immediately ensueing and fully to be compleat and ended, according to the statute in this case made and provided; and to the end that the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, 15 and assignes, and every of them, may have and enioy the full benefit and the sole vse and exercise of the said Invention, according to our gratious intencon herein-before declared, wee do by these presents, for vs, our heires and successors, require and strictly comand all and every person and persons, bodies politick and corporate, and all other our subjects whatsoever, of what 20 estate, quality, or degree, name, or condicon soever they be, within that part of our said kingdom of Great Britain called England, our dominion of Wales, and town of Berwick-vpon Tweed, and within our said kingdom of Ireland, that neither they or any them, at any time dureing the continuance of the said term of fourteen yeares hereby granted, either directly or indirectly, do make, 25 vse, or put in practice the said Invention, or any part of the same so attained vnto by the said Timothy Byfield as aforesaid, nor shall in anywise counterfeit, imitate, or resemble the same, nor shall make or cause to be made any addition thereunto or substraction from the same, whereby to pretend himselfe or themselves the inventor or inventors, devisor or devisors thereof, without 30 the licence, consent, or agreement of the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, or assignes, in writeing vnder his or their hands and seales, first had and obtained in that behalfe, vpon such paines and penalties as can or may be justly inflicted on such offenders for their contempt of this our royall command, and further to be answerable to the said Timothy Byfield, his 35 executors, administrators, and assignes, according to law, for his and their damages thereby occasioned. And moreover wee do by these presents, for vs, our heires and successors, will and command all and singular our justices of the peace, mayors, sheriffs, bayliffs, constables, headboroughs, and all other

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officers and ministers whatsoever of vs, our heires and successors for the time being, that they or any of them do not nor shall, at any time hereafter during the said terme hereby granted, in any wise molest, trouble, or hinder the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, or assignes, or any of them, or 5 his or their deputies, servants, or agents in or about the due and lawfull making vse or exercise of the aforesaid Invencon, or anything relating thereto: Provided always, and these our Letters Patents are and shall be vpon this condition, that if at any time dureing the said terme hereby granted it shall be made appear to vs, our heires or successors, or any six or more of our 10 or their Privy Councill, that this our grant is contrary to law, or prejudiciall or inconvenient to our subjects in generall, or that the said Invencon is not a new invencon as to the publick vse and exercise thereof within that part of our said kingdom of Great Britain called England, our dominion of Wales, , and Town of Berwick-vpon-Tweed, and within our said kingdom of Ireland, 15 or not invented and found out by the said Timothy Byfield as aforesaid, then, vpon significacon and declaration thereof to be made by vs, our heires or successors, vnder our or their signet or privy seale, or by the lord? and others of our or their Privy Council, or any six or more of them, vnder their hands, these our Letters Patents shall forthwith cease, determine, and be vtterly void, 20 to all intents and purposes, anything herein-before contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding: Provided also that these our Letters Patents, or anything herein contained, shall not extend or be construed to extend to give priviledge vnto the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, or assignes, or any of them, to vse or imitate any Invencon or worke 25 whatsoever which hath heretofore been found out or invented by any of our subjects whatsoever, and publickly vsed or exercised within that part of our said kingdom of Great Britain called England, our dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick-vpon-Tweed, or within our said kingdom of Ireland, vnto whom like Letters Patents or priviledges have been already granted for 30 the sole vse, exercise, and benefit thereof, it being our will and pleasure that the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, and all and every other person and persons to whom like Letters Patents or priviledges have been already granted as aforesaid, shall distinctly vse and practice their severall Inventions by them invented and found out, according to the true 35 intent and meaning of the same respective Letters Patents, and of these presents. And lastly wee do by these presents, for vs, our heires and successors, grant vnto the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, that these our Letters Patents, or the inrollment thereof, shall be in and by all things good, firm, valid, sufficient, and effectuall in the law, according to the

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true intent and meaning thereof, and shall be taken, construed, and adiudged in the most favourable and beneficial sense for the best advantage of the said Timothy Byfield, his executors, administrators, and assignes, aswell in all courts of record as elswhere, and by all and singular the officers and ministers whatsoever of vs, our heires and successors, within that part of our said 5 kingdom of Great Britain called England, our dominion of Wales, and town of Berwick-vpon-Tweed, and within our said kingdom of Ireland, and amongst all and every the subjects of vs, our heires and successors whatsoever and wheresoever, notwithstanding the not full and certain describing the nature or quality of the said Invencon, or of the materials thereto conducing and 10 belonging.
