

- 10 OF THE HYPOCONDRIAC AND MELANCHOLLY KIND, AS ALSO OF IMPOSTUMATIOUS AGUES IN THE HEAD, EJECTION OF POLYPUSSES, AND VARIOUS OTHER AND SIMILAR INDISPOSITIONS, AS HAD BEEN DULY PROVED BY A VARIETY OF SUCCESSFUL EXPERIMENTS, AND WHICH I WAS READY TO MAKE APPEAR BY UNEXCEPTIONABLE EVIDENCE WHEN CALLED UPON BY AUTHORITY THERETO;" His Majesty therefore, by His Letters
- of December, in the twenty-third year of His reign, of His especial grace, certain knowledge, and meer motion, did give and grant unto me, the said Thomas Smith, my executors, administrators, and assigns, His especial licence, full power, sole privilege and authority, that I, the said Thomas Smith, my

Patent is contained a provisoe obliging me, the said Thomas Smith, by a writing under my hand and seal, duly to be inrolled within three kalendar months next and imediately after the date of the said Letters Patent, particularly to describe and ascertain the nature of my said Invention, and what manner the same is to be performed, as by the said Letters Patent 5 may more fully and at large appear.

NOW KNOW YE, that in compliance with the said proviso, I, the said Thomas Smith, do hereby declare that my said Invention of the medicinal snuff before expressed is composed of the several materials or ingredients following, to wit:—

Take two ounces of knotted margerum, six ounces of marum, and two ounces of acrimony, one pound of asser tobacco, and two ounces of balm, and one ounce of lily comvally; let them be all well pulverized in a mortar together, then sifted fine off, so as to be made snuff; then take one teaspoonful struck for a dose up the nose as snuff going to bed, and repeated 15 every six days as long as the patient sees convenient.

In witness whereof, I, the said Thomas Smith, have hereunto set my hand and seal, this Nineteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty-nine, and in the twenty-third year of the reign of King George the Second.
