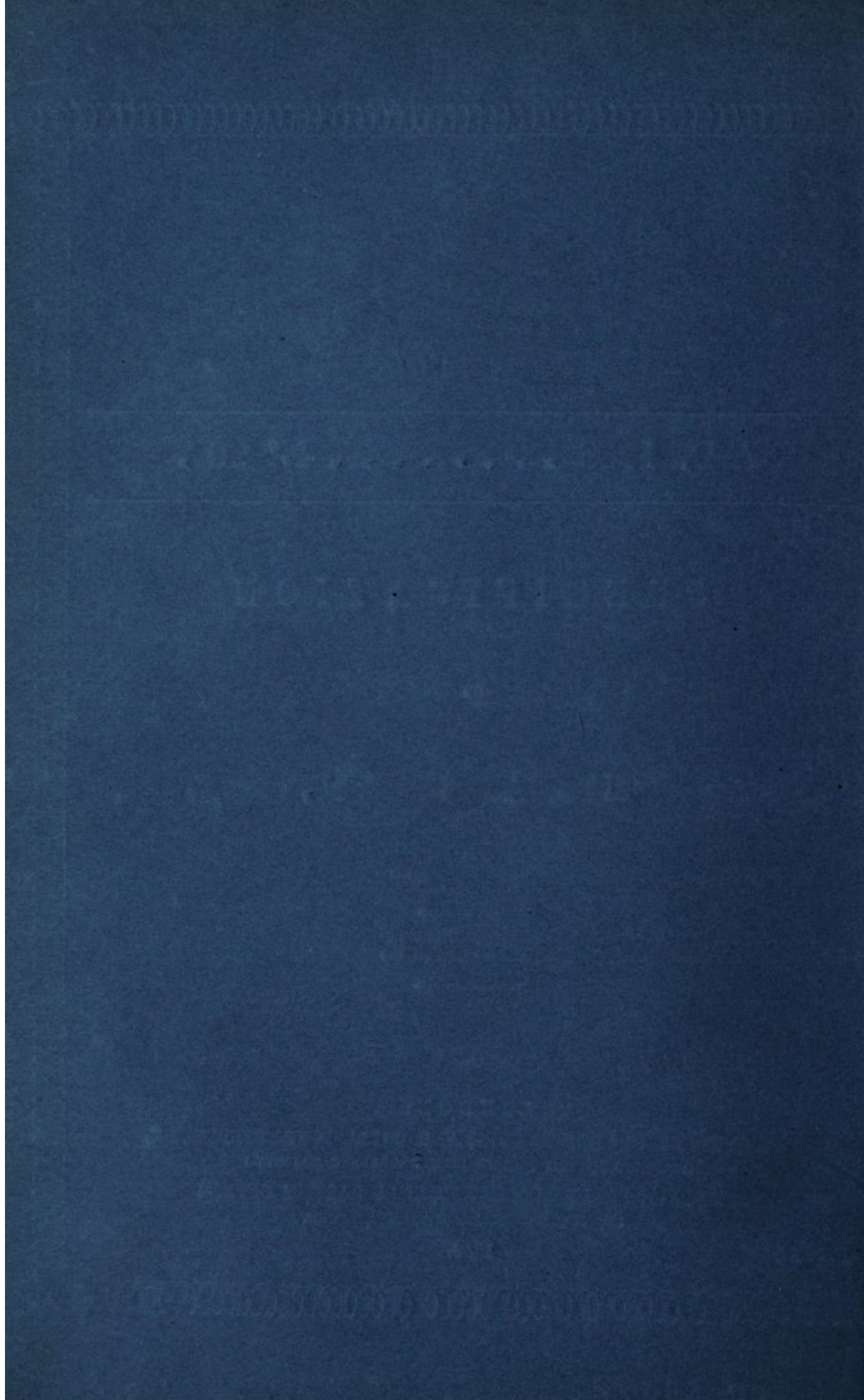

NORRIS' SPECIFICATION.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, THOMAS NORRIS, of Duke Street, Westminster, in the County of Middex, Chemist, send greeting.

WHEREAS His most Excellency Majesty King George the Third, by His
5 Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing date the Seventh
day of December, in the ninth year of His reign, did give and grant unto me,
the said Thomas Norris, my exors, admors, and assigns, His said Majesty's
especial licence, full power, sole privilege and authority, that I, the said
Thomas Norris, my exors, admors, and assigns, from time to time and at all
10 times during the term of years therein expressed, should and lawfully might
use, exercise, and vend, within that part of Great Britain called England, His
said Majesty's Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, and
also His said Majesty's Colonies and Plantations abroad, my "**NEW-INVENTED**
MEDICINE OR DROPS FOR THE CURE OF FEVERS AND ALL INFLAMATORY DISORDERS ;
15 **THAT THE EXPERIENCE OF ITS SOVEREIGN EFFICACY, NOT ONLY IN THE ABOVE**
DISORDERS, BUT IN MANY CHRONIC DISORDERS, ARE INDISPUTABLE ; AND WHAT MUST
RENDER THIS MEDICINE PARTICULARLY SERVICABLE IS, THAT IT OPERATES WITHOUT
THE LEAST VIOLENCE OR DISTURBANCE TO THE ANIMAL ŒCONOMY, EVEN TO THE
MOST DELICATE CONSTITUTION ;" in such manner as to me, my exors, admors,
20 and assigns, should seem meet, and that I, the said Thomas Norris, my exors,
admors, and assigns, should and lawfully might have and enjoy the whole profit,
benefit, commodity and advantage accruing and arising from the said Invention

during the time aforesaid; and there is a provisoe contained in the said Letters Patent, obliging me, the said Thomas Norris, by an instrument in writing under my hand and seal, particularly to describe and ascertain the nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be formed, and to cause the same to be inrolled in His Majesty's High Court of Chancery within four 5 calender months next after the date of the said Letters Patent.

NOW KNOW YE, that the said medicine or drops are as follows (that is to say):—

Antimon. cand. hung. rs. vitr. antim., ℥pt. s. a. sine ulla additione, fiat tinctura mediante acet. vin. s. a. Edulcora tincturam ad formam ol. rs. 10 sp. vin. aq. pluv. lign. ust. terr. sal petro, q. s., fiant calcinatio vitrificatio digestio evaporatio dulcificatio destillatio & fermentatio, s. a. Mediante igne.

In witness whereof, I, the said Thomas Norris, have hereunto set my hand and seal, the Fifth day of April, in the ninth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, by the grace of God of Great 15 Britain, France, and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, and so forth, and in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and sixty-nine.
