tors, and assigns, Her Royal Letters Patent for the same, and have made solemn declaration, that I verily believe myself to be the true and first Inventor thereof :

**NOW KNOW YE**, that I, the said Charles William Hockaday, do hereby declare that the following Complete Specification, under my 5 hand and seal, fully describes and ascertains the nature of my said Invention, and the manner in which the same is to be performed, viz<sup>t</sup>:

The nature of my said Invention is as follows:----

First, I use for the complaint commonly known as scurvy, the following proportions of hyd. oxymur, five grains; acid muriat., fifteen 10 grains; viri antimonii, half ounce; aqua dist., two drachms; sacch. ust., q. s. For an adult I consider that twenty drops in a wine glass of water, and taken twice a day, to be proper and sufficient; for the age of seven years, five drops to be used; for the age of fourteen, ten drops; for twenty-one years, fifteen drops. 15

For an odontalgic tincture, I combine of acid nitros, ten drops; finct. pyreth., twenty drops; and apply the same by means of a feather, camel hair pencil, or by any other suitable means.

For the venereal complaint, gonorrhœ, I take of pulv. pot. nit., half ounce; pulv. cubeba, one ounce; pulv. trag. co., half ounce. 20 These proportions I combine, and divide the mixture into twelve powders, one to be taken three times a day in a wine glass of water.

For ringworm, I mix intimately of oxungia, one ounce; sulph. prœ., two drachms; kreosote, two scruples; rose pink, ten grains. This should be applied twice a day. The above is also good in what is 25 known as grocers' itch.

For worms, I combine of pulv. scam., half drachm; hyd. submur., one scruple; sacch. alb., one drachm; misce. Doses to be taken as follows:—For the age of two years, eight grains; for the age of four, ten grains; for the age of seven, fifteen grains; and for fourteen 30 years, and over, twenty grains. One dose to be taken every other night.

For a corn plaster, I mix of plumbi superacetatis, fourteen drachms and one scruple; emp. hyd., half a pound; emp. plumbi, half a pound; emp. resinæ, half a pound; pulv. opii, two drachms.

For tooth paste, I form by a mixture of the following ingredients :— test. vel cretæ pp<sup>t</sup>, two drachms; pulv. irridis, two drachms; pulv. corralli, two drachms; alum exsicati, two scruples; cocci cacti, two scruples; ol. caryoph., eight drops; ess. bergam., four drops; mel. rosæ, 5 two ounces.

Having now described the nature of my Invention, and the manner in which the same is carried into effect, it is to be understood that I do not confine myself to the precise details herein described, so long as the peculiar character of the said Invention or any part thereof be retained.
10 And I do not claim the several parts of the compound or compounds taken separately and not combined for the purposes aforesaid. But what I claim is, the combination of the herein-before mentioned compound or compounds, combined and mixed in the herein-before stated equivalents and proportions, to accomplish the purpose for which each 15 compound or compounds is or are intended, as before described.
