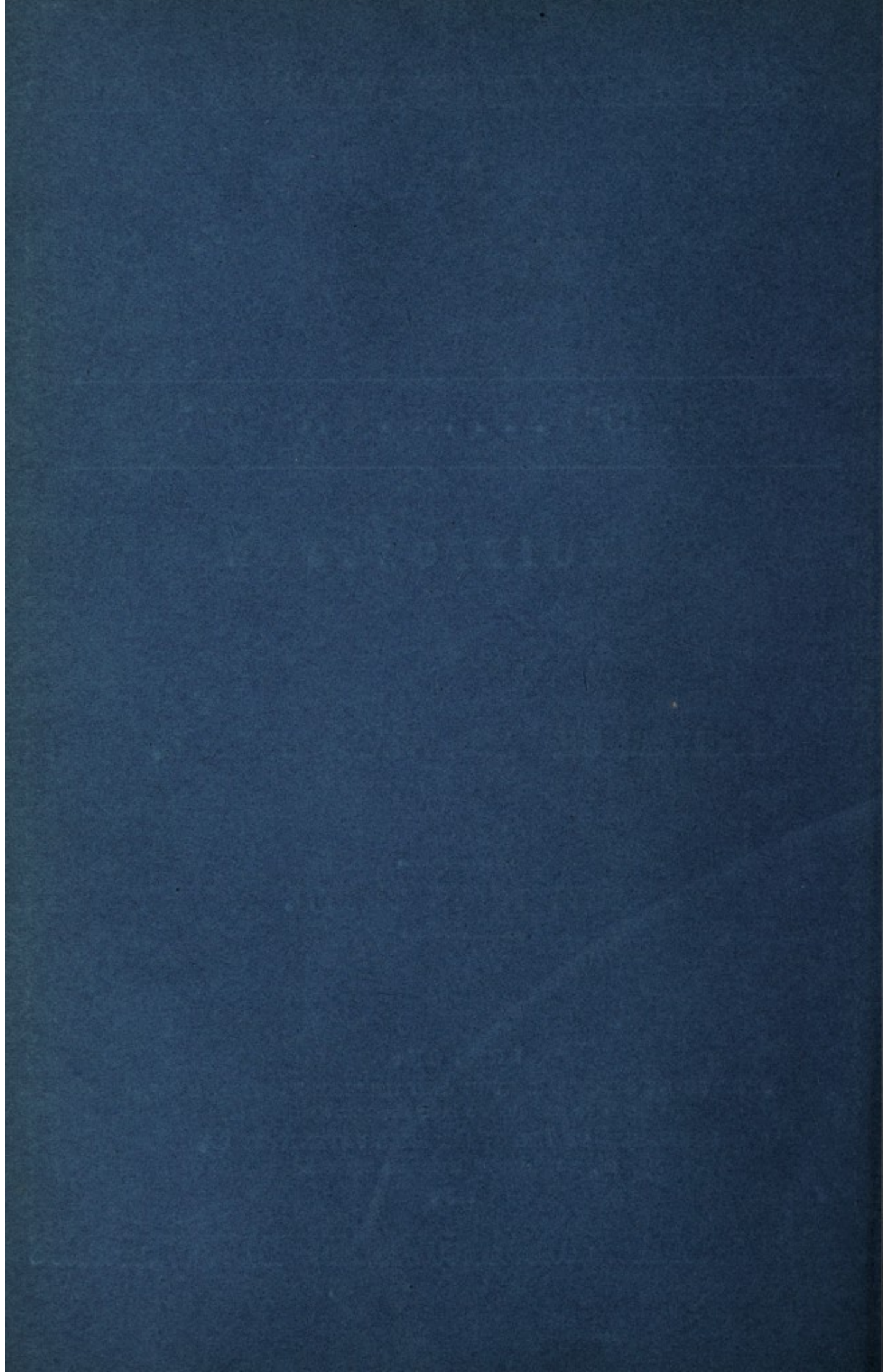

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Frederick Abraham Eskell at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 13th November 1855.

I, FREDERICK ABRAHAM ESKELL, of Manchester, in the County of Lancaster,
5 Dentist, do hereby declare the nature of my said Invention for "AN IMPROVE-
MENT IN PLATES FOR ATTACHING ARTIFICIAL TEETH" to be as follows:—

My improvement relates to the plates or pieces to which artificial teeth are affixed by rivets or other usual means for the purpose of attaching them to the gums.

10 My improvement consists in coating or covering such plates with *enamel*, which will entirely prevent any corrosion or uncleanness to which such plates are subject when placed in the mouth.
