

LETTERS PATENT to Lewis Jacob Jordan, of Berner Street, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman, for the Invention of "A Medicine for the Cure of Venereal Affections."

Sealed the 20th March 1857, and dated the 9th October 1856.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by the said Lewis Jacob Jordan at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 9th October 1856.

I, Lewis Jacob Jordan, of Berner Street, in the County of Middlesex, 5 Gentleman, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "A MEDICINE FOR THE CURE OF VENEREAL AFFECTIONS," to be as follows:—

This Invention relates to a certain combination or to certain combinations of the following ingredients or materials, as a medicine for the cure of gonorrhea, gleets, and all venereal affections and urethral discharges. To prepare this medicine I use sulphate of zinc, nitrate of potash, tragacanth powder, powdered henbane, tartarate of potash, bicarbonate of soda, and sugar, which I combine and use in certain proportions according to the stage or character of the disease.

SPECIFICATION in pursuance of the conditions of the Letters Patent, filed by the said Lewis Jacob Jordan in the Great Seal Patent Office on the 9th April 1857.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, LEWIS JACOB JORDAN, of Berner Street, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman, send greeting.

Jordan's Medicine for the Cure of Venereal Affections.

WHEREAS Her most Excellent Majesty Queen Victoria, by Her Letters Patent, bearing date the Ninth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, in the twentieth year of Her reign, did, for Herself, Her heirs and successors, give and grant unto me, the said Lewis Jacob Jordan, Her special licence that I, the said Lewis Jacob 5 Jordan, my executors, administrators, and assigns, or such others as I, the said Lewis Jacob Jordan, my executors, administrators, and assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times thereafter during the term therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and 10 Ireland, the Channel Islands, and Isle of Man, an Invention for "A MEDICINE FOR THE CURE OF VENEREAL AFFECTIONS," upon the condition (amongst others) that I, the said Lewis Jacob Jordan, my executors or administrators, by an instrument in writing under my, or their, or one of their hands and seals, should particularly describe and ascertain the nature of the said Invention, 15 and in what manner the same was to be performed, and cause the same to be filed in the Great Seal Patent Office within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said Letters Patent.

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said Lewis Jacob Jordan, do hereby declare the nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be 20 performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement:—

My Invention of a medicine for the cure of venereal affections which I denominate the "treisemar," relates to the combination of materials hereinafter determined, compounded and prepared in the form of a lozenge or other 25 convenient form for administering it to the patient.

It consists of a certain combination or certain combinations of the following ingredients or materials as a medicine, which is applicable for the cure of gonnorrhœa, gleets, and all venereal affections, urethral discharges, and generative debility. To prepare this medicine I use sulphate of zinc, nitrate 30 of potash, tragacanth powder, powdered henbane, tartrate of potash, bicarbonate of soda, and sugar, which I combine and use in certain proportions.

The proportions subjoined are for one dose, which should be repeated four times daily. I take of sulphate of zinc, one fourth part of a grain; of powdered henbane leaves, one grain; of compound tragacanth powder, one dram; of 35 nitrate of potash, six grains; of tartrate of potash, one twenty-fourth part of a grain, and of bicarbonate of soda, six grains. I reduce these ingredients to a fine powder, combine them intimately together, and afterwards mix them with a sufficient quantity of sugar to make a lozenge.

Jordan's Medicine for the Cure of Venereal Affections.

Instead of taking this medicine in the form of a lozenge, these ingredients may be dissolved in boiling water and taken as a draught when cold, or the lozenge itself may be so dissolved and prepared.

This medicine is applicable for the cure of gonnorrhæa, gleets, and all other 5 venereal affections. It is also applicable for the cure of all irregular urethral discharges, and for renovating and restoring generative debility.

If manufactured in the form of a lozenge, the different ingredients are proportioned for each, and the whole moulded and pressed into form, as well-known in the lozenge manufacture.

- For the more advanced stages of the disease I slightly increase the quantities for a dose, taking care to maintain the same relative proportions in all cases. As before-mentioned the dose is to be taken four times daily, and being pleasant to the taste it may be eaten in the form of a lozenge, or the lozenge may be dissolved in half a pint of boiling water and drank when cold.
- 15 With this medicine there is no necessity for any alteration in the diet of the patient, as animal and vegetable food may be taken as usual, but all kinds of wines, spirits, and malt liquor must be avoided. Tea, linseed tea, and barley water should be taken in considerable quantities to aid the effect of the medicine.
- Having described the nature of my Invention, and the manner of performing the same, I declare that what I claim to be protected and secured to me under the herein-before in part recited Letters Patent is, the Invention of the medicine herein-before described, for the cure of venereal affections, and all irregular urethral discharges, and for the restoration or renovation of generative debility.
