TREISEMAR,**" to be as follows:—

This Invention relates to a certain combination or certain combinations of
the following ingredients or materials as a medicine for the cure of gonorrhœa,
10 gleets, and all venereal affections, and urethral discharges, & generative
debility. To prepare this medicine I use sulphate of zinc, nitrate of potash,
tragacanth powder, powdered henbane, tartarate of potash, bicarbonate of soda,
and sugar, which I combine & use in certain proportions, according to the
stage and character of the disease.
