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

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Lewis Jacob Jordan at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 8th November 1856.

I, Lewis Jacob Jordan, of Berners Street, in the County of Middlesex, 5 Gentleman, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "A MEDICINE FOR THE CURE OF VENEREAL AFFECTIONS AND GENERATIVE DEBILITY, THE TREISEMAR," to be as follows:—

This Invention relates to a certain combination or certain combinations of the following ingredients or materials as a medicine for the cure of gonorrhea, 10 gleets, and all venereal affections, and urethral discharges, & generative debility. To prepare this medicine I use sulphate of zinc, nitrate of potash, tragacinth powder, powdered henbane, tartarate of potash, bicarbonate of soda, and sugar, which I combine & use in certain proportions, according to the stage and character of the disease.
