

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, FREDERICK Weiss, of the Strand, in the County of Middlesex, Surgical Instrument Maker, send greeting.

WHEREAS Her present most Excellent Majesty Queen Victoria, by Her Solution Solution

- 10 Her especial licence, full power, sole privilege and authority, that I, the said Frederick Weiss, my exors, admors, and assigns, or such others as I, the said Frederick Weiss, my exors, admors, or assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times during the term of years therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use,
- 15 exercise, and vend, within England, Wales, and the Town of Berwick-upon-Tweed, and in the Island of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, and in all Her Majesty's Colonies and Plantations abroad, the Invention of "Improvements in certain Surgical Instruments, also in Scissors and other like Cutting Instruments," communicated to me from abroad; in which said
- 20 Letters Patent is contained a proviso, that I, the said Frederick Weiss, shall cause a particular description of the nature of the said Invention, and in

what manner the same is to be performed, by an instrument in writing under my hand and seal, to be inrolled in Her Majesty's High Court of Chancery within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said in part recited Letters Patent, as in and by the same, reference being thereunto had, will more fully and at large appear.

NOW KNOW YE, that in compliance with the said proviso, I, the said Frederick Weiss, do hereby declare that the nature of the said Invention, and the manner in which the same is to be performed, are fully described and ascertained in and by the following statement thereof, reference being had to the Drawing hereunto annexed, and to the figures and letters marked 10 thereon, that is to say:—

The Invention consists of improvements in forceps and similar surgical instruments, and in scissors and other such like cutting instruments, and wherein the parts or limbs move on axes.

And in order that the Invention may be most fully understood and readily 15 carried into effect, I will now proceed to describe the means pursued by me.

DESCRIPTION OF THE DRAWING.

Figure 1 shews a plan of part of a pair of forceps or such like surgical instruments, or of scissors or such like cutting instrument, composed of two parts or limbs moving on an axis. The parts shewn are on a magnified scale, 20 in order that the manner of forming the axis, and also the opening through the moveable limb, may more clearly be shewn and more readily understood. On one limb is fixed a stud or axis, with a large or projecting head, which is so formed, that in the act of shutting it causes the limbs to be drawn or come towards each other, and the head is so formed in respect to the hole or 25 passage through the other limb, that it will pass through when the limbs cross each other at an angle. By this arrangement not only is there the advantage of the drawing or coming together of the limbs and the cutting edges to such an extent that in scissors the edges will cut as effectually when used by the left hand as with the right hand, the arrangement also admits of a ready 30 separation to cleanse the parts. The stud or axis a is fixed to one of the limbs, and passes through the opening b of the other limb, when the same is laid across at or near at right angles (or it may be made at another angle), and as the parts or blades c, c, close, they are drawn towards each other by the incline on the under surfaces of the head of the axis, aided by the form of 35 the opening as shewn.

Having thus described the nature of the said Invention, and the manner of

performing the same, I would have it understood that what I claim is the mode herein described of combining the limbs of surgical instruments, also scissors and such like cutting instruments.
