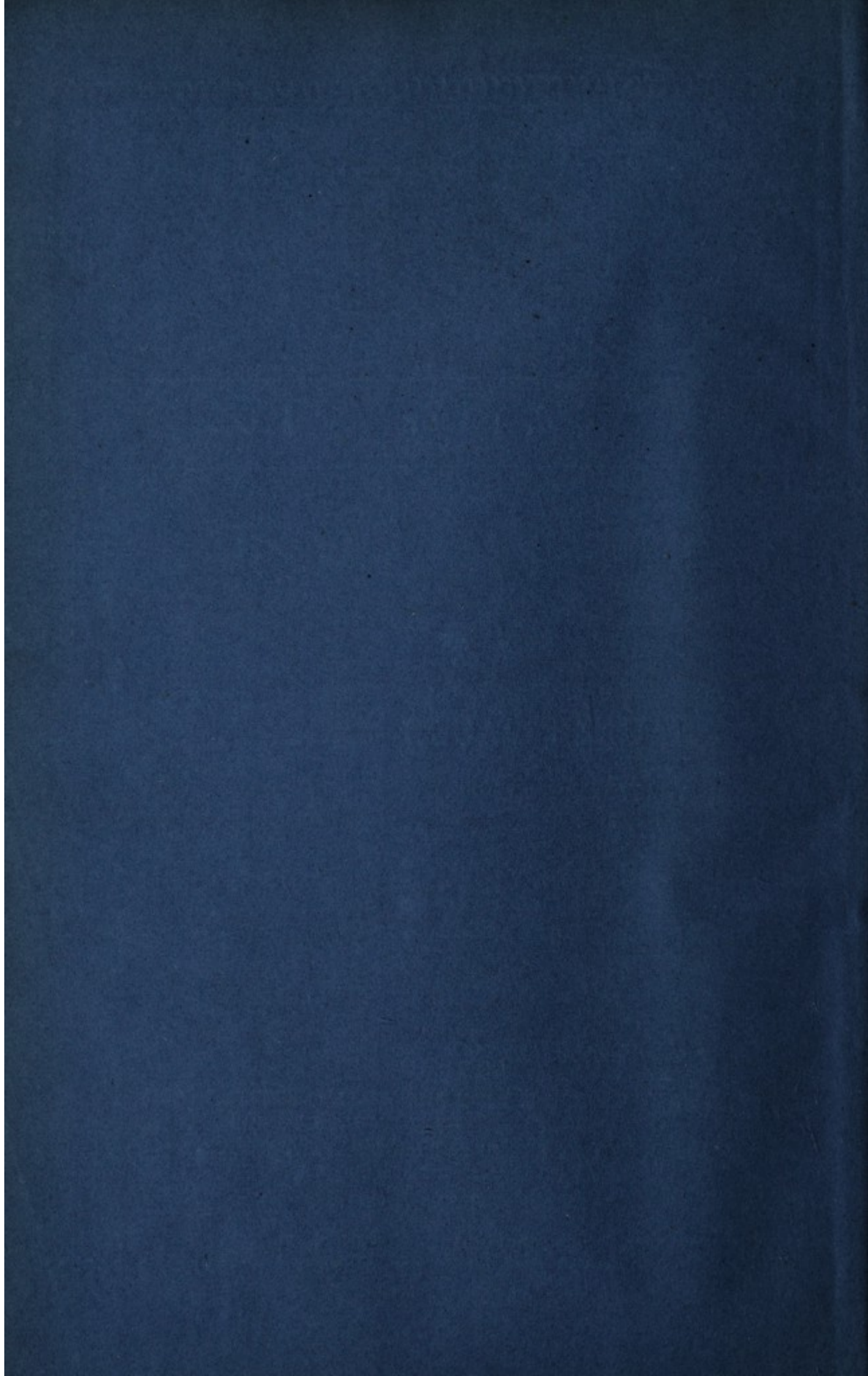

LETTERS PATENT to Reuben Jacob Jordan, of Berners Street, Oxford Street, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman, for the Invention of
“**IMPROVEMENTS IN PILLS.**”

Sealed the 6th November 1860, and dated the 15th May 1860.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by the said Reuben Jacob Jordan at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 15th May 1860.

I, REUBEN JACOB JORDAN, of Berners Street, Oxford Street, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for “**IMPROVEMENTS IN PILLS,**” to be as follows:—

My improvements in pills relate to the combination of materials subjoined in about the proportions given, and to coloring them rose pink. Other ingredients may be added, if desired, but I believe the proportions and ingredients
10 stated to produce the best medicine.

RECIPE FOR PILLS.

15
2 oz. gum gambogia.
1 „ pulo rhœi optimus.
1 „ „ gum myrrh.
1 „ sapo Castile.
1 „ pulo aloes Soce.
4 „ „ lingib optimus.
4 „ „ sum cardum.

Jordan's Improvements in Pills.

I mix these ingredients with syrup or other suitable matter to form a mass. Having formed this compound into pills in the usual manner, I coat them with sugar, as well understood, which I produce of a rose pink color, in order to render the appearance of the pills more acceptable.

SPECIFICATION in pursuance of the conditions of the Letters Patent, filed 5 by the said Reuben Jacob Jordan in the Great Seal Patent Office on the 15th November 1860.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, REUBEN JACOB JORDAN, of Berners Street, Oxford Street, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman, send greeting. 10

WHEREAS Her most Excellent Majesty Queen Victoria, by Her Letters Patent, bearing date the Fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, in the twenty-third year of Her reign, did, for Herself, Her heirs and successors, give and grant unto me, the said Reuben Jacob Jordan, Her special licence that I, the said Reuben 15 Jacob Jordan, executors, administrators, and assigns, or such others as I, the said Reuben Jacob Jordan, my executors, administrators, and assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times thereafter during the term therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, within the United Kingdom of 20 Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel Islands, and Isle of Man, an Invention for "**IMPROVEMENTS IN PILLS**," upon the condition (amongst others) that I, the said Reuben Jacob Jordan, my executors or administrators, by an instrument in writing under my, or their, or one of their hands and seals, should particularly describe and ascertain the nature of the said Invention, 25 and in what manner the same was to be performed, and cause the same to be filed in the Great Seal Patent Office within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said Letters Patent.

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said Reuben Jacob Jordan, do hereby declare the nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same 30 is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement (that is to say):—

My improvements in pills relate to the combination of materials subjoined in about the proportions given, and to coloring them rose pink. Other ingredients may be added, if desired, but I believe the proportions and ingredients 35 stated to produce the best medicine.

Jordan's Improvements in Pills.

To compound the pills I take,—

- 5 Two ounces of gum gambogia ;
 One ounce of pulo rhoci optimus ;
 One ounce of gum myrrh ;
 One ounce of sapo Castile ;
 One ounce of pulo aloes Soce ;
 One ounce of lingib optimus ;
 One ounce of sum cardium.

I mix these ingredients with syrup or other suitable matter to form a mass.
10 Having formed this compound into pills in the usual manner, I coat them with sugar, as well understood in confectionary, which I produce of a rose pink color, in order to render the appearance of the pills more acceptable.

Having described the nature of my Invention, and the manner of performing the same, I declare that what I claim as my Invention, to be protected
15 by the herein-before in part recited Letters Patent, is, pills compounded of the ingredients and in about the proportions above named, and also rendering the sugar coating thereof of a rose pink color, as described.

Jordan's Experiments in Pills.

To compound the pills I take—

Two ounces of pure tartaric acid;

One ounce of pure flesh oil;

One ounce of pure sugar;

One ounce of pure Castile;

Two ounces of pure aloes;

One ounce of liquid opium;

One ounce of pure castor.

I mix these ingredients with syrup or other suitable matter to form a mass. Having formed this compound into pills in the usual manner, I cast them with sugar, as well understood in confectionery, which I preserve of a rose pink color, in order to render the appearance of the pills more agreeable.

Having described the nature of my invention, and the manner of preparing the same, I declare that what I claim as my invention, to be protected by the patent-laws in part recited, I state, is, pills compounded of the ingredients and in about the proportions above named, and also rendering the sugar coating thereof of a rose pink color, as described.
