PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Henry Gilbee at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 28th September 1860.—A communication from abroad by Noel Pascal, of Paris, France.

5 I, Henry Gilbee, of No. 4, South Street, Finsbury, in the County of Middlesex, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention of "An Improved Medicament to Prevent and Cure Venereal Diseases," to be as follows, that is to say:—

The Invention communicated to me consists in the employment of the 10 mikania guaco and comocladia integrifolia, in conjunction with other substances for the preparation of a liquor to be used for the prevention and for the treatment of venereal diseases.

The liquor or medicament is prepared as follows :-

I take about 5½ pounds Troy of alcohol, about 2½ pounds of mikania 15 guaco, and about 2½ pounds of guaco or comocladia integrifolia, and leave the substances to macerate about one month. At the end of this time I add about 7 pennyweights of the immediate products obtained by the incineration of the two before-mentioned plants. Alter filtering, I add to the liquor about three pennyweights of perchloride of iron, and I aromatize with the essences 20 of rosemary or lavender, and dilute with water according to the required application.
