

- I, ETIENNE REOCHE, of Rue D'Enghien, Paris, in the Empire of France, 5 Chemist, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "A New MEDICINAL PREPARATION APPLICABLE INTERNALLY FOR RHEUMATISM AND OTHER DISORDERS," to be as follows :---

My improved medicinal preparation consists of a medicine to be applied internally, which is beneficial for rheumatism, neuralgia, gout, stomach, chest, 10 & liver complaints, cramps, flatulence, cholera, & to diseases in general contagious or otherwise. I prepare it of the roots of the pomegranate and date trees, to which may or may not be added that of a plant known in France as santorée. These I macerate in brandy or other spirit alone, or it may be in brandy & wine mixed, or in wine alone; I allow the whole to ferment, &

15 then bottle off & keep for use as required.
