PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Etienne Reoche at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 30th September 1861.

I, ETIENNE REOCHE, of Rue D'Enghien, Paris, in the Empire of France,
5 Chemist, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "**A NEW
MEDICINAL PREPARATION APPLICABLE INTERNALLY FOR RHEUMATISM AND OTHER
DISORDERS,**" to be as follows :—

My improved medicinal preparation consists of a medicine to be applied
internally, which is beneficial for rheumatism, neuralgia, gout, stomach, chest,
10 & liver complaints, cramps, flatulence, cholera, & to diseases in general con-
tagious or otherwise. I prepare it of the roots of the pomegranate and date
trees, to which may or may not be added that of a plant known in France as
santorée. These I macerate in brandy or other spirit alone, or it may be in
brandy & wine mixed, or in wine alone; I allow the whole to ferment, &
15 then bottle off & keep for use as required.
