Medicine for Diseases of the Liver.

LETTERS PATENT to Henri Newmane, Gentleman, of Hortulan Villa, Shrewsbury, in the County of Salop, for the Invention of "A New Medicinal Compound Pill for Diseases of the Liver."

Sealed the 16th August 1864, and dated the 17th February 1864.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by the said Henri Newmane at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 17th February 1864.

I, HENRI NEWMANE, Gentleman, of Hortulan Villa, Shrewsbury, in the 5 County of Salop, do hereby declare the nature of my said Invention for "A NEW MEDICINAL COMPOUND PILL FOR DISEASES OF THE LIVER," to be as follows (that is to say):—

My Invention consists in the use of the root or other parts of the plants sanguinaria and podophylleæ, dried or otherwise prepared, so that they may be 10 ground or reduced to a powder. I take about equal quantities of each of these and a sufficient quantity of extract of taraxaci to form the whole into a suitable mass, from which I form my pills, apportioning the size or dose according to the age or habit of the patient.

SPECIFICATION in pursuance of the conditions of the Letters Patent, filed by the said Henri Newmane in the Great Seal Patent Office on the 16th August 1864.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, HENRI NEWMANE, Gentleman, formerly of Hortulan Villa, Shrewsbury, in the County 5 of Salop, but now of Bristol Road, Birmingham, in the County of Warwick, send greeting.

WHEREAS Her most Excellent Majesty Queen Victoria, by Her Letters Patent, bearing date the Seventeenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in the twenty-seventh year of 10 Her reign, did, for Herself, Her heirs and successors, give and grant unto me, the said Henri Newmane, Her special license that I, the said Henri Newmane, my executors, administrators, and assigns, or such others as I, the said Henri Newmane, my executors, administrators, and assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times thereafter 15 during the term therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel Islands, and Isle of Man, an Invention for "A NEW MEDICINAL COMPOUND PILL FOR DISEASES OF THE LIVER," upon the condition (amongst others) that I, the said Henri Newmane, by an instrument in writing under 20 my hand and seal, should particularly describe and ascertain the nature of the said Invention, and in what manner the same was to be performed, and cause the same to be filed in the Great Seal Patent Office within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said Letters Patent.

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said Henri Newmane, do hereby declare 25 the nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement (that is to say):—

My Invention consists in the root of the plants sanguinaria and podophyllum dried, so that they may be ground and reduced to a powder. I 30 take about equal quantities of each of these and a sufficient quantity of extract of taraxaci to form the whole into a suitable mass, from which I form my pills, apportioning the size or dose according to the age or habit of the patient.

But the proportions I think that will be found most efficient in use, are 35 podophyllum, three ounces; sanguinaria, three ounces; extract taraxaci, five ounces. Notwithstanding this last ingredient may be omitted and any other suitable ingredient substituted for combining the other two ingredients.

Having thus given a description of my Invention, and the proportions I recommend, I wish it understood that I do not purpose confining myself to the exact quantities here given, as the same may be beneficially changed or varied in some cases, but I believe the proportions given will be found 5 generally suitable, and a most valuable remedy for all diseases of the liver, and all disorders arising from a morbid secretion of the bile, whether the secretion be superabundant or defective, ameliorating the character of the bile and giving a healthy action to the liver, hence their great efficacy in bilious attacks.
