Surgical Bandage.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Jean Clément Léon Camel at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 21st January 1869.

I, JEAN CLÉMENT LÉON CAMEL, of Rue St. Helène, No. 36, Lyons, France, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "**AN IMPROVED SURGICAL TRUSS OR BANDAGE**," to be as follows:—

This Invention has for its object the control or prevention of the virile manifestations which in certain conditions of the genital organs are productive of injurious results. For this purpose I employ a compressing
10 bandage of caoutchouc or other material in a textile form or otherwise, and so shaped as to press upon the penis and keep it pointed in the direction of the thighs towards the feet and prevent its erection. I attach this compressing bandage to a small cylinder of wood or other material between which and the bandage the penis rests and is held in
15 the required position. I attach this apparatus to the person by means of such a system of bandages, straps, tapes, or ribbons with or without buckles or elastic fastening as shall most conveniently fit the form of the patient.
