LETTERS PATENT to James Agnew, of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, Chemist, for the Invention of "**A NEW AND IMPROVED MEDICINAL PREPARATION OF COD LIVER OIL, CALLED COD LIVER OIL JELLY.**"

Sealed the 25th October 1870, and dated the 17th May 1870.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by the said James Agnew at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 17th May 1870.

I, **JAMES AGNEW**, of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, Chemist, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "**A NEW AND IMPROVED MEDICINAL PREPARATION OF COD LIVER OIL, CALLED COD LIVER OIL JELLY,**" to be as follows:—

The object of my Invention is to provide a palatable medicinal preparation of cod liver oil suited for the most delicate persons. For this purpose I form a jelly by adding to about 96 parts of cod liver oil from three to four parts of gelatine, isinglass, Iceland moss, or equivalent substance dissolved in water and then stirring the mixture until it assumes a jelly-like consistency. Citric acid, oil of lemon, or other acid or substance mixible with cod liver oil may be added in small quantities

to prevent nausea and improve the flavor ; or quinine, phosphates, tincture of iron or other medicinal substances or preparation mixible with cod liver oil may be added to serve as a tonic.

SPECIFICATION in pursuance of the conditions of the Letters Patent, filed by the said James Agnew in the Great Seal Patent Office 5 on the 17th November 1870.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, JAMES AGNEW, of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, Chemist, send greeting.

WHEREAS Her most Excellent Majesty Queen Victoria, by Her 10 Letters Patent, bearing date the Seventeenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy, in the thirty-third year of Her reign did, for Herself, Her heirs and successors, give and grant unto me, the said James Agnew, Her special licence that I, the said James Agnew, my executors, administrators, and assigns, 15 or such others as I, the said James Agnew, my executors, administrators, and assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times thereafter during the term therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel 20 Islands, and Isle of Man, an Invention for "**A NEW AND IMPROVED MEDICINAL PREPARATION OF COD LIVER OIL, CALLED COD LIVER OIL JELLY,**" upon the condition (amongst others) that I, the said James Agnew, my executors or administrators, by an instrument in writing under my, or their, or one of their hands and seals, should particularly describe and ascertain 25 the nature of the said Invention, and in what manner the same was to be performed, and cause the same to be filed in the Great Seal Patent Office within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said Letters Patent.

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said James Agnew, do hereby 30 declare the nature of my said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement thereof (that is to say) :—

The object of my Invention is to provide a palatable medicinal preparation of cod liver oil suited for the most delicate persons. For 35

this purpose I form a jelly by adding to about 96 parts of cod liver oil, from three to four parts of gelatine, isinglass, Iceland moss, or equivalent substance, dissolved in water, and then stirring the mixture until it assumes a jelly-like consistency. Citric acid, oil of lemon, or other
5 acid or substance mixible with cod liver oil may be added in small quantities to prevent nausea and improve the flavor; or quinine, phosphates, tincture of iron, or other medicinal substances or preparations mixible with cod liver oil may be added to serve as a tonic.

Having now described the nature of my said Invention, I claim, the
10 new and improved medicinal preparation of cod liver oil, called cod liver oil jelly, as herein described.

Agnew's Improved Medical Preparation of Cod Liver Oil

This preparation is a jelly by adding to about 98 parts of cod liver oil, from three to four parts of gelatine, isinglass, Lochan moss, or equivalent substance, dissolved in water, and then stirring the mixture until it assumes a jelly-like consistency. Citric acid, oil of lemon, or other acid, or substance mixible with cod liver oil may be added in small quantities to prevent rancor and improve the flavor; or phosphate, nitrate of iron, or other medicinal substance or preparations mixible with cod liver oil may be added to serve as a tonic.

Having now described the nature of my said Invention, I claim, the new and improved medicinal preparation of cod liver oil called cod liver oil jelly, as herein described.
