### Medicinal Compound.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Henry Beriah Brook at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 24th May 1870.

I, HENRY BERIAH BROOK, of Westminster, in the County of Middlesex, Surgeon, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "AN IMPROVED MEDICINAL COMPOUND OR STOMACHIC CORDIAL," to be as follows:—

This Invention consists in combining together the following ingredients, matters, or substances, to produce a tonic or stomachic cordial, namely:—

	Corianda seed	-	-	-	One ounce.
	Carraway seed	-	-	-	One ounce.
	Cardamon seed	-	-	-	One ounce.
	Seville orange without rhind	-	-	-	One ounce and a half.
15	Gentian root stripped of its outer bark				Six drachms.
	Senna leaves (picked)	-	-	-	Four ounces.
	Syrup of saffron	-	-	-	Six ounces.

*Brook's Improved Medicinal Compound.*

White sugar candy (powdered)	-	Eight ounces.	
Rectified spirits of wine	-	Two pints.	
Usquebaugh	-	One pint.	
Pure Turkey rhubarb	-	Half drachm.	
Red currant wine	-	Five pints.	5

Flavoured according to taste.

The seeds may be either bruised or ground. The other ingredients are macerated in the spirits of wine and usquebaugh for about four days, and subjected to gentle heat; after which the currant wine is added, the heat discontinued, and the mass agitated four or five times a day for 10 about nine days; it is then filtered and flavoured, if necessary, and is fit for use.
