5 declare the nature of the said Invention for "AN IMPROVED HAIR RESTORER," to be as follows:—

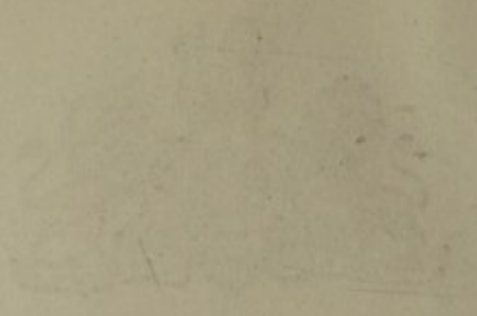
My Invention relates to an improved wash or preparation for reviving or promoting the growth of the hair.

10 lavender, liquid dye obtained from red Saunders wood, and water mixed together in a cold state in the following or other suitable proportions.
