

I first take pure milk 10 from the cow and deprive it of or extract its aqueous portion, and then add pounded sugar together with a sufficient quantity of Vichy salts to render the aliment useful for the treatment of those maladies in which

said salts are employed. I may also dispense with the sugar and simply add Vichy salts in order to render the aliment thus obtained more efficacious in the treatment of diabetes. The product (which combines the medicinal properties of 5 both milk and Vichy salts) will keep in this form for an indefinite period in any climate, and will be found to be of great service both as a hygienic and medical preparation.
