Sealed the 15th November 1872, and dated the 28th September 1872.

COMPLETE SPECIFICATION filed by the said Robert Veitch at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition and Declaration, on the 28th September 1872, pursuant to the 9th Section of the Patent Law Amendment Act, 1852.

WHEREAS I am in possession of an Invention for "**THE CURE OF CORNS BY FRICTION IN THE FORM OF A POWDER,**" which Invention I believe
10 will be of great public utility, and have petitioned Her Majesty to grant unto me, my executors, administrators, and assigns, Her Royal Letters Patent for the same, and have made solemn Declaration that I, the said Robert Veitch, am the true and first Inventor thereof.

Veitch's Powder for the Cure of Corns.

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said Robert Veitch, do hereby declare that the following Complete Specification, under my hand and seal, fully describes and ascertains the nature of the said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed in and by the following statement :—

The object of my Invention is to relieve pain by a new, safe, and improved method of eradicating corns from the feet.

First. The corn is pared down to as near the root as possible without cutting to the quick.

Second. The powder which is composed of orris root, Vanilla bean 10
pounded, mustard, lime, and salt, is then used in the following manner, viz. :—A little of it is moistened and rubbed in with the finger to the root of the corn for two or three minuets at a time, when by the effects of friction and the valuable properties of the powder the corn withers and 15
dies away.
