

LETTERS PATENT to Christian Von Hennings, of the City of Hamburg, for the Invention of "The Preparation of an Extract from the Berries of the Mountain Ash (Pyrus) (German Eberesche)."

Sealed the 13th May 1873, and dated the 2nd December 1872.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by the said Christian Von Hennings at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 2nd December 1872.

I, CHRISTIAN VON HENNINGS, of the City of Hamburg, do hereby 5 declare the nature of the said Invention for "The Preparation of an Extract from the Berries of the Mountain Ash (Pyrus) (German Eberresche)," to be as follows:—

The object of this Invention is to prepare an extract from the berries of the mountain ash, suitable more especially for being used medicinally, 10 as I have discovered that the extract of these berries possesses medicinal properties of great value in cases of colds, influenzas, and such like. For this purpose I boil or simmer the berries for about four hours in just sufficient water to cover them, I then strain off the liquor from the

berries without compressing them, and I add to the liquor an equal quantity of sugar, and again boil or simmer it for about half an hour, and subsequently, whilst still warm, I pour the prepared extract into glasses or other suitable receptacles, in which it will set as a jelly.

SPECIFICATION in pursuance of the conditions of the Letters Patent, 5 filed by the said Christian Von Hennings in the Great Seal Patent Office on the 30th May 1873.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, I, CHRISTIAN VON HENNINGS, of the City of Hamburg, send greeting.

WHEREAS Her most Excellent Majesty Queen Victoria, by Her 10 Letters Patent, bearing date the Second day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, in the thirty-sixth year of Her reign, did, for Herself, Her heirs and successors, give and grant unto me, the said Christian Von Hennings, Her special license that I, the said Christian Von Hennings, my 15 executors, administrators, and assigns, or such others as I, the said Christian Von Hennings, my executors, administrators, and assigns, should at any time agree with, and no others, from time to time and at all times thereafter during the term therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend, within the United 20 Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Channel Islands, and Isle of Man, an Invention for "THE PREPARATION OF AN EXTRACT FROM THE BERRIES OF THE MOUNTAIN ASH (PYRUS) (GERMAN EBERESCHE)," upon the condition (amongst others) that I, the said Christian Von Hennings, my executors or administrators, by an instrument in writing under my, 25 or their, or one of their hands and seals, should particularly describe and ascertain the nature of the said Invention, and in what manner the same was to be performed, and cause the same to be filed in the Great Seal Patent Office within six calendar months next and immediately after the date of the said Letters Patent. 30

NOW KNOW YE, that I, the said Christian Von Hennings, do hereby declare the nature of the said Invention, and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement thereof, that is to say:—

Von Henning's Extract from Mountain Ash Berries.

The object of this Invention is to prepare an extract from the berries of the mountain ash, suitable more especially for being used medicinally, as I have discovered that the extract of these berries possesses medicinal properties of great value in cases of colds, influenzas, and such like. For 5 this purpose I boil or simmer the berries for about 4 hours in just sufficient water to cover them, I then strain off the liquor from the berries without compressing them, and I add to the liquor an equal quantity of sugar, and again boil or simmer it for about half an hour, and subsequently, whilst still warm I pour the prepared extract into 10 glasses or other suitable receptacles in which it will set as a jelly.

What I claim is the preparation of an extract from the berries of the mountain ash, substantially as described.
