The said Invention consists in a solution of tribasic phosphate of lime 10 in cod liver oil by passing a current of carbonic acid gas in a mixture of gelatinous tribasic phosphate of lime and cod liver oil under different degrees of pressure. Under ordinary atmospheric pressure a solution of one and a half per cent. of the tribasic phosphate of lime is obtained in one hundred of the oil.
