PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by James Russell Chibnall at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 30th January 1857.

I, JAMES RUSSELL CHIBNALL, of the City of Westminster, Baker, do hereby
5 declare the nature of the said Invention for "**AN IMPROVED METHOD OF BURNING OR CONSUMING SMOKE,**" to be as follows:—

My Invention consists in placing in a chimney flue, smoke way, or channel
a gas burner, or coil, or bent gas pipe, perforated at intervals for the issue of
gas. The gas being lighted and the smoke passing through the burner
10 becomes burnt or consumed. The heat from the gas and burnt products of
combustion may be utilized or not, as required.
