

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by the said Leon Salles de la Magdeleine at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 3rd February 1858.

I, Leon Salles de la Magdeleine, Gentleman, of Paris, (France,) do 5 hereby declare the nature of the said Invention for "An Improved Manure" to be as follows:—

The Invention consists in a liquid manure, in which the grain or seeds are to be steeped before sowing them, or with which the plants may be watered; the same is composed of common salt, desiccated night soil, or other animal dung reduced to a fine powder, water of ammonia, and ashes from wood, peat, or other vegetable matters, the entire mixed up with a suitable quantity of water so as to form a liquid, in which the grains or seeds are to be steeped before sowing them, or with which the plants may be watered.
