Treating Sewage.

PROVISIONAL SPECIFICATION left by Charles Bartholomew at the Office of the Commissioners of Patents, with his Petition, on the 20th July 1870.

This Invention has for its object improvements in treating sewage and in manufacturing manure. For these purposes I pass sewage through a filter charged with earth, and to accellerate the flow and also 10 simultaneously to cause air to traverse the filter I employ suction or air pressure. In this way the sewage is exposed to the oxidizing action of the air whilst in the filter and in contact with the earth which it contains, this greatly aids in rendering it innoxious.

To prevent the earth in the filter becoming spent and clogged with 15 the impurities of the sewage without stopping the operation of the filter I remove some of the earth continuously or from time to time from the bottom of the filter and add fresh earth at the top.

The earth removed from the filter is valuable as a manure.
