Standing BY-LAWS

OF THE

CORPORATION

OF THE

GOVERNORS of the Foundling Hospital and Work-house.

WHEREAS it is abfolutely neceffary for maintaining the good Police of the Hofpital, that there be a proper Subordination of Officers and Servants, and that one Perfon fhould be appointed as Superintendant, with Authority to infpect and report the Conduct of all the other Officers (except the Chaplain) and Servants: — And the Treafurer, from the great Truft repofed in him, the ample Security given by him, and the large Salery allowed him, being the proper Officer for that Purpofe,

RESOLVED, I. That the Treasurer be the fuperintending Officer for the Purposes aforefaid.

II. That the Chaplain, Treasurer, Register, Superintendant of the Factories, Matron, House-A 2 keeper keeper and Apothecary, be confidered as refident Officers, have Apartments in the Houfe, and take Rank in the Order here named.

III. That the Phylician, Surgeon, Supervilor of the Tax on Houfes, and the Collectors be confidered as Extern Officers; and that no Officer employed in this Holpital be permitted to act by Proxy, unlefs by an Order of a general Board or Court of Affiftants, on his Sicknefs or other unavoidable Neceffity.

IV. That all other Perfons employed in the Houfe (the allowed Deputy of any Officer and the head Nurfe-keeper excepted) be confidered as Servants.

V. That no Perfon be permitted to lodge within the Walls of the Houfe, except the Officers and their Families, the deputy Matron, Treafurers, Clerk and head Nurfe-tender, the Servants employed in the Houfe, and the feveral Factory Mafters and Miftreffes, except fuch as may be licenfed thereto, by express Order of a general Quarterly Affembly, upon Petition of fuch Perfons, fhewing juft Reafons why fuch Licence fhould be granted.

VI. That no dead Body be taken out of the Hofpital, unlefs by Order of the Treafurer, on application of the Parents or Friends of the deceased, for its Interment.

VII. That each refident Officer be allowed to employ two of the Children as Servants, the Deputy Matron, Treasurers Clerk, the head Nursekeeper of the Infirmary and the Butler, one each, and no more; with a Power of retaining fuch Child or Children in their Service for the fpace of two Years, if they shall chuse it; the Girls to be diffinguished by white Aprons, to be worn on Sundays, and on all Days of publick Appearance; the Boys, by Brafs Buttons on their Clothes : every Child fo employed to be appointed by the Treafurer, and his or her Name to be entered with the Register. All Perfons fo employing fuch Children being accountable for their Conduct. And that none of the Perfons above defcribed, be permitted to take any Child into his or her Service, who has been discharged from the Service of any other for Idleness, or other Misdemeanor, without the Confent of fuch other, first had in Writing; the Treafurer taking care to report to the Court of Affiftants, if any fuch Child shall be treated unreasonably or feverely.

VIII. I. That the Children of eight Years old and upward, do rife every Morning at Six of the Clock in the Summer; that is from the twentieth of March to the first Day of October, and at Sun-rife in the Winter.

2. For the better preferving Regularity and good Order, when the Children are at Breakfast, Dinner and Supper, and to prevent their Nurfes from defrauding them of any Part of their Pro-A 3

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visions, that the feveral Officers do attend in the Hall, in Rotation at all such Times, so that one or more of them be constantly there, and that the superior Officer present have full Authority (for the Time) of punishing all such as shall be guilty of any Irregularity, in the same Manner as the Treasurer could do, were he present, reporting the fame in Writing to the said Treasurer.

3. That the Hour for the Childrens Breakfaft, be immediately after Morning Prayers; of Dinner at Twelve o'Clock, and Supper at Six in the Summer; and in Winter, Breakfaft immediately after Prayers; Dinner at One o'Clock, and Supper at Night-fall; the Children to have a full half Hour, from the Time of laying down their Food, to eat their Dinner in, a half Hour Glafs being fet in fome confpicuous Part of the Hall . for that Purpofe.

IX. That as many of the Children as are capable of it, be employed in inftructing the others in Reading, Writing and Accompts.

X. That the grown-up Children, and fuch of the grown-up People as are able, be employed in the Duties of the Houfe.

XI. That no Officer, except the Treasurer, do prefume to fend any grown-up Perfon, about any Bufiness or Message out of the House, at the Time of Dinner, or before the Hour of Twelve at Noon, or after the Hour of Six o'Clock in the Evening.

XII. That

XII. That no Servant or Nurse be permitted to go out of the Hospital without a Ticket from the Officer in whole Department fuch Perfon shall be employed, (which Ticket shall specify the Day and Hour of granting the fame, and the Time for which it is to be in force) that is to fay, that all Nurses and Servants in the infant Department, do, previous to their going out, produce fuch Ticket from the Matron; the Mantuamaker, Hall Nurfes, female Servants, and female aged Poor, from the Houfe-keeper; all Perfons employed in inftructing the Children in the Manufactures carried on in the Hofpital, from the Superintendant of the Factories; (who may appoint fix of the best grown Boys to be fent of Meffages, relative to faid Manufactures, by Tickets figned by himfelf, and no Child to be fent from the working Schools by any Perfon without his Permission,) all Nurses and female Servants in the new and furgical Infirmaries, from the head Nurse-keeper (provided she permit no one of faid Nurfes to go out of the Hofpital more than once in each Day, and that only for the fpace of two Hours each Time, nor more than one to be abfent at one Time :) and all School Mafters and Miftreffes, the Taylor, male Servants and male aged Poor, and the Children, from the Treasurer : he taking Care, if any Abuse shall appear in the granting faid Tickets, to admonish the Officer to offending; and if the Abuse shall still continue, to inform the Governors thereof.

XIII. That

XIII. That a Book be provided by the Treafurer, in which every Governor, or vifiting Lady, may write his or her Obfervations of the State and Conduct of the Family; which Book is to be kept by the Matron, and produced to every Vifitor who shall vifit the House and demand the fame.

XIV. That the refpective Offices be open for transacting the Business of the Hospital, from the Hour of Eight in the Morning to that of Two in the Afternoon.

XV. That no Apothecary be hereafter elected unlefs he fhall have ferved an Apprenticefhip to a regular *Proteftant* Apothecary, and can produce a Certificate from his faid Mafter, of his Service, Abilities and good Behaviour during his faid Apprenticefhip; and in cafe faid Mafter fhall be dead, or at fuch Diftance as that fuch Certificate cannot be had, he fhall procure a Certificate of his fufficiency from the Mafter and Wardens of the Corporation of Apothecaries, or two eminent Apothecaries of this City, and from the Phyfician, that he is qualified for that Office.

XVI. That the Bedfteads in all the Dormitories and Infirmaries be changed in Rotation, once in every Month, according as there shall be spare ones for that Purpose; and that those not in Use be opened in the Air, and well beaten, so as to shake out any Vermin that may be therein.

XVII. That

XVII. That no Perfon be employed as an Officer, or Servant, (except for nurfing and nurfetending, in the infant Department) who is not a Proteftant.

XVIII. That in the Month of October in every Year, the Treasurer and House-keeper do review, the whole Furniture of the Hospital, and that the Treasurer do return a Schedule of the same, countersigned by the House-keeper, to the general Quarterly-Assembly in November, distinguishing the Parts of the Hospital, and the Apartments of the Officers, to which such Furniture shall belong, and marking the State and Condition in which the fame shall be found, and whether any may be wanting that was in the last Year's Schedule.

XIX. That the Proceedings of the Governors, at all Courts or Committees, be truly entered by the Register, in a rough Book kept for that Purpose, and figned by the Chairman, otherwise such Proceedings not to be allowed as the Act of that Meeting.

XX. That proper Rooms be always provided for the Phyfician to inoculate fuch Children in, as he shall think do require the same.

XXI. That when the Number of Sick shall increase in the Infirmaries, so as to make an Affistant necessary, one of the best grown-up Girls of the House shall be appointed as an Afsistant to the Nurse in any Ward where wanted, upon the CerCertificate of the Phyfician, and to continue therein fo long as he shall direct, and no longer.

XXII. That one Phyfician only be appointed hereafter to attend this Hofpital.

XXIII. That the Phyfician and Surgeon, or (in cafe of Sicknefs or other neceffary Abfence) the Phyfician or Surgeon, who fhall attend for either of them refpectively, do fign their Names in a Book, to be kept by the Register for that Purpofe; faid Book to be returned to the Governors at each general Quarter-Affembly.

XXIV. That in all Elections for any Governor or Officer of this Corporation, a large Balloting-Glass be fet upon the Table, before the Chair, at the Hour of One, and do remain there until the Hour of Two, and that each Governor having written the Name of the Candidate whom he would chufe to elect (or if there be more than one Vacancy for Covernor, or for any Office) the Names of fuch of the Candidates as he fhould chufe to be elected, on a piece of Paper, he do deliver the fame, rolled up, to the Chairman, to be put by him into the Balloting-Glass; the Regifter and no other Perfon fitting at the Table with the Chairman, during the whole Time of balloting, and writing down the Name of each Governor as he shall have balloted; and that at the Hour of Two, (after which Hour no Perfon shall be permitted to ballot) a Committee of Five Perfons be appointed, to which Number the Propofer

pofer of each Candidate may be added, if he fhall think proper, to examine the Papers in faid Glafs, and report to the Board what Perfon or Perfons fhall have the greateft Number of Votes; fuch Perfon or Perfons to be then declared duly elected. No Perfon to be balloted for on that Day, who fhall not have been proposed immediately at, or before the Hour of One.

XXV. That no Election to any permanent Office or Employment under this Corporation, and above the Rank of a Servant, be deemed Valid, unlefs fuch intended Election fhall have been previoufly advertifed three fucceffive Times (at the leaft) in fome noted publick News-Paper of this City, and Notice thereof given in the Summonfes for the General Board at which fuch Election is to be held.

XXVI. That no Motion that may affect the Salaries or Profits of any Officer of this Houfe, I hall be debated on the first Proposal, but I hall be referred to the next General Board enfuing, and fuch Resolution I hall be only proposed at a General Board.

XXVII. That no Candidate for the Place of Governor, or Officer, be ever permitted to canvals for Votes in the Room where any Board shall be fitting, or be admitted into the Room where the Ballot shall be held, until the faid Ballot and Scrutiny shall be entirely finished.

XXVIII. 1. That

XXVIII. 1. That no Sum of Money be granted to any Officer or Deputy of an Officer of this Corporation, either as a Bounty or increase of Salary, except by a general Quarterly-Affembly, upon the Report of a Committee of not less than five Governors appointed by a general Board, fourteen Days (at the least) before the Quarterly-Affembly, at which fuch Report shall be made, and that Notice be always given in the Summons for faid Quarterly-Affembly, that fuch Report is then to be made.

2. That no Motion, Petition or Memorial for fuch Bounty or increase of Salary which has been rejected by a general Assembly, be again offered within one Year from the Day of first making or prefenting faid Motion, Petition or Memorial; and that fuch Motion, Petition or Memorial be made or prefented in Writing to a general Board, fourteen Days (at the least) before it shall be taken into Confideration, Notice being given in the Summonfes for the Board, at which such Proposal is to be confidered, that said Proposal was formerly rejected.

XXIX. That if any Cloathing, Provisions or other Article, for the Use of the House, which shall not appear to be good in its Kind, be offered to any Officer, or Servant, whose Duty it is to distribute the same, such Person shall immediately call upon the Treasurer, to name three of the other resident Officers of the House, to examine said Article; and if they shall judge it not to be good good in its Kind, it shall be returned to the Perfon who fent it in, and another proper Article be provided in its stead.

XXX. That it is the Duty of the Chairman, in all Courts and Committees of this Corporation, to preferve Order and Decency therein, and to ftop all Proceedings until he shall be obeyed in all Matters relative thereto; and that it is the Duty of every Governor to support the Chairman at all Times in the just Execution of such his Office.

XXXI. That all Reports, required by the By-Laws to be laid before the Governors, by any Officer, except the Treafurer, with all Petitions and Complaints, be lodged with the Register in his Office; and that fuch in particular as are to be laid before any general Quarterly-Affembly, be lodged with faid Register twenty-four Hours at the leaft, before fuch quarterly Day, who shall lay a correct Lift thereof, figned by the Treasurer, before faid Court, faid Treasurer noting thereon the Names of all fuch Officers as shall have neglected to give in their Reports or Accounts in due Time; faid Lift to be read, and its Contents confidered, immediately after the reading of the Minutes of the last Court.

XXXII. That the Sum of Ten Pounds be given as a Reward to the Collector of the Tax upon Houfes, who fhall first, (before the first Day of May in every Year) have made up his Accounts, with

with the smallest outstanding Arrear in proportion to the whole Sum given to him in charge for the preceding Year; and the Sum of five Pounds to the Collector, who shall appear to be next in Merit under the fame Confiderations, provided it shall appear to the Governors by the Report of the Supervifor upon Oath, that faid Collectors had (to the beft of his Knowledge and Opinion) done the utmost that could reasonably be expected of them, to collect the Taxes and Arrears given to them in Charge, particularly that Arrear which must be loft by not having been collected within that Year, and that fuch Part of faid Arrear as shall from the faid Report appear to be loft by the evident Neglect of any of the Collectors, be deducted out of the Poundage of fuch Collector for the paft Year, or (if he shall not have enough in his Hands for faid Purpose) from that of the coming Year.

XXXIII. That a Salary not exceeding Five Pounds per Annum be allowed to the High-Conftable of the City of *Dublin*, provided he shall attend the Court of Assistants, and see the Sentences of corporal Punishment pronounced by faid Court duly executed.

XXXIV. That when corporal Punifhment is ordered to be inflicted on any Driver or Carrier of any Hackney-Carriages, Car, Cart, Dray or Sedan, the Sentence be put in execution immediately; and that in all other Cafes no Petition for a rehearing of any Complaint in the Court of Affiftants be received, except upon a Motion made made in faid Court within fourteen Days after the Adjudication complained of, and unlefs faid Petition be figned by the Chairman and two thirds of the Members that were prefent at the original Hearing, certifying that they think there is fufficient Reafon for fuch Rehearing. The Appellant undertaking to pay whatever Cofts the faid Court fhall adjudge againft him, and to give the Complainant Notice in Writing of fuch Rehearing, which is not to be brought on until one Week after fuch Petition fhall be received, and fuch Notice given.

XXXV. 1. That all Accounts of this Hospital be closed on the four following Days in each Year, viz. the 29th of September, 25th of December, 25th of March, and the 24th of June; and that an Abstract of all faid Accounts be returned to the Governors at the quarterly General Assembly, which shall immediately follow said quarterly accounting Days, and at the End of each Year, and shall be sent to every Governor, who shall require it one Week at least before each quarterly General Assembly.

2. That no Officer of this Houfe be obliged to furnilh any fingle Governor, with any Account whatever relative to this Charity, except the Copper-Plate quarterly Account, unlefs fuch Account be ordered by a General Board; as furnifhing fuch Accounts would take up too much of the Officers Time in prejudice to this Charity.

XXXVI. That

XXXVI. That the Governors do, at the first Quarterly Assembly, in every Year, proceed to the Election of a proper Person to execute the Office of Collector of the Rents upon Carriages, and of the casual Revenue, such Person to continue in faid Office for one Year, unless he shall be removed within that Time by a General Assembly.

COUNTRY NURSES.

1. That the Wages of the Country Nurfes be at the Rate of three Pounds per Year, while they fhall give fuck to the Children delivered to their Care from this Hofpital, according to the following Regulations.

2. That all Children under one Month Old, be deemed one Day Old, and the Nurfe be allowed faid Wages for one Year. All from one to three Months Old, to be deemed three Months Old; the Nurfe to be allowed three Quarters Wages. All from three Months to fix, to be deemed fix Months Old; the Nurfe to be allowed two Quarters Wages. All from fix Months to nine, to be deemed nine Months Old; the Nurfe to be allowed one Quarter's Wages : And that the Wages for all Children given to be nurfed after nine Months Old, be at the rate of two Pounds *per* Year, while they fhall remain at Nurfe.

3. That no Child be delivered to any Nurfe, until fuch Perfon shall (if required) have made an Affidavit Affidavit before a Magistrate, that she is not the Mother of faid Child, nor does she know, nor has she heard who are the Parents of faid Child.

4. That fo often as any Nurfe shall demand Wages for nurfing any Child, fhe fhall, before fhe be allowed to receive Payment, make Affidavit (if required by the Matron, Treasurer, or any Governor) that the faid Child was delivered to herfelf at the Hofpital, and has been reared and nurfed by her ever fince, and that fhe is not the Mother of faid Child : unlefs it shall have been found neceffary, thro' Fatality, to change any Nurse in the Country; in which case, the new Nurfe shall, before she receives any Wages for nurfing fuch Child (inftead of the Affidavit herein before prefcribed) make Affidavit that the is not the Parent of fuch Child, nor does the know who are its Parents. And if any Nurse shall change her Refidence in the Country, the thall, before the receives her Wages, produce a Certificate from the Clergyman of the Parish where she shall then refide, of fuch Change of Refidence.

5. That if any Nurfe refule to make fuch Affidavit, her Child be ftruck off the Books, that fhe do forfeit all Wages that may be due to her for faid Child, and that all fuch Affidavits be entered by the Register, and kept among the Records of this Corporation.

6. That the Treasurer, being fully affisted therein by the Register, do present to the quarterly Ge-B neral

neral Affembly in May, in each Year, a Diffribution of the Country Nurfes into Claffes for Payment, according to the Situation of the respective Parishes in which they shall refide, so as to render the Days of Payment most convenient to faid Nurfes, and to prevent Confusion therein; and that fo foon as fuch General Affembly shall have appointed a Day or Days for the Payment of each Clafs, the Register do give Notice to the Clergyman of each Parish, of the Day appointed for the Payment of the Nurfes of his Parish; and if there be no Church in which divine Service is celebrated in fuch Parish, then to the Clergyman who is employed in the difcharge of the occasional Duties of faid Parish, or in his Absence, to the next refident Clergyman, Justice of the Peace, or other convenient Perfon, requefting, in the Name of the Governors, that he will caufe faid Notice to be published, and communicated to all fuch Nurfes.

7. That no Money be paid by the Treasurer to any Nurse who thall not produce her Child at the Hospital, on such Days as shall be appointed by the Governors for that Purpose, and bring him a Certificate from the Register that the Name and Number of the Child agree with the Entry in his Book; also the Wages due (which Return the Register shall make at the Foot of a Warrant to be sent to him by the Matron, certifying the Appearance of the Child) the Treasurer's Clerk, or such other Officer as the Governors shall from Time to Time appoint, countersigning faid War-

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rant, as a Witnefs that he has feen faid Amount of Wages paid by the Treafurer; which Warrant, fo counterfigned, fhall be a fufficient Voucher to the Treafurer to credit himfelf for faid Payment; and that no Child be taken in from the Care of the Country Nurfes until it fhall have attained to the Age of feven Years and nine Months at leaft.

8. That no more than five Shillings and five . Pence be advanced by the Treasurer to any Country Nurfe, upon her receiving a Child, and that only upon the Warrant of the Matron, certifying that fhe does not believe faid Child to be more than fix Months Old, faid Warrant being endorfed by the Register as being entered by him: and if the Treasurer or Register shall have Reason to think, either from Information or otherwife, that any Child fo given to Nurfe is not in a proper State of Health to be fent out of the Hofpital, that they do call upon the Apothecary, who, if he fees Reafon, shall stop the fending out of such Child, until the Phyfician or Surgeon can be confulted upon the Propriety of its being given to Nurfe.

9. That if any Nurse shall fail to come on the Day appointed for her Payment as aforefaid, her Child be struck off the Books (by the Register) on the Day of the next Quarterly-Assembly (but one) which shall follow faid Day or Days of Payment, and no Wages be ever afterwards allowed for the nursing of said Child, except for the first Year it shall have been at Nurse, unless the shall,

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on or before faid Day, prove by an Affidavit, fworn before fome neighbouring Magistrate, and verified by a Certificate from the officiating Clergyman of faid Parifh, or in his Abfence by the next refident Clergyman; which Certificate shall be on the fame Paper with the Affidavit, that the did not hear of the Day appointed for Payment in fufficient Time, or that the was prevented from bringing up the Child named --- N° ---- on that Day by Sickness (mentioning the Diforder) of the Child or its Nurse or other unavoidable Neceffity, or that from the fmall Amount of Wages due to her on the first Day on which fhe could be paid (the fame not being more than the Sum of fifteen Shillings) fhe fhall chufe to defer the faid Payment until the next Year, she fending up to the Register, on faid first Day of Payment, a Certificate from the officiating Clergyman of the Parish where she shall refide, or in his Absence, from the next refident Clergyman, of the faid Child's being alive, and of its State of Health, in Words to this Purpose; "I A. B. Rector (or as it may be) of the Parish of ---- do certify that I have feen the Child named --- N° ----, in the care of ---- of faid Parish, and that it is in ---- State of Health :" all which Requifites being performed, the Treasurer shall immediately pay fuch Nurfe her Wages, returning the Affidavit and Certificate to the next Court of Affiftants or General-Affembly, fubject neverthelefs to all the Regulations and Reftrictions made or to be made in regard to the Payment of Nurfes Wages.

10. That

10. That the Treasurer do pay the full Amount of Wages to any Nurfe whofe Child shall die, upon her producing the Matron's Certificate (counterfigned by the Register, with the Amount of Wages due to her) fetting forth that fhe had feen the dead Body of fuch Child, and what its Number was on the Arm, or upon her producing (in one Month after the death of faid Child) the Affidavit of fome creditable Perfon, no way interefted therein, fworn before a neighbouring Magiftrate, and verified by a Certificate from the Clergyman who shall have buried faid Child, or in his Absence by the next refident Clergyman; which Certificate shall be on the same Paper with the Affidavit, fetting forth that fuch Perfon had feen fuch Child, and that the Mark on the Arm was ----, and that he was prefent at its Burial in the Church-Yard of ----, in the County of ----, on the ---- Day of ---- in the Year ----, and that it had died of fuch infectious Diforder as made it dangerous to bring faid Child to the Hospital, the Certificate of the Matron being annexed thereto, (counterfigned by the Register as aforefaid) fignifying that fhe had examined faid Affidavit, and that it agreed with her Book.

11. That the Register do not make out any Order for bringing any Child from the Country where it is, or shall be at Nurse, until the Person applying for, and obtaining, an Order from a General-Board or Court of Assistants, for that Purpose, shall have deposited the Sum of three Halfpence for each Mile the Nurse shall be necessarily B 3 obliged obliged to travel, in bringing home faid Child to the Hofpital, for the Use of said Nurse; together with fuch Sum (not lefs than ten Shillings, the Treasurer debitting himself for the same) as the Court shall have appointed to be paid for the nurfing of the Child, which Child the Treasurer thall not deliver to the Perfon fo demanding it, without a Certificate from the Matron, fetting forth that the Name and Mark on the Arm of faid Child correspond with the Name given in, on its Reception into the Hofpital, and the Mark thereon given to fuch Child. Soldiers, who have been ordered Abroad on Foreign Service, to have back their Children, on their return Home, without any other Coft than three Halfpence per Mile, as aforefaid, for the Nurfe's travelling Charges : and if any Child shall be re-demanded before it shall be given to a Nurse, that it be reftored in the fame Clothes in which it was given in, and all fuch Children to be immediately ftruck off the Books.

Apprenticing of Children.

1. That no Child be apprenticed to any Officer or Servant of the Houfe.

2. That no Child be bound Apprentice from the Hofpital, unlefs the Perfon applying for fuch Child shall lodge with the Register, in his Office, a Certificate, figned by the Church-Wardens and three respectable *Protestant* Householders of the Parish

Parish where he or she shall refide, and counterfigned by the Minister of the same, testifying that they know him or her to be a Protestant Inhabitant thereof, of good Fame, and of Abilities to maintain fuch Apprentice in a decent and comfortable Manner, which they believe to be his or her Intention; which Certificate, being figned by the Chairman of the Court where it shall be prefented, shall be kept by the Register, together with the Indenture of Apprenticeship of fuch Child, and shall be the only Warrant for the proper Officer to bind out faid Child : Provided that this Order shall not reftrain or take away the Power, which the Governors, in a Court of Affiftants, or General-Affembly, now have of apprenticing any of the Children of this Houfe to fuch Protestants as they thall know or believe to be of good Character.

3. That the Register do lay all such Certificates before the first General-Assembly, or Court of Asfistants, that shall meet after the lodging of the same; and that the Court do confider faid Certificates immediately after the reading of the Minutes of the last Court, and before it shall proceed upon any other Business whatever.

4. That every Perfon applying for a Child, fhall, if he or fhe require it, have a Certificate from the Phyfician, Surgeon or Apothecary, that fuch Child does not, at the Time of faid Application, labour under any latent Complaint which may difable it from being ferviceable.

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OFFICERS DUTIES.

RESOLVED, that the Duty of each Officer and Servant be particularly afcertained, and that they do feverally observe the following Rules:

CHAPLAIN.

I. That the Duty of the Chaplain be to attend in Perfon to read Prayers in the Chapel, immediately after the Hour of the Children's rifing, every Day, except Sunday, and on Sunday to read Prayers and preach, at the Hour of Eleven in the Forenooh; and to read Prayers at Five o'Clock in the Evening, from the first Sunday in April, to the first of October, in every Year; and on proper Notice, to attend to chriften the Children, vifit the Sick, and at Ten o'Clock on each Day, to bury the Dead; or, in cafe of Sicknefs, or other fufficient Caufe of Absence, to procure some wellqualified Clergyman to perform the faid religious Offices, whole Name shall be regularly entered in a Book to be kept by the Register for that Purpofe : and in all other Points relative to his refpective Duties, as Chaplain and Superintendant of the Education of the Children, to act in ftrict Conformity to the following Regulations:

2. That forty Children be put under the Care of each Mafter and Miftrefs, which at an Average will be nearly the Number of Children in the Houfe; but that if the Number fhould increase, the Number to each School, proportional to the Number Number in the School, be divided into four Claffes; that each Mafter and Miftrefs from the Hour of Nine until One, fhall take each Clafs in Rotation for one Hour out of the Factories into a feparate Room, returning them at the Expiration of the Hour, and then taking another Clafs till the whole are inftructed, and that the Inftructions then given them, fhall be in Spelling, Reading and Catechifing.

3. That during the four School Hours in the Evening, the Writing-Mafter and Miftreffes shall take the Children in such Numbers as that every Child may be instructed in Writing and Arithmetick at least twice in each Week.

4. That it is the Duty of the School-Mafters and School-Miftreffes only to teach the Children the Church Catechifm and Explanation of it, and that if any Child who has been one compleat Year in the Houfe has not the Church Catechifm, or any Child who has been two Years in the Houfe, the Explanation of it ready by Heart, the Mafter or Miftrefs (except in cafes of particular Difability) be, upon the Reprefentation of the Chaplain, punifhed or difmiffed.

5. That all School-Mafters and School-Miftreffes be under the Superintendance of the Chaplain, who fhall vifit each School at leaft once in every Week, and enter in a Book, properly prepared and ruled for that Purpofe, his Obfervations on the Proficiency ency of the Children, and of the Care and Neglect of the respective Masters and Mistreffes.

6. That he do prefent faid Book at the end of each Quarter to the quarterly General-Affembly, and if at any Time the Number of Children in the Houfe fhall increase, fo as to make more Master or Mistresses necessary; or decrease, fo as to require fewer, or if the Masters and Mistresses shall not obey him in all Matters relative to the Education of the Children, he do apply to the Court of Assistants, which is empowered by Law to superintend the faid Education.

7. That fuch of the Children as have the Church Catechifm and Explanation of it by Heart, be further inftructed by the Chaplain in Perfon, fo as to be enabled to comprehend the Senfe and Meaning of what he repeats, and of confequence to give a rational Anfwer to any Queftion in the Catechifm, altho' proposed in different Words, the means of which, by familiar Difcourfe and proper Illustrations, his Knowledge and Judgment will readily fuggest.

8. That a Lift being made of fuch Children as are thus prepared for the perfonal Inftruction of the Chaplain, he do from the firft Day of April, to the firft of October in every Year, employ an Hour at leaft every Sunday Morning immediately after Divine Service in this Exercife, as alfo at other Times when he occafionally vifits the Schools.

9. That

9. That the Chaplain shall every other Sunday, give from the Pulpit, instead of a Sermon, a Lecture on some Part of the Catechism, or read a proper Portion of Archbishop Secker's Lectures published on that Subject.

10. That proper Books be purchased for the Use of the elder Children; such as the Works of the Bishop of Sodor and Mann, that by Lady Mayne for the Use of Children, published here, or others which may be hereafter chosen.

11. That the Chaplain make it his Business to enquire into the State of such adult Persons as are in the House, that he require their Attendance at the Sacrament at proper Times, if qualified for it, or if not, that he instruct and prepare them for it, reporting to the Governors the State of the Family in this respect at each quarterly General Affembly.

12. That at each Quarterly Examination fifty Children, beginning with those longest in the House, shall be examined; the Names of whom shall be regularly entered by the Register in a Book to be kept for that Purpose; and that if all the Children, who have the Explanation of the Catechism, shall not by this Means be examined at the last Examination in the Year, fifty of those unexamined shall be chosen by Lot out of those that remain, and some extraordinary Day be appointed for the Examination of the same.

13. That

13. That the Chaplain do not accept of any other Office in the Church, which may be incompatible with his *Sunday* Duty in the Hofpital.

TREASURER.

1. That the Duty of the Treasurer be to procure, upon the cheapest and best Terms, all Articles of Food, Cloathing, Firing, and whatever else may be wanting for the Use of the Hospital, except such as are contracted for by the Governors and to see that each Article be good in its Kind.

2. To make no Payment for any Article of Food, Cloathing, $\mathcal{C}c$. unlefs upon a Certificate figned by the Perfon receiving the fame; and if they be Groceries, Drugs, $\mathcal{C}c$. for the Sick, counterfigned by the Apothecary; or, if they be delivered to himfelf, then figned by himfelf, teftifying the Time of fuch Receipt and good Quality thereof; which Certificate muft be entered by the Register, and endorfed by him before it be offered for Payment to the Treafurer.

3. To pay the Officers and Servants their Salaries and Wages one Quarter before the other becomes due, on a Return to be made to him for that Purpofe, and figned by the Register, unless an Order by a General-Affembly or Court of Affiftants to the contrary.

4. To pay to the Country Nurses all Wages that shall appear due to them by the Register's ReReturns, taking Care to adhere ftrictly to every Regulation contained in the By-Laws made upon that Subject, and feeing that all other Officers concerned in faid Payment do punctually obferve the fame.

5. To advance upon no Pretence whatfoever, any Money to the Matron of the Foundlings, or any other Perfon, to be by her or them expended, unlefs authorifed by the Court of Affiftants or General-Affembly, and to receive and enter the Particulars whereon fuch Money was expended, before he advances a further Sum to the fame Perfon.

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6. To lay before the Governors, at each quarterly General-Affembly in every Year, an Abstract of all the Accounts of the Hospital, according to the Plan established for that Purpose, and within three Months (at the farthest) after every 24th Day of *June*, to lay before the Governors, at a General-Assembly, a State of his Accounts for the preceding Year, specifying his Receipts and Payments, the Funds and Arrears due to, and the Debts due by, the Corporation; the Number of Children, and the whole State of the Charity; all which faid Accounts are to be printed for the Use of the Governors. — And with regard to the interior Management of the House,

7. To fee that every Officer and Servant do obferve the feveral Rules and Regulations prefcribed; to attend to the Oeconomy, good Management and and Regularity of each Department, and fo to conduct himfelf as may be most effectual for the Interest of the Corporation, Care, Health and Education of the Children, and good Order of the Family, admitting no improper Perfons into the Hospital to converse with the Children; and to report to the Governors, at every quarterly General-Affembly, the Mifconduct or Negligence of any Officer that could reafonably have come to his Knowledge, with the Names of all fuch Officers as shall neglect to make the quarterly or other Returns prefcribed by the By-Laws, or any continued Neglect of the punctual Observance of faid By-Laws that shall prevail in the Hospital. under a Penalty of fuch Sum (not lefs than twenty Shillings, nor more than five Pounds Sterling) as the Governors, at any quarterly General-Affembly, shall think proper to lay upon him, for each fuch Offence or Neglect he shall not fo report. one Half thereof to be paid to the Informer, and the other Half to the Charity, which Fine shall be entered by the Register; and if the Treasurer shall fail to pay one Half thereof to the Informer. and to give Credit in his next quarterly Account for the Amount of the other Half, he shall be discharged from his Office, and another Person shall be elected in his Stead.

8. To difcharge, or fine, in any Sum not exceeding five Shillings, any Servant, Nurfe, or other Perfon, (not an Officer, or allowed Deputy of an Officer) for any Mifdemeanor or Neglect; and any Perfon aggrieved by fuch Difcharge, or Fine imimposed by the Treasurer, on entering a Complaint thereof with the Register within forty-eight Hours after the same, may appeal to the next Court of General-Assembly, or Court of Assistants, (which shall first meet) for their final Decision.

9. To return to the Register an Account of such Servants as shall have incurred any pecuniary Penalty by the Transgression of any Rule, specifying the Nature of such Transgression and the Amount of the Fine to be entered by the Register, who shall check such Servant in the Amount thereof, and deduct the same in his or their Accounts, and credit the Corporation therewith, unless altered or taken off by the Court of General-Assembly, or Court of Assistants.

10. To deliver quarterly to the Collector of the Rents upon Carriages, printed Acquittances flitched in Books, one Book for each Denomination of Carriage, with fo many Duplicates, each Book to contain fo many Receipts as the Register shall charge him with in his Return for that Quarter, and no more; every such Receipt to be counterfigned by him, in the same Manner as the Receipts for collecting the Tax upon Houses are figned by the Supervisor, and that no Receipt be allowed by this Corporation, but such as are so counterfigned by the Treasure.

REGISTER.

1. That the Duty of the Register be to keep a clear regular Account of all the Children received into

into the Houfe of all Deaths, with their Caufes, fpecifying the Nature of each, as returned to him by the Apothecary; and to lay the fame before the general Quarterly-Affembly in May, in each Year; diffinguishing the Infirmaries in which they shall happen, with a Computation of the Proportion, the Deaths of all Perfons of fix Years old and upwards, shall bear to the Numbers of fuch fed in the House during faid Year; of all Children fent to and returned from Nurfe; of all apprenticed out, delivered to Parents, eloping or enlarged; of the Names and Places of Abode of the feveral Nurfes; the Marks and Names of the Children delivered to them; to calculate the Wages due to the feveral Nurfes, purfuant to the Rules made for regulating their Wages, and return the fame, endorfed by himfelf, as entered for Payment to the Treasurer, having first made an Entry thereof in a Book to be by him kept for that Purpofe.

2. To file all Certificates returned to him by any Officer, Tradefman, or other Perfon, to endorfe none for Payment where the Quality of the Goods, or Commodities therein fpecified, is not certified to be Good, and enter an Abstract of the fame in a Book to be kept for that Purpofe.

3. To keep a Book for, and produce the fame to, every Perfon (except the Chaplain) who fhall perform religious Service, or any religious Office in the Hofpital, and to the Phyfician and Surgeon, or any Perfon officiating for them, to enter their Names Names in, and to lay faid Book every Monday Morning before the Treasurer, to be authenticated by his figning it.

4. To enter every Complaint offered to him in a Book fo formed, that the Governors may fee at one View, under their proper Heads, the Number of Summonfes iffued, the Name of each Complainant, the Caufes of Complaint, the Adjudication, the Penalty inflicted, the Part thereof accruing to the Hofpital, and the Part to the Complainant, the Date of iffuing the Warrant, and what Perfons were reimburfed, the Coft of fummoning, on giving their Share of the Fine imposed to the Charity. with a Blank for neceffary Obfervations, (the Collector of the Cafual Revenue having conftant Accefs to the fame) to fee that the Entries therein be conftantly compared, by the Chairman of the next Court of Affiftants, with the rough Minutes of the preceding Day, and figned by faid Chairman; and on each Quarter Day to deliver the faid Book to the Treasurer, fo that he may fettle Accounts with the Collector for the preceding Quarter.

5. To fign his Name to every Summons, and fill the fame, or caufe it to be filled, according to the Complaint, before iffuing it, and not to fill any Summons until the Complaint be first entered in his Book.

6. To keep a regular Account of all Carriages and Chairs licenfed, and to return the fame to C the the Treasurer, on the fourth quarterly Accounting Days, figned and attested by himself, together with an Account of the Tax that became due on fuch Carriage on faid Days.

7. To keep a regular Account of all Children delivered by a Parent, or other Perfon, or with a Name, their Sex, Age, and whence brought from, their Mark and Date of Admiffion, diftinguifhing those in the Country from those in the Hospital, ftriking immediately off the Books all such as thall die, and to file all Reports of Sickness of the Children as returned to him by the Apothecary.

8. To enter all faid Accounts in a proper Book, and deliver the fame to the Treasurer on the *Monday* after the 24th of *June*, in every Year, or an Abstract thereof; and also an Account, figned by himself, specifying the Number and Name of every Child at Nurse, on that Day, in the Country, the Name and Place of Abode of each Nurse, the Date of her receiving the Child, the Wages due to her on the 25th of *March*, and what Part thereof is payable at faid Time, with a Blank Column for entering the Payments.

9. To divide the Children in the Houfe into as many Divifions as there are School-Mafters, according to the Nurfes under whofe Care they shall be, to take Care that each School-Mafter do call the Roll of his respective Division, every Day before each Meal, making an immediate Return to the prefiding Officer of the Hall, of such Child or Children, Children, as fhall be absent (who shall enquire into the Cause thereof) and on every Sunday Morning, in the Hall, before the Children go to the Chapel, and that he do call the Roll himself once in each Week.

10. To enter faithfully and exactly, from the rough Draught, figned by the Chairman, all the Proceedings of the Court of General-Affembly and Court of Affiftants, within two Days after fuch Proceedings, and attend the fame and all Committees in all their Meetings, to iffue Summonfes when required, to register and keep all Indentures of Apprentices, to ferve all Orders, and give Notice of the Days of Meeting.

11. To enter all Accounts paffed by any General-Board in the fair Journal, to take down in Writing all Complaints from any Servant or other Per. fon whatever, and lay the fame before the next Court of General-Affembly or Court of Affiftants, which ever shall first meet; and if he shall knowingly or willingly fupprefs, alter, or omit any Part of the rough Draught of the Proceedings of any General-Affembly or Court of Affiftants, or the Treasurers or other Officers Accounts, in transcribing the fame into the fair Journal, or fupprefs any Complaint, Information, or Report lodged with him in his Office to be laid before any Board, that he do forfeit for each fuch Offence fuch Sum (not lefs than ten Shillings, nor more than fifty Shillings) as the Governors, at any quar-C 2 terly
terly General-Affembly, shall think fit to fine him in, to the Use of the Charity, or be dismissed from his Office, and be deemed incapable of serving ever after therein, if the Governors shall think his Offence deserving of such Punishment.

12. To have his Office, Books, Papers, &c. at all Times, within the Office Hours, open to the Infpection of the Treasurer.

13. To lay before the Court of Affiftants, on the first Court Day in every Month, a Lift in Numerical Order, of all fuch Carriages or Sedans, as shall have had their Licences vacated; also a Lift of all such as have been transferred, fignifying when and to whom they shall have been transferred.

SUPERINTENDANT of FACTORIES.

1. That the Duty of the Superintendant of the Factories, be to enquire into and propole to the Governors, from Time to Time, proper Schemes for inftructing and employing the Children in fuch Manufactures as may not be injurious to their Health, and may be most likely to make them useful and defirable Apprentices, and to follow them with Advantage into Life, to carry fuch Schemes for that Purpole into Execution as the Governors shall direct, and diligently to attend to the proper Instruction of the Children therein.

2. To take Care that the Mafters and Miftreffes in the feveral Schools be careful and diligent in keeping keeping the Children at Work without Severity, and to fee that they do not embezzle the Materials given them in Charge, to keep a regular Account of the Expence and Profit of each School, in the way of Debtor and Creditor, and return the fame, or an Abstract thereof, to the Treasurer, within ten Days after each quarterly Accounting Day, and in one Month after the 24th of June in every Year, to account with the Governors for the entire Expence and Profit of the Factories; the fame to be entered in the quarterly and yearly General Abstract given in by the Treasurer.

MATRON.

I. That the Duty of the Matron be to fuperintend the Nurferies, to take Care that the Provifions be properly distributed to the Nurfes, and infant Children, to fee that the Nurfes be kept ftrictly to their Duty; that they do not go out without Leave from her; that Regularity, Cleanlinefs and good Order, be preferved therein, and that a Nurse fit up every Night to waken any Nurfe whofe Child cries; to fee that her Deputy be conftantly in, or about the Nurfery, and that she do perform her Duty in every Particular.

2. To examine all Children admitted, and if found, to have them washed in warm Water; if unfound, to be kept apart until examined by the Phyfician or Surgeon, whole Directions are to be followed; when she is about to hire a Nurse, to call to her Affiftance the Infant Infirmary Nurfe, to

to examine whether fhe is found, and free from Diforders, and if fhe is in any Doubt, the Woman is to be produced to and examined by the Phyfician or Surgeon, and if not approved of, fuch Perfon is not to be taken into the Houfe.

3. To have the Children, when admitted, numbered by a feparate Mark for each Year, that is to fay, all Children admitted from the 24th of June, 1774, to the 24th of June, 1775, to be marked with the Letter A, and N° underneath, beginning with N° I, and in the fucceeding Year to be marked with the Letter B, and numbered in like Manner beginning with N° I, and fo on, with the other Letters of the Alphabet, fucceffively each Year.

4. To deliver to the Country Nurfes fuch Children as are fit to be fent Abroad before the Hour of Twelve in each Day, marking on the Badge delivered with each Child, its Number, and the Day and Year on which it was delivered, to examine all the dead Children brought in by the Country Nurfes, or the Affidavit they fhall produce, and certify the fame, and the Name and Number of every fuch Child, to the Register immediately.

5. To enter in a Book, in Numerical Order, the Names of all Children admitted, as returned to her by the Register, the Times when fent to and returned from Nurse, the Nurse's Name, Place of Abode, Parish and County, and by whom recommended for such Child.

6. To

6. To return to the Register Certificates of all fuch Children as shall be produced to her for Payment, by Country Nurses, specifying the Number, Name and Mark of each Child, and the Time of its being produced.

7. To vifit the Infirmaries for grown Children once at the leaft in every Week, and report to the Treafurer what State fhe finds them in; which Report, if fhe shall defire it, shall be lodged with the Register, to be laid before the next Court of Affistants or General-Assembly.

DEPUTY-MATRON.

1. That the Deputy-Matron do obey all the Orders given to her by the Matron, and in every Respect to behave herself agreeable to the Rules laid down for the Matron to observe.

HOUSE-KEEPER.

1. That the Duty of the Houfe-keeper be to receive all the Linen-Cloathing for the Children, not in the Matron's Charge, and the Coals, and to diffribute the fame, keeping an Account thereof; and on every Quarter-Day to deposite the faid Account with the Register.

2. To receive and diffribute the New-Milk, according to the Register's Returns, and the Matron's Orders, and to keep a regular Account thereof, laying the fame before the Treasurer and Re- C_4 gifter gifter every Monday Morning, and at the End of each Quarter.

3. To attend in the Hall at Breakfaft and all other Meals; and if the Food be not regularly, cleanly, and properly ferved, or if any Child has not his or her full Allowance given, to report the fame to the Treafurer, who fhall punifh the Servant in Fault in a Manner fuitable to the Offence.

4. To examine the Children in the Hall at Breakfaft Time, and if any of them be not combed, wafhed, or have their Clothes flovenly put on, or not properly mended, to return the Name of the Nurfe attending fuch Child to the Treafurer, who fhall fee her punifhed in a Manner fuitable to her Offence, and to call on the Apothecary to examine any Child whom fhe fhall obferve to have any Diforder or Ailment.

5. To vifit the Children's Apartments, once at leaft every Day, to fee that they be kept well cleaned, aired, and that no Linen be wafhed, dried, or fmoothed, in any of the Apartments where the Children fleep; and in particular to infpect the New and Surgical Infirmaries, and fee that they be kept in proper Order, and that every neceffary Attendance be given therein, and to report to the Governors at every quarterly General-Affembly, what State fhe found them in, during the preceding Quarter.

6. To fee that the Hall, Ifle, Chapel, and every other Part of the Houfe, and Buildings be regularly

7. To report to the Treasurer any Neglect she shall observe of any Servant, in any of the foregoing Matters.

PHYSICIAN.

1. That it be the Duty of the Phyfician to vifit the Hofpital regularly every Monday and Friday, and at all Times when fent for; to attend carefully to the Health of the Children, giving his Advice to and prefcribing proper Medicines for all fuch Officers, Servants, Nurfes or aged Poor, as fhall have Occafion for his Affiftance, and fhall require the fame; and to fign his Name to all Prefcriptions ordered by him, or with his Confent, at the end of each Day's Prefcriptions; all fuch Medicines, and none other, to be provided at the Expence of this Corporation.

2. That if the Phyfician fhall find any particular Article of Food prefcribed by the Dietary to difagree with the Children, from the Nature of the Seafon, any Diforder being rife amongft them, or from fuch Article not being to be had good, for a certain Time, he do fufpend the Ufe of fuch Article, for fuch Time as fhall be found neceffary, and fubftitute fome other Article in its Stead, if he fhall fhall think fit, lodging a Report of the fame, with his Reafons for fo doing, with the Register in his Office, to be by him laid before the next Court of Aflistants; and if he shall fee Reafon to make any permanent Alteration, that he do lodge his Report for the same, with the Register as aforefaid, to be by him laid before the Governors at the next General-Assembly that shall meet, for their Determination thereupon.

3. That if the Phylician or Surgeon shall think it prudent to fubftitute any other Kind of Flefh-Meat or other Food, in the Place of fuch as is allowed by the established Dietary, for any of the Children, or other Perfons under their respective Care in the Infirmaries, that they do enter the fame at the Foot of the Prescriptions of each Day, diftinguishing the Kind of Flesh-Meat or other Food, with the Quantities that will be neceffary of the fame, and the Number of Perfons fuch other Food shall be given to, and that the Apothecary, in his daily Returns to the Register. (faid Returns being counterfigned by the head Nurse-tender) do mark the several Kinds of Flesh-Meat or other Provision, with the Quantities thereof, which shall be necessary to be distributed in the Infirmaries in the following Day, with the Quantity of Bread that may be wanted for Poultices, faid Return to be the only Voucher to the House-keeper and Butler for the Delivery of fuch Provisions and Poultice-Bread, the Apothecary entering a Copy of faid Returns in a Book to be kept

kept for that Purpole, faid Book to be figned by the Phylician and Surgeon, in their feveral Departments, on every *Monday* and *Friday*, and to be laid before the Treasurer and Register every following *Monday* Morning, along with the Books of the House-keeper and Butler.

SURGEON.

I. That it be the Duty of the Surgeon to vifit the Hofpital regularly every Day, to attend carefully to all Surgical Complaints of the Children, whether in the Infirmaries, or at large, and to extend his Care to all Officers, Servants, Nurfes, or aged Poor, who fhall have Occafion for his Affiftance, and fhall require the fame.

APOTHECARY.

3. That the Duty of the Apothecary be to enter in a Book, ruled in proper Columns, the Names of the Sick, their Difeafes, Medicines adminiftered, and Times of being received into, and difcharged from the Infirmaries, according to the Manner observed in Steevens's-Hospital.

2. To report in Writing to the Register the Death of each Child, as it shall happen, with the Cause thereof, who shall report the same to the Chaplain; and if it died of such Disorder as may require immediate Burial, to notify the same to him, and that he do return an Abstract of said Book to the Governors, distinguishing each Infirmary mary respectively, particularly that of the Infants, at each quarterly General-Assembly.

3. To wait upon the Phyfician and Surgeon with a Book where all the Prefcriptions are to be regularly entered by them, marking for whom ordered, and if for a Child, its Number to be wrote on the Prefcription, and alfo on the Medicines; faid Book to be laid before the Treafurer, to be compared by him with the Quantities of Medicines brought into the Apothecary's Shop.

4. To obey at all Times, the Directions of the Phyfician and Surgeon, and upon any Complaint of him, to be made by them to the Treasurer, the Treasurer is to lay the same before the Court of General-Assembly or Court of Assistants, whichever shall first meet.

5. To fee that the Nurfes in the New and Surgical Infirmaries, are able to read and write, and well acquainted with all the Duties of Nurfe-keeping and to report to the Treafurer if any of them be not properly qualified, (the Phyfician and Surgeon in their refpective Infirmaries, certifying the fame) who fhall thereupon difcharge fuch Nurfe, and appoint another in her Room; taking Care, if he fhall perceive any Indecency or want of Order prevail in faid Infirmaries, to admonifh the head Nurfe-keeper thereof, and if the fame fhall continue, after fuch Admonition, to acquaint the Treafurer therewith.

6. To

6. To make a daily Return to the Register, of all Perfons that are in the Infirmaries, diftinguishing those who are upon the Meat Diet, from those who are upon the Milk Diet.

HEAD NURSE-TENDER.

I. That the Duty of the head Nurfe-tender be, to take into her Care, every Article of Provisions, Cloathing, Coals, Candles and Furniture neceffary for the Infirmaries; to fee the fame be good in their Kinds, and carefully diftributed; that the Nurfes in each Ward, do conftantly and diligently attend to the Children committed to their Care : that they properly and honeftly diffribute their Provisions to them, and that all Medicines be adminiftered according to the written Direction that shall, from Time to Time, be given to her by the Phyfician, Surgeon and Apothecary; that the whole Houfe be kept properly Clean and free from bad Smells; that the Children's Beds be kept clean and dry, and that the Straw be aired in the Yard, once in every Week, when the Weather permits, and changed in them, as often as may be found neceffary, confiftent with Oeconomy; to fee that no Article of Cookery or Washing be done, in any of the Wards, on any Account whatfoever; that the Back-Yard of the Infirmary be fwept every Morning, by one of the Nurfes, and to pay due Attention to the well-doing of every Thing in that Department, extending her Care, in like Manner, to the Surgical Infirmary, in all Matters in which her Superintendance can be ufeful; and if any Nurfe shall refuse to do the Duty committed to her Care, that she do immediately acquaint the Treasurer therewith, who finding such Complaint well founded, shall discharge said Nurse, and hire another in her Place.

2. To take Care that every Article of Provision, usually prepared in the Kitchen of the Infirmary, for the Use of the Sick, be dreffed in the cleanest and best Manner; and in case of Necessity, that she do give her Affistance and Attendance in the Sick Wards.

BUTLER.

1. That the Duty of the Butler be to receive all the Provisions (except the New-milk) and diffribute the fame to the Family, according to the Dietary established; the Register's Return being his only Voucher for the fame.

2. To keep an Account of all fuch Provisions, in the way of Dr. and Cr. and return the fame to the Treasurer and Register every *Monday* Morning, and at the End of each accounting Quarter.

3. To give no Butter-milk to the Children more than one Day old.

C O O K.

1. That it be the Duty of the Cook, to drefs decently and properly, all Meals both for the Hall and and the Officers, and the Treasurer's Clerk, and to serve the same at the Hours appointed.

2. To ferve no Dinner up on any Account after Four o'Clock, except for an Officer, who shall have been detained abroad by his Attendance on the Governors.

3. To fee that the Deputy-Cook or Kitchen-Maid follow her Directions in every Refpect.

PORTER.

1. That the Duty of the Porter be to attend regularly at the Gate, and fend to the Matron all fuch Children as fhall be delivered to him, under the Age of one Year; and if any Child be offered who fhall appear to be above that Age, to fend for the Matron, or in her Abfence, for her Deputy, to come and examine the Child; and to make a Return to the Register every Morning, of all fuch Children admitted at the Gate, in the preceding twenty-four Hours; with an Account of all Cloathing received with the fame, fpecifying the Kinds, and the Number of each Kind; the Regifter to file the fame, and deliver them to the Treafurer, on each quarterly Accounting-Day.

2. To permit on no Account, any Servant, Nurfe or Child (except the Servants of Officers) at any Time to go out, without a Ticket from the refpective Officers, appointed by the By-Law made for that Purpofe, certifying the Name of fuch fuch Servant, Nurfe or Child; and to return all fuch Tickets, together with the Keys of the Gate (which are to be opened at Six o'Clock in the Morning in Summer, and at Seven in Winter, and locked every Night at Eleven o'Clock, both Summer and Winter) to the Treafurer; marking on the Tickets of the Infirmary Nurfes, the Hour on which each Perfon went out, and came in, and not permitting fuch Nurfe to go out more than once in each Day.

3. To let no Carriage or Chair, brought into the Yard, by any Officer, Servant or Driver, for Rent or Fines, be taken away without a written Order from the Treasurer.

4. To fuffer no Perfon to take out of the Gate, any Provision, Cloathing, or other Things belonging to the House, or Perfons concerned in the House, without first acquainting the Matron or House-keeper thereof, bringing the Person, as well as what was intended to be taken out, to the faid Matron or House-keeper.

5. To fuffer no fpirituous Liquors to come into the Houfe, except for the Use of an Officer, who shall fend a Ticket declaring it to be for himself, and to see all such delivered to such Officer.

6. To permit on no Account, any Hawker, Pedlar, Ginger-Bread Woman, Fish-Monger, or other Person carrying Ware, or Goods for Sale, to to enter the Gate, but to fend Notice to the Officers, if required, of fuch being there.

7. To keep the Key of the burying Ground, and to bury the Dead, beginning at the North-Eaft Corner, and digging regularly to the South-Eaft Corner, along the Eaft Wall, keeping at leaft three Feet from the Foundation of the Wall, and when one Row is finished, to begin another as above directed, and to take Care to have the Graves closed immediately after Interment, and each Burial-Day to ring the Bell, to give Notice of the Interment.

8. To be affifted in digging the Graves by the grown-up Boys; to make the fame three Feet deep at the leaft, and to bury the Dead always at Ten o'Clock in the Forenoon (the Bell being firft rung) unlefs in Cafe of putrid or infectious Diforders, to be certified by the Apothecary, when immediate Interment is neceffary.

9. To permit no dead Body to be taken out of the Houfe, except by the Parents, fhould they require it, for Interment, to be certified by the Treasurer; to fhave regularly all fuch Children as require it, and all the Servants and grown-up Boys of the Houfe who defire it.

NURSES.

1. That the Duty of the Nurfes be, to be anfwerable for the Cloathing delivered to them by D the the Houfe-keeper; and, from Time to Time, to mend and keep the fame in the beft Manner, and to obey the Directions given them by the Houfe-keeper in every Particular; the female Servants to obferve the fame.

Supervisor of the Tax on Houses.

1. That the Duty of the Supervisor of the Tax on Houses, be carefully to supervise all Houses in the City, Liberties and Environs of *Dublin*; to make a Return to the Treasurer, on or before the 28th of *July* in every Year, of the Amount of Tax that became due to the Governors of the *Foundling Hospital*, on the 24th of *June*, preceding, and to return to the Treasurer a weekly Account of the Sums collected by the Collectors respectively.

2. To make out new Collecting-Books for the Collectors every Year, comparing them with the Books of the former Year; alfo Books of Acquittances, with Duplicates of the fame; each Acquittance and its Duplicate to have the fame Number, and to charge each Collector with the full Amount of all Receipts cut out of fuch Books.

3. To take Care that the Collector do not return Houfes in Arrear that are folvent, and that they do give printed Acquittances for all Money by them received; to go annually thro' the feveral Diftricts and take with him the Collector of each Diftrict, in order to examine the Arrears returned

turned by him; and if in the collection of Arrears. he find any Money returned in Arrear which has been returned by the Officer, and his Acquittance is produced for the fame ; he is in fuch Cafe to take up that Acquittance, and give the Party his Receipt for the fame, and lay fuch Acquittance before the Court of Affiftants or General-Affembly.

4. To be very punctual in getting all the new Houses that shall be returned by the Collector unvalued, brought to charge, purfuant to the Powers granted by Act of Parliament, to the Governors of the Foundling-Hospital, for that Purpose, to receive all the old collecting Books yearly, from the Collectors, and upon the clofing of their Accounts in every Year, to lay before the Governors, a true and faithful Report upon Oath, of each Collector's Merit in his Collection for the preceding Year, diftinguishing the Arrear outstanding, in proportion to the Sum to be collected by each, and the Arrears of former Years collected or left outstanding, with a diffinct Report of that Arrear which is loft by not having been collected in that Year, as also of that which will be lost if not collected within the following Year, with the Reafons affigned by the Collectors, as obstructing the Collection of the fame.

5. To take Care that no Collector be appointed two Years fucceffively for the fame Diftrict, and to divide the Diffricts in fuch Manner as may make the least Difference that is possible, of Difficulty

Difficulty or Profit in the Collection of each Diffrict.

COLLECTORS.

I. That the Duty of the Collectors be, to proceed on their Collections on the 25th of June, in every Year, as pointed out by the Supervifor, and to finish their Collections, and perfect their Accounts before the first Day of May following; nor shall they, on any Pretence whatsoever, depute any Perfon or Perfons to act for them as Deputy or Deputies, (nor cut any Acquittance out of the Books given to them by the Supervifor, out of due Courfe, nor give any Acquittance without truly entering the Contents thereof in the annexed Duplicate) and if it shall appear that they received any Money for the Use of the Foundling-Hospital, without giving printed Acquittances for the fame, or thall infert more than one Perfon's Name in one Receipt, they shall be discharged from their Employments.

2. That as they go thro' the feveral Parifhes and Liberties in the City of *Dublin*, and the Environs thereof, they do, by a ftrict Enquiry, endeavour to find out fuch Houfes, as may have efcaped their Obfervation in the laft Year, particularly all Publick-Houfes, and take a particular Account of all new-built Houfes, in their refpective Diftricts, the fame to be entered in Numerical Or der as they ftand.

3. That

3. That they do once at leaft in every Week, attend the Treafurer at his Office, and bring with them all their Duplicate Books, in order that he may compare the fame with the Supervifor's weekly Returns, and receive the Money collected by them, for which they are to take his Receipt.

4. That they be very careful in keeping an exact Registry of the Inhabitants Names and their Places of Abode, and do return their old Books and Duplicates to the Supervisor, fo foon as their respective Collections shall be closed.

Superintendant of the Garden.

I. To purchafe and procure, on the beft and cheapeft Terms, all Kinds of Trees, Plants and Seeds, to fee them carefully and properly planted and fown; to keep a regular Entry of all fuch Trees and Seeds, in a proper Book kept for that Purpofe, and to fee that the Gardener be diligent and attentive to his Directions.

2. To lay before the Governors at the quarterly General-Affembly in *November* annually, a Catalogue of all fuch Trees, $\mathcal{C}c.$ as are fit for Sale; with the Prices of each Kind affixed to the fame; faid Catalogue to be published in fuch Manner as the Governors shall think proper.

3. To return weekly to the Garden Committee, or any one of them, a full Account of all Sales the preceding Week (if any) faid Return to be D 3 figned fighed by fuch Member or Members of faid Committee, and to be his only Voucher, for fuch Sale, in making up his Accounts.

4. To fee all Trees, Shrubs, &c. that are fold, carefully taken up, labelled and packed, and delivered to the Purchafers.

5. To cultivate all fuch Vegetables as may be neceffary for the Food of the Children in the Hofpital, according to the Dietary eftablished for that Purpose; and to see them delivered in such Quantities, and on such Days, as are ordered by faid Dietary; as also, all Medicinal Herbs, neceffary for the Infirmaries, according to a Lift to be given to him by the Physician for that Purpose; and to keep a regular Account of the Delivery of all fuch Vegetables and Medicinal Herbs, charging them in faid Account, at the Prices that shall, from Time to Time, be current in the Markets of Dublin.

GARDENER.

1. To obey the Superintendant's Directions in all Matters relative to the Garden, to give him his Opinion and Advice in all fuch Points of Gardening as the faid Superintendant may be deficient in, to affift in the Labour of the Garden, to take Care that the Labourers employed therein, be diligent, and keep conftantly to their Work, and to keep an Account in the the way of Dr. and Cr. of all Trees, Plants, or other Matters, bought

or

or fold on Account of faid Garden, and to lodge the fame with the Regifter in his Office, to be by him laid before the Governors at each Quarterly-Affembly; and to inftruct as many of the Children of the Hofpital, as the Superintendant fhall point out to him, in budding, grafting, pruning, and all other Parts, either of Kitchen or Nurfery Gardening.

Collector of the Rents upon Carriages and of the Casual Revenue.

1. That every Perfon who fhall be appointed to faid Office, do, before he be allowed to act, give Security to this Corporation, by himfelf and two fufficient Perfons, by Bond and Warrant in the Penal Sum of Five Hundred Pounds conditioned for his duly collecting all Rent and Arrears of Rent, referved on the feveral Licences, and all Fines and Penalties, for which he fhall receive fufficient Warrants, and for paying weekly to the Treafurer all Money he fhall collect, and faithfully and duly fulfilling and performing the feveral Duties of his Office.

2. That he be allowed a yearly Salary, at the Rate of Six-Pence for every twenty Shillings he fhall pay in, to the Treasurer, for the Use of this Charity, or of any Person, except himself; as also, one Moiety of all Fees upon Summonses, and a Fee of one Shilling and one Penny, on the Execution of each Warrant given to him in Charge, and the full Informer's Share of all Penal-

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ties

ties levied in confequence of his Information and Diligence.

3. That when the Owner, Driver, or Carrier of any Carriage, or Sedan Chair, licenfed by this Corporation, fhall be convicted before the Court of Ailiftants, of any Offence for which the Penalty appointed by Law fhall amount to twenty Shillings, or upwards, the Sum of five Shillings, at the leaft, be adjudged for the Ufe of the Informer; and the Sum of two Shillings and fix Pence, at the leaft, when the legal Penalty fhall be lefs than forty Shillings.

4. That fuch Bailiffs as he shall, from Time to Time, appoint to act under him (at his own Cost) being approved of by the Governors, be empowered by them to act in said Office.

5. That if he shall receive any Fee, Promife of a Fee, or other Confideration whatever, for Forbearance in receiving of Rent, Fine, or for any other Cause whatsoever, except the allowed Fees, the same being proved to the Satisfaction of the Governors, he shall be discharged from the faid Office, be rendered incapable of ever again ferving this Corporation, and forfeit his Security, with all such Sums of Money as shall be, at the Time, in the Treasurer's Hands on his Account; and if any of his Bailiss shall be guilty of the like Offence, he shall be in like Manner dismissed, and fined in four Times the Sum so proved to be taken, or promifed to be given, for which Sum faid faid Collector shall be answerable to this Corporation.

6. That if any Perfon, other than faid Collector, or any of his Bailiffs, fhall give Information of any Carriage or Sedan having continued to ply without Licence, or after its Licence fhall have been vacated, for the Space of one Month (the Perfon offending, or any privy with him only excepted) the Collector (in fuch Cafe) fhall be fined in fuch Sum, not exceeding five Pounds, as any Court of Affiftants or General-Affembly fhall think proper, and faid Fine fhall be adjudged to the Informer, over and above his full Share of the Fine to be adjudged againft the Owner of the Carriage, fo informed againft.

7. That he do on every Quarter-Day, make up. his Accounts with the Treasurer, for the preceding Quarter; and that the Treasurer do, in faid Account, charge him with the Amount of all fuch Rents or Fines, given to him in Charge, as he shall not have collected, except fo much thereof as a General-Board may, upon full Evidence upon Oath, be pleafed to order him to difcharge him of, or to respite till his next Account; which Order, with the Substance of the Evidence appearing in the Journal of the Day, figned by the Chairman, shall be the only Voucher to the Treafurer for fo doing; and that he do then pay him whatever Balance shall appear due to him, on Account of the Money paid by him to the Treafurer.

8. That

8. That if he, or any of his Bailiffs, fhall ferve or offer to ferve, any Summonfes not figned by the Register, and filled up by him, or his Order; faid Collector, or any of his Bailiffs, shall forfeit, for every such Offence, committed by him, or any of them, the Sum of five Shillings to be paid to any Person informing thereof.

9 To fix an Office in fome central Part of the City, at his own Expence, to which all Perfons concerned may have free Recourfe, from Ten o'Clock in the Morning, until Four o'Clock in the Afternoon.

10. To attend the Register at his Office in the Hospital every Wednesday and Saturday Morning, and as often as may be found proper to receive such Summons or other Directions as may be found necessary.

11. To attend the Governors (or in cafe of his neceffary Abfence, fome proper Perfon for him) at every Meeting of General-Affembly or Court of Affiftants, with (at leaft) two of his Bailiffs.

12. To keep a Book ruled in proper Columns, which shall contain a quarterly Account of the Carriage-Rents, corresponding with the Rent-Roll kept by the Treasurer, and as he receives faid Rents, to post the fame in his faid Book.

13. To account with the Treasurer for all Fines which belong, or shall be given to the Charity, with with whatever Cofts may be ordered to be levied therewith, within fourteen Days from the Time of their being imposed, provided he shall have received sufficient Warrants for the due collecting of the same; and in case any Carriage Owner shall refuse to pay any Fine so imposed on him, he shall, at the end of thirty-one Days, to be computed from the Day of imposing thereof, notify the same to the Register, who shall advertise the Licence for said Carriage to be vacated.

14. To give his Receipt to the Treasurer, in the Prefence of the Register, for the quarterly Books of printed Acquittances delivered to him; fuch Receipt to express that he had on that Day received fo many Books, each Book containing fo many Receipts for collecting the Quarter's Taxes due upon Carriages, on fuch Day, amounting in the Whole to the Sum of f, ----- which Receipt the Register shall compare with the printed Acquittances delivered to the Collector, to fee that the Number of Acquittances agree with the Number expressed in the Receipts, and correspond with the Number of each Denomination of Carriages, returned by the Register in his Charge to the Treasurer; and that faid Treasurer has given to faid Collector a fufficient Number of Receipts for collecting the faid Quarter's Taxes, and no more; to which Receipt the Register shall fign his Name as a Witnefs.

15. To give printed Acquittances for all Money he shall collect, each Acquittance and its Duplicate to to have the fame Number, express the Denomination of the Carriage, the Sum, the Quarter's Rent received, when it became due, and also the Name and Surname of the Owner of the Carriage; and not to cut out any Acquittance out of due Course, on pain of Dismission and Forfeiture of his Office.

16. To attend the Treasurer every Wednesday Morning, at his Office in the Hofpital, at or before the Hour of Ten, and pay in all Money he shall have collected in the Week ending the Saturday preceding, first stating an Account of the Week's Collection, in a Book, to be kept by the Treasurer for that Purpofe, which weekly Account the Collector is to fign, the Treasurer dating and figning the Duplicate of the last Receipt taken off in each Book, out of which Receipts have been cut in the preceding Week, as an Acknowledgment of his having fettled with the Collector, for the Sum collected by him in faid Week; and three Days before the close of each accounting Quarter, to deliver to the Treasurer all the Receipt-Books he shall then have in his Custody, in order that he may flate the Quarter's Accounts, and fhew what Sum has been received in faid Quarter.

17. To provide a Book in which he fhall enter all Complaints or Informations, lodged in his Office, or offered to him, (which Book fhall have a Column fpecifying the Fine imposed on hearing faid Complaint, and another Column fhewing, when, and to whom, the Penalty has been paid ;) to bring faid Book to the Register at his Office on every every Monday Morning before Ten o'Clock, that he may iffue Summonfes immediately; and if faid Collector fhall neglect to enter any Complaint or Information, which fhall be regularly offered to him, or to ferve any Summonfes, delivered to him by or from the Register, that (upon Proof of fuch Neglect being made before the Court of Affiftants, by Oath of one or more credible Witneffes) he do forfeit to the Ufe of the Complainant, or Informant, fuch Sum, (not exceeding the Penalty, which might by the Laws of the Corporation be inflicted for the Offence, for which fuch Complaint was offered) as faid Court fhall think proper.

18. To lay faid Book before the Court of Affiftants, on every Court Day, under the Penalty of Five Shillings for each Neglect, faid Fine to be applied to the Ufe of the Charity.

19. To be diligent in examining whether all Carriages, Sedans, Carts and Cars, which are or Ihall be licenfed, are marked according to the Act of Parliament and By-Laws of this Corporation; and where fuch Carriages, Sedans, Carts or Cars, are in Poffeffion of other Perfons, than those to whom the Licence was originally granted, to give Information to the Court of Afliftants, under the Penalty of Five Shillings to the Use of the Charity for each Neglect, if any of them have not been properly transferred.

20. To pay immediately to each Complainant, who shall give to the Charity his or her Share of any any Fine imposed, the Cost fuch Complainant shall have been at in fummoning; and to every other Complainant his or her Share of every Fine imposed, together with the Cost of fummoning, in fourteen Days after the Imposition thereof, provided he shall have received proper Warrants from the Register, and if he shall refuse to pay such Share and Cofts, that then the Court of Affiftants, upon Complaint of fuch Neglect, shall order the Treasurer to pay to such Complainant, the faid Share and Cofts, together with the Fine, (not exceeding fuch Share, nor lefs than one Half of it) as faid Court shall think proper, (unless the Collector shall make it appear to the Satisfaction of the Court, that it was not in his Power, thro' Infolvency of the Defendant, or for fome other Reafon, to raife the Penalty within the ufual Time) which Share, Cofts and Fine, the Treasurer is to charge the faid Collector with, in his Account with him.

21. To call on every Defendant for the Fine imposed on him, within three Days from the Adjudication, and if the fame shall not be paid in faid Time, to give immediate Notice thereof to the Register, who is required to prepare Warrants for levying the same, to be signed by the Court of Assistants on the next Court Day, so as to enable the Collector to levy it by the next succeeding Court Day, and if the Collector shall fail to give the Register such Notice, that he forfeit Five Shillings for the Use of the Charity.

ORDERED, that the foregoing Refolutions, be ftanding By-Laws for the Government of this Hospital, any Rule, Order, or Resolution, heretofore entered into by the Governors of this Corporation, to the contrary notwithstanding.
