From its first Institution on the 3d of November 1740, to the first of January 1777, for the Relief of all Sick and Diseased Persons; and in particular Manusacturers, Seamen in Merchants Service, and their Wives and Children.

Supported by CHARITABLE and VOLUNTARY Contributions.

HIS CHARITY was for some Years carried on in Prefcot-fireet, Goodman's-fields, in several Houses hired upon Lease for that Purpose; till (by the Decay of the Buildings, notwithstanding large Sums of Money had been expended to keep them in Repair, and the Smallness of the Rooms (fit only for private Families) the Governors were determined to open a Subscription which might

enable them to purchase a Piece of Ground, and to build an House more proper to enlarge and perpetuate their benevolent Designs; and

which has been fince happily effected.

The present Hospital in pursuance of this Scheme is a new Building, Situation. erected by the voluntary Contributions of several Governors given for that Purpose only, in an airy Situation near the Mount in Mile-end Road, properly surnished and sitted up with about 215 Beds for the Reception of Patients.

The Society for carrying on this laudable and most useful Undertak-General ing, is by his Majesty's Charter, bearing Date the 3d of November, 1758, Frame, and further confirmed, and declared to be a Body corporate, by the Name of Regulation of The Governors of the London Hospital, and to consist of such Noblemen this Society. and Gentlemen as are therein enumerated, and of those who were reputed Governors for Life at that Time; together with such others who, by giving a Benefaction of thirty Guineas or more at one Time, become Governors for Life; and of those who by subscribing sive Guineas or more a Year, are Governors during such Subscription. Out of these are annually to be elected a President, two or more Vice-Presidents, and a Treasurer.

A General Court of Governors is appointed by the faid Charter to General be held on the first Wednesdays in the Months of March, June, September Court, and December, to direct the Application of the common Seal, which they are thereby empowered to use, to elect Officers, appoint Committees, and

receive

receive the Reports of former ones, to inspect Accounts, make such By-Laws and Rules as shall be judged necessary for the good Government of this Charity, and to transact such other Business as shall be laid before them.

Among the By-Laws which the Governors in a General Court have conformable to their Charter agreed upon, the following ones are to be

The Anniversary Feast of this Charity is to be held between the first of February and the last Day of April, when a printed Account of the General State of the Hospital, the Number of Patients received and difcharged, and an Abstract of the Accounts for the Year past, is laid be-

fore them.

Taufe Commillee.

A House Committee of thirteen Governors is appointed at every General Quarterly Court, who at their first Meeting elect a Chairman to preside for the Quarter; who meet at the Hospital, on Tuesdays weekly, at Eleven in the Forenoon, to Receive and Dismiss Patients, to Order and Inspect the Provisions and Furniture sent in, and such Necessaries that may be wanting, and to Examine and Regulate the Conduct of the Servants and Patients; and other Matters which come before them, according to the Constitution of this Charity. All Governors that please to attend, have a Vote at this Committee, and their Attendance will be efteemed a Favour.

Committee of decounts.

A Committee of Accounts, confishing of twelve Governors, is appointed at the General Quarterly Court in June, for one Year, who meet at the Hospital once a Quarter, to Examine, and Audit Tradesmens Bills, which are paid by the Treasurer within a Fortnight after .- The Accounts

are open at all Times for the Inspection of the Governors.

Physical Committee.

A Physical Committee, consisting of all such Governors who practise Phytic, Surgery, or Pharmacy, or are conversant in the Knowledge of Drugs or Medicines (excepting fuch as shall be directly or indirectly concerned in serving the Hospital with such Necessaries) are summoned to meet every first Tuesday in the Month, and have Power to order and inspect the necessary Drugs and Medicines, and report their Proceedings to the General Quarterly Court by their Chairman.

Two Governors, or more, are appointed Visitors by the House Committee, for one Fortnight, to attend twice a Week, or oftner, if they think proper, to inspect into the Management and Conduct of the House,

during the Interval of the Meetings of the House-Committee.

Chaplain.

Vifitors.

A Clergyman of the Church of England preaches every Sunday, and reads Prayers Morning and Afternoon; administers the Sacrament regularly every Month; reads Prayers every Day in the Week; and is ready to vifit, pray by, and administer the Sacrament at all Times when

required, to the Patients in the Wards.

Three Phylicians attend alternately; Two of the Surgeons daily, from Physicians, and Eleven c'Clock till One, without Fee or Reward, and give their Advice Surgions. and Affistance to all such Objects as come within those Hours, whether Recommended or Accidental. The Surgeons in waiting have an Apprentice, or Pupil, constantly in the House to receive, and, if necessary,-

to call the Surgeon to fuch Accidents as shall be brought in at any Hour of the Day or Night.

An Apothecary (with an Affistant) constantly resides at the Hospital, Apothecary, who Compounds and Dispenses all Medicines used there, and solely at-

tends the Business thereof.

A Steward, (for whose Fidelity proper Security is given) has the Charge Steward. of the House and Furniture, keeps an Account of every Thing brought to or expended in the House, and subjects the same to the Examination of the Visitors, and House-Committee, and has the Inspection likewise of the Conduct of all the Men-Servants—Two Matrons have the Direction Matrons. of the Nurses and other Women-Servants, and see the Diet and Medicines administred according to Order.—Under them, are Nurses, and Watchers Nurses, and in Proportion to the Number of Patients, who are guided by written Watchers. Orders to prevent any Misconduct. Proper Diet for the Patients has been settled by the Physicians and Surgeons engaged in this Charity, and is fixed up in the Wards for the Satisfaction of the Patients and their Friends.

No Officers or Servants are permitted upon Pain of Expulsion to take of any Tradesmen, Patients, or other Persons, any Fee, Reward or Gratuity of any kind, directly or indirectly, for any Service done, or to be

done, on Account of this Hospital.

Every Governor is intitled to fend one In-Patient at a Time, and Out-Governors. Patients without Limitation. Subscribers of smaller Sums may likewise fend what Number of Out-Patients they please. All Subscriptions are during Pleasure, and any small Sums from well-disposed Persons will be thankfully received; but in order to carry on this Undertaking, all Persons are desired to pay their Subscription at the Time of Subscribing.

The Poor Objects, recommended as In-Patients, are received without Proper Ob-Expence, and are supplied with Advice, Medicine, Diet, Washing, jetts. Lodging, and every comfortable Assistance during their Cure; nor is any Security required against suture Contingencies, they being, in case of Death, buried at the Expence of the Charity, if not removed by their Friends. All Out-Patients have Advice and Medicines administred from Eleven till one.

All Accidents, whether recommended or not, are re-Accidents ceived at any Hour of the Day or Night.

This is the Plan of our Proceedings, and tho' this Work has subsisted but Thirty-six Years, yet such has been the extraordinary Encouragement given to it, that since the 3d of November 1740, upwards of 264,833 distressed Objects have been Relieved at the London Hospital; and from labouring under the Oppression of some of the most malignant Diseases, and unhappy Accidents, have been reinstated in their Honest and Industrious Capacities of Working, and, so far as our Observation reaches, their Morals much amended, whereby the Public again enjoy the Benefit of their Labour, and they, and their poor Families, are preserved from periodic and their Labour, and they, and their poor Families, are preserved from periodic and their poor Families are preserved from periodic and their poor families and their poor families are preserved from periodic and their poor families are preserve

Hospitals.

The Subscribers are desired to take Notice, that if any Patients do not conform to the Rules of the House, or are guilty of any Misbehaviour, they will be discharged, and never more relieved by this Charity: And not to send any Patient unable to walk, till they are first assured of Room in the House; And when they recommend an In-Patient whose Settlement is in the Country, it is further requested, that they will satisfy the House Committee, concerning the Removal of such Patient, when cured or judged incurable.

"No Persons of known Ability to pay for their Cure, are allowed to partake of this Charity; nor any with infectious Distempers, or deemed incurable by the Physicians and Surgeons, or any in Consumptive or Asthmatic

Condition, are admitted into the House, being more capable of Relief as

" Out-Patients."

The Patients, being admitted without any Expence, are required to be constant in their Attendance on the Physicians, or Surgeons, at the Hospital, before Eleven o'Clock; and, at Nine o'Clock, to return Thanks at the Chapel, and at the Weekly Committee next after their Cure; and those only who attend their Cure, and return Thanks, will receive a Certificate thereof, which will entitle them to future Relief.


