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Lowndes, evidently following the contents leaf in Vol. 3, gives as item 5 of No. XII. "Conclusion. The Ancient History of Ireland Vindicated, &c., by Col. Charles Vallancey, page 553," but the running headline reads "Conclusions—Miscellaneous."

The "Reliquiæ" should contain an Elegy by Abraham Cowley but is missing from this copy; the Life of Wotton is from the pen of Isaac Walton who apparently had a chief hand in preparing the whole work for the press.
