John Darrell began to figure as an exorcist in 1586, when he pretended to cast out an evil spirit from Catherine Wright, of Ridgway Lane, Derbyshire.

In November, 1597, he was invited to Nottingham to dispossess William Somers, an apprentice, and shortly after his arrival was appointed preacher of St. Mary's in that town, and his fame drew crowded congregations to listen to his tales of devils and possession. He was prohibited from preaching in 1598. Subsequently was brought before Bancroft, bishop of London, and S. Harsnett, his Chaplain, when Somers, Catherine Wright, and Mary Cooper confessed that they had been instructed in their simulations by Darrell. Having been brought before the commissioners and examined at Lambeth on 26th May, 1599, was pronounced an imposter, and along with George More, one of his confederates, degraded from the Ministry and committed to the Gatehouse.
