Maps to the "Theatrum Orbis Terrarum" occupy double-leaf folios 1 to 100 ; "Parargon" with separate title, 2 single leaf folios, 101-102, maps on double leaf folios 103-114 ; "Nomenclator Ptolemaicus," with separate title and pagination (86 pages).

The extra maps, "Hispaniæ" and "Antiquæ Urbis Romæ," are inserted between folios 19/20 and 112/13 respectively.

This atlas includes the following maps : the World, America, South America, Cuba & West Indies, and Peru & Florida.

The map of China is dated 1584, and the text on the back of it contains two Chinese words in the Chinese character ; so that this atlas is really the first European book in which Chinese characters appeared.

The Description of America occupies 18 pages of the second volume.

Printed title dust-soiled and a few trivial repairs to tears, but a very good copy, guarded throughout to protect the folds.

The "Prospect of the most Famous Parts of the World" has a separate title and pagination. This part contains the map of the World, map of the American Continent, and the eight others of American interest (mentioned on the title-page) ; 12 maps of Europe, 8 of Asia, and one of Africa.

Brunet says that the first two decades were in three volumes, 1659, or 1660-71, but this is an error. The third volume, published in 1671, contained the third decade, completing all that was translated in this edition.

According to this work, Roberts, after having been engaged for several years in the Guinea trade as captain of a ship, engaged himself in 1721 as chief mate for a voyage to Virginia, touching at Madeira, the Canaries, and Barbadoes.

At Barbadoes, however, as a result of a difference of opinion with his Captain he fitted out a small sloop, in which he undertook a voyage to Guinea; but being captured by pirates, who cleared the sloop out and detained his men, he was sent adrift, without sails, without provisions, and with no shipmates but a boy and a child.

After being shipwrecked on the unfrequented island of St. John, one of the Cape Verde Islands, where he remained for two years, he returned to England in June, 1725.
